



Leaders seek to calm fearsw

CASTRIES, St. Lucia (AP) — Caribbean leaders opened the annual summit of the Caricom trade bloc Wednesday by seeking to lessen concerns that the 15-member regional group is disintegrating.

The health of Caricom, along with freedom of movement within the Caribbean and climate change, were topics that featured prominently in opening speeches even though the region's external relations, especially with Europe, were being touted as the summit's main discussion point.

Jamaican Prime Minister Portia

Simpson-Miller poured cold water on recent suggestions that her island might leave Caricom following allegations of unfair trading practices by Trinidad and Tobago.

If Caricom was not around, "it would have to be invented," she said, drawing applause. "Jamaica will continue to publicly reiterate the importance of the regional integration movement to the attainment of our national development goals and for the advancement of our region."

She also urged Caricom to consider

U.S. may patrol Trinidad border near Venezuela

Signaling that it might well be losing the battle against transnational and violent crime, the People's Partnership administration in Trinidad has formally asked the U.S. to seriously consider patrolling its borders to help stem a perennial trade mostly in drugs and guns that authorities blame for an average of nearly 400 murders a year.

Under pressure to bring down crime following his recent transfer from the Ministry of Works to the Ministry of National Security Minister Jack Warner said the island has to be prepared to acknowledge that its borders are poorly protected and even though he did not pinpoint any specific one, critics say attention will most likely be focused on the seven-mile stretch of water in the Gulf of Paria between Trinidad and Venezuela on the South American mainland.

Warner recently replaced retired army chief Brig. Gen. John Sandy at the Ministry of National Security following Sandy's less than stel-

lar two-year stint at the ministry and he remains under pressure to deliver and to maintain his reputation as a go getter and trouble shooter as murders and gangland violence continue virtually unabated. That ministry is known to fail ministers with the best of intentions. Warner says he has no choice but to succeed.

One of the first things he has done since being appointed in the past two weeks is to approach American Ambassador Beatrice Wilkinson-Welters, detailing a proposal to have American war boats help the local coastguard patrol waters off the 1,200 square mile island. Trinidad is the last and the most southerly of the Caribbean island chain.

"Our borders are porous and all the drugs and arms come through our borders and we need help. If we cannot help ourselves and the Americans could help us, I have no problem with that. I asked them specifically if a request is made of them for the Americans to assist us in patrolling our borders where the drugs and the guns come in and they were quite happy to do so," he told reporters after the weekly post cabinet briefing.

Since the mid 90s, Trinidad has signed on to one of the most comprehensive mutual assistance treaties with the U.S. among the 15 nations of the Caribbean trade bloc, dating back to the administration of Basdeo Panday and then Secretary of State Warren Christopher.

'Massive' turnout at G'da rally



Panday's integrity upheld

Eleven years after former Trinidad and Tobago Prime Minister Basdeo Panday was charged with three counts of failing to declare a London bank account, he was freed of them recently.

Magistrate Marcia Murray presiding in the Port of Spain Magistrate Court discharged Panday saying "the court is compelled to stop these proceedings to protect the integrity of the criminal justice system."

She ruled that the Integrity Commission had erred by not giving Panday a chance to be heard before a tribunal.

That meant he was deprived of due process of law, the magistrate said.

"The misconduct of the Integrity Commission was so serious that it would undermine public confidence in the criminal justice system and bring it into disrepute," she said.

Panday was before Murray for retrial for allegedly failing to declare a London bank account, contrary to the Integrity in Public Life.

He was accused of failing to disclose the account at National Westminister Bank Plc, Wimbledon, London, to the Integrity Commission for the years, 1997, 1998 and 1999.

In March 2006, Panday was found guilty and sentenced by Chief Magistrate Sherman McNicolls and jailed for two years.

The former prime minister appealed that decision and conviction, which was quashed and a retrial ordered by the British Privy Council.

Panday's attorney David Aronberg QC said the background of the whole prosecution was mischief-making in the run-up to the 2001 general election.

He had argued that Panday was not the beneficiary of the account but instead his wife Oma was.

USDEA Honduran confrontation

TEGUCIGALPA, Honduras (AP) -Honduras' top human rights official said Monday he worries that the second fatal shooting by U.S. agents in Honduras is part of a widening confrontation between drug traffickers and U.S.-backed police and troops.

The Honduran government defended its work with the U.S., saying that the Americans have helped to dramatically increase drug seizures in the country.

Human rights ombudsman Ramon Custodio said Monday that "sooner or later air and sea operations won't be enough and we'll see military and police operations on land."

AU.S. Drug Enforcement Administration spokeswoman said Sunday that the pilot of a suspected drug flight was shot dead by two DEA agents this month after he refused to surrender and made a threatening gesture.

At the time, Honduran police said the twin-engine plane arriving from Colombia with a load of cocaine crashed on July 3 while being chased by government aircraft. Honduran officials said that one pilot died and a second was badly injured, but didn't say how the death occurred.

On Sunday DEA spokeswoman Dawn Dearden said that police arriving at the crash scene in eastern Honduras found the plane's two pilots and arrested the injured one. She said the second pilot was shot by the DEA agents after he ignored orders to surrender and made a threatening gesture.

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico (AP) - A snake that scientists had declared extinct long ago has been found living in a nature reserve on a tiny isle just off the east Caribbean island of St. Lucia, conservationists said Tuesday.

At least 11 St. Lucia Racer snakes were spotted and tagged by a group of international scientists hunting for the snake in the Maria Islands reserve, which is part of St. Lucia and located about one kilometer (0.6 miles) south of the main island, according to the British-based Durrell Wildlife Conservation Trust.

Overall, scientists estimate that 18 snakes live on the reserve, said Matthew Morton, Durrell's Eastern Caribbean program manager.

"In one sense it is a very worrying situation, with such a small population restricted to a single, tiny site," he said. "But in another sense, it's an opportunity ... It means that we still have a chance to save this species."

The non-venomous brown snake was declared extinct in 1936, but somebody later spotted one on the rocky reserve in 1973 and rare sightings have since been reported. Late last year, Durrell, with help from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and other groups, launched a search for the snake on the larger of the two Maria Islands.

A team of six scientists and several volunteers spent five months scouring the rocky outcrop where they found some snakes slithering around during the day. looking for lizards and frogs to eat. Once they captured the snakes, they implanted microchips that will transmit data for at least 10 years, including information about their lifespan and other unknown details. Morton said.

Scientists also collected DNA samples. but the results on whether the snakes are genetically diverse won't be known for several months. Diversity is important because it would allow for a more successful breeding program, scientists say.

There's currently a lot of in-breeding on the 12-hectare (30-acre) islet where the snakes live, but scientists did not spot many deformities, which is encouraging, Morton said.

Brian Crother, a U.S.-based expert on Caribbean snakes who was not involved in the project, said he was excited about the finding.

"It provides us with another opportunity to preserve a piece of biodiversity that we thought we had lost forever," he said.

As a result of the scientists' findings, Durrell called the St. Lucia racer the world's rarest snake, but Crother and other scientists disputed the claim.

"I think saying 'rarest' is a good way to bring attention to a desperate situation, but whether it really is the rarest, I don't think you can say for sure," said Crother, interim biology department director at Southeastern Louisiana University.

Dominica

Prime Minister Roosevelt Skerrit has defended the decision by his administration to invest US\$2.96 million in the cash-strapped regional airline, LIAT.

Skerrit said the airline has been working with the government to facilitate air travel into the island and that the decision to become a shareholder in the Antigua-based airline

would further improve airlift.

He said LIAT had already introduced two flights to accommodate night landings in Dominica allowing Dominicans to take advantage of late connections from North America, Europe, Barbados and Antigua and Barbuda.

Hotelier and leader of the opposition Dominica Freedom Party (DFP), Judith Pestina, said while she supports the government's investment in the airline, which is owned by the governments of Antigua and Barbuda, St. Vincent and the Grenadines and Barbados, there was need for transparency.

She said the government must inform us of the specific benefits in investing eight million dollars in LIAT.

Guyana

The Guyana government has signed an agreement with a subsidiary of the United States-based Anadarko Petroleum Corporation (Anadarko) to undertaken exploration in waters of the country's exclusive economic zone (ECZ).

The agreement was signed with Anadarko Guyana Company and according to the Government Information News Agency (GINA) the company had been involved in discussions with the administration since 2011.

Anadarko is among the world's largest independent oil and natural gas exploration and production companies with approximately 2.54 billion barrels of oil equivalent in proved reserves at yearend 2011.

GINA said the signing of the agreement comes as the government has awarded a license to NABI Oil and Gas Inc to undertake drilling on the coast of Guyana.

The government is

also collaborating with a number of internal partners, including the US, Canada and Trinidad and Tobago, to enhance its capabilities in the development of the oil and gas sectors.

Jamaica

Minister of Foreign Affairs and Foreign Trade Senator AJ Nicholson has questioned the Opposition's proposal for a referendum to let the people decide whether the Caribbean Court of Justice (CCJ) should become Jamaica's final appellate court.

"Why would the Opposition legislators not be willing to perform their duty, instead of wishing to leave the performance of that duty to the citizens who put them in the Parliament to carry out their obligations," Senator Nicholson asked.

He stated that, for almost 80 years, none of the 39 former colonies of Britain had a referendum to move away from the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council and to have their own final Court of Appeal.

A referendum, he said was, in essence, a general election "with a political campaign being the axis in which it spins."

He noted that neither in the constitutional arrangements nor the judgment of the Judicial Committee (of the Privy Council) was there any requirement other than that of a twothirds majority vote to be obtained in each House of Parliament for Jamaica to subscribe to the Appellate Jurisdiction of the CCJ.

Nevis

Nevis Premier Joseph Parry says his country is seeking a closer working relationship with the French Overseas Department of Guadeloupe in areas such as education, agriculture, geothermal exploration and culture. Parry said he held "fruitful" discussions with Parisbased French diplomat Fred Constant, who is charge of Regional Co-operation for the Caribbean and the Guianas.

While in France, Parry met with the Ministry of Overseas and Regional Development and discussed with the ambassador the possibility of a memorandum of understanding for cooperation in several areas.

He said the discussions involved the possible exchange of students and teachers between the two islands, adding it was important that local students learned French and for teachers to be able to teach the language.

Parry said while his administration is not seeking scholarships from the French universities, it would appreciate any opening that would benefit local students.

Backyard gardening could save you money

As a boy, Hilson Baptiste remembers going to his neighbor's home and giving them a large slice of pumpkin grown in his family's backyard garden. In return, he would be given two fish for his family.

But Baptiste, who is currently Antigua's minister of agriculture, regrets that in his country, those days are over. He is now part of an initiative to prevent the island from spending millions of dollars on importing food that could easily be grown, in some cases, in the backyards of many homes.

In 2010, the twin-island nation imported approximately 16 million pounds of vegetables, according to figures from the Antigua and Barbuda government. Baptiste said serious measures must be taken to drastically reduce that figure.

"I want to see that happen. You would not have to buy anything from the supermarket; you can grow your own and share with your neighbors," he said. He related his boyhood story of exchanging pumpkin for fish, noting, "We build better communities when we do this."

Even the island's ceremonial head of state, Dame Louise Lake-Tack, is supporting the initiative. The representative of Queen Elizabeth in Antigua and Barbuda, she has no problem getting her hands dirty as she seeks to boost food production in the country.

To ensure that the 80,000 inhabitants of this small two-island state understand the need to drastically reduce the millions of dollars spent on importing food, Lake-Tack assisted the government by distributing seedlings to homeowners, a move authorities hope will address the issue of food security here.

Known as the National Backyard Gardening Program, the ministry of agriculture-led initiative is aiming at getting the population to produce four million pounds of food annually in their own backyards.

"We encourage people to grow all types of vegetables and even fruits," Owolabi Elabanjo, an agriculture extension officer, told IPS.

"We've seen a rise in (the) production of tomato, sweet pepper, okra, lettuce and seasoning like rosemary and thyme. We are also now introducing vegetables that (are not) common in many homes."


Family farming

The program initially began with the help of the Rome-based Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) in 2008 and now, approximately 2,500 families are registered.

FAO's sub-regional coordinator for the Caribbean, Florita Kentish, said the FAO is a firm believer in activities to alleviate the effects of rising food prices and global economic hardship, and to ensure that even the most vulnerable have good nutrition.

"Home gardening has a long established tradition of offering great potential to improve household food security and alleviate micronutrient deficiencies in many ways," Kentish said. The FAO and the **Continued on Page 12**

Education is key to restoring middle class prosperity

Last year, I called a meeting of the Howard University Board of Trustees to discuss a serious problem. More than 80 seniors at Howard had indicated they were going to have to drop out of school and would not be able to earn their degrees. The reasons were all economic. Some were overburdened by student loan debt. Others were told by their families that they could no longer afford to

help them pay for college. And, yet others felt the need to find a job so they could help their families who were struggling to make ends meet because of the recession.

The problem we faced at Howard is a microcosm of what is happening today as Congress debates whether or not to extend the 3.4 percent interest rate of federal student loans, or to let it double to 6.8 percent on July 1. This decision affects approximately 7.4 million students who are estimated to take out these loans in the upcoming year.

At AARP, we see the student loan debt problem through a different lens, but it stems from the same circumstances. More and more older adults are still saddled with the burden of paying off student loans, either their own or those of their children, and in some cases, their grandchildren. According to a report from the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, Americans 60 and older still owe roughly \$36 billion in student loans, and more than 10 percent of those are delinquent. And, increasingly, older adults are postponing retirement in order to pay off student loan debt accumulated by their children or grandchildren.

The reason we were so concerned at Howard and at AARP-and why all Americans should be concerned today-is because higher education is not only the gateway to the American Dream, it is the key to restoring prosperity to the middle class. The facts are clear. The median weekly income for high school graduates last year was \$638 compared with \$1,053 for college graduates. Furthermore, the unemployment rate for workers with just a high school diploma is 9.2 percent, more than double the rate for those with college degrees.

Being able to attain an affordable education also concerns us at AARP because we know that being able to live the life you want at 50, or 60 or 80 depends largely on whether or not you get a good start in life and have access to an affordable, quality education. That's why we have joined forces to create AARP Experience Corps, a program that recruits older volunteers to

volunteer in schools to make sure that students are reading at grade level by third grade. If they're not, their chances for success in life diminish greatly.

We also see more and more people who reach a point where they want to do something different in their lives or they are forced to go into a different field because they can't find a job. So, they go back to school, maybe to become a teacher, or to get

a master's degree, or to pursue a field of study that has always interested them. Often, they rely on student loans to help finance their life reinvention dreams.

I get angry when I hear people question whether a college degree is really worth the investment. Of course it is. It's true, many people with college degrees have lost their jobs and are deep in debt. But this is an even more harsh reality for those without college degrees. They struggle even more.

I also understand that when people question the value of a college education, what they are really concerned about is the cost. They compare the cost of a college education with the current economy and question whether they can ever earn enough to justify the investment. But this speaks more to the downturn in the economy and the erosion of the middle class than it does to the value of a college education. The reality is that more and more of the jobs in the future will require a college degree at a minimum.

The undeniable truth is that over the past generation, more and more of the middle class have fallen off the cliff into poverty-pulled down by a lack of job opportunities, rising health care costs, inadequate savings, declining home values, a lack of consumer protections and stagnant wages that have not kept pace with the costs of meeting basic human needs. Working adults now comprise a record share of the poor in this countrynearly 57 percent according to the most recent census data.

Moreover, a majority of middle-class Americans today believe that the next generation of adults will be worse off than their parents. If that happens, it will be the first time in our history. We cannot allow that to happen. And the first step in preventing it is to ensure access to affordable, quality higher education.

As we engage in this debate over student loan interest rates, we must remember that it was the GI Bill, passed following World War II, that opened the door Continued on Page 12

A slew of unanswered Romney questions

The conventional wisdom at this point about November's vote seems to be that while at congressional level, Republican money could prove difficult for Democrats to navigate, in the presidential run the Obama camp should be well enough equipped to do the effective counter-punching necessary to prevail. Even had the respective resources in the Obama-Romney battle not been as they stand, it would be interesting to see whether the baggage Mitt Romney brings to this race could have withstood voters' scrutiny by the time we got to casting ballots.

One would think that given the exhausting primary/ debate calendar Romney endured in securing the nomination, all that reasonably should have been laid bare about him character-wise, record-wise, etc would by now be part of the campaign narrative. It probably has to do with the "presumptive nominee" handle of which he was the early beneficiary or to which he helped himself, but Romney today has the nomination sewed up, still with a whole lot about him glaringly to be assailed. Chances are the tactic of stonewalling or employing fancy footwork to which he resorted during the primary process won't cut it in the real faceoff.

Once he vanquished his GOP competition, Romney was being touted as a conservative favorite. This, of course, wasn't how the dueling went down during that protracted series of primary contests that Republican chieftains aren't likely to reprise. Romney, back then, tried every which way to demonstrate how "severely conservative" he was, trying too hard in a truly shameless parody. One of his bigger challenges, in attempting to do this bit of awkward straddling, was distancing himself from the healthcare overhaul he had advocated and introduced in Massachusetts as governor. All things being equal, it would be highly improbable for Romney to survive an entire general election campaign



without being dragged on the carpet big time over his vehement condemnation of the Obama Affordable Healthcare legislation in light of a Massachusetts plan which shares such features with the federal law as the individual mandate and the setting up of exchanges offering affordable health insurance.

Romney's gutless attempts to disavow what he piloted in Massachusetts, all in the interest of pandering to the GOP's controlling conservative base, is as indicting a Romney character flaw as it gets. Some surveys in Massachusetts last year showed support among residents for the state's healthcare law to be in the range of a two-thirds plurality. Those numbers apparently don't mean squat to Romney who, if he had his druthers, would forgo any credit coming to him for the Massachusetts initiative in favor of the big score of rightwing backing for a presidential run. It speaks volumes about candidate Romney.

Those integrity questions were all over columnist Paul Krugman's piece in the New York Times a few days ago when he took aim on Romney's failure so far to tell it straight about his finances. Krugman compared this dodging tactic with the exemplary forthrightness of Romney's father, George, the onetime president of American Motors and Michigan governor who, when he made a bid for the Republican nomination in 1968, Krugman noted, released 12 years of income tax returns. By contrast today's Romney, after repeated demands during the primary campaign, reluctantly released one year's return and estimated earnings and taxes for a second year. Meanwhile, speculation is rife about funds Romney reportedly has parked away in Swiss accounts and in investments in the Cayman Islands and elsewhere. You would think Romney knows that any obstinate "none of your business" posture about all of this would play large in sealing his doom. Said Krugman: "This refusal to come clean suggests that he and his advisers believe that voters would be less likely to support him if they knew the truth about his investments."

There's been some scuttlebutt about heavy hitters on the right being displeased with the Romney team and clamoring for personnel changes to be made. If true, one shouldn't be surprised if, given the usual Republican bluster, the discontent centered on things like a pattern of messaging that didn't go enough for the jugular and blithely ignored Romney's obligation to bare all about those finances of his. There is, too, the element of an unlimited cash flow which is understandably fueling an air of invincibility permeating the GOP ranks.

Romney has said he plans to keep the focus on the state of the economy, seeing this as his ticket to the White House. An economy far from fully recovered from the devastation the president inherited is hardly the ideal environment for any incumbent's return to office. Added to which, even guick-fix measures such as Obama has been advancing are guaranteed dead on arrival in a Republican controlled House notwithstanding, seen through non-partisan eyes, they legitimately have merit. The obsession on the other side with bringing a halt to what's seen as the freak accident of history that produced a President Obama four years ago is that strong. Somehow, though, Romney as axis point for this deviltry could wind up compromising the grand design. Romney, it turns out, is not only every bit the make-believe, conveniently repackaged "conservative" primary opponents declared him to be. He is also proving to be, integrity-wise, one flawed entity whose true moorings are really the stuff of illusion.

Home gardening can help achieve such goals by offering direct access to a diversity of foods rich in nutrients. It also helps people save money by spending less on food and earn extra income by selling garden produce, ultimately increasing their purchasing power. During seasonally lean periods, home gardens can serve as an additional source of food.

The initiative is especially important in rural areas where income-earning opportunities are fewer, Kentish said, adding that it is becoming increasingly important for vulnerable households, including those headed by females.

The government is taking steps to better support the initiative, which has been extended to some of the nation's schools, Baptiste said.

Health Preventing slips, trips and falls

As we age, time takes its toll on the bodily systems that keep us balanced, making us more prone to dangerous slips, trips and falls. And while a fall can be a life-changing or even lifethreatening event for an older adult, reducing one's risk is easy.

Do a Home Safety Check At least one-third of all falls involve hazards within the home.

Be sure to remove throw rugs and low furniture, eliminate clutter, and secure carpeting and other tripping hazards like electrical cords. Your home should be properly lit, so that even at night your vision is not impaired. Install grab bars in your bathtub and handrails on your staircases.

Get Regular Exercise

Start a exercise program that includes activities that improve strength, balance, coordination and flexibility.



Walking, water workouts and tai chi will not only contribute to your overall health, they can also reduce your risk of falls.

Consult a health care professional before getting started.

Manage Pain Differently "The same pills meant to make older patients with chronic pain more comfortable may also make them more vulnerable to falls," says ACA President Dr. Keith Overland, who runs a practice in Norwalk, Conn. "Chiropractic services, including spinal adjustments and manipulation, exercise recommendations, rehab and nutritional and lifestyle counseling, are a great non-drug alternative to medications that affect your brain's function and lead to dizziness or lightheadedness."

Taking multiple medications magnifies the risk of injury. Seniors

who are on three or more drugs, or who have muscle weakness, are more likely to fall. Another risk factor is combining prescription drugs with alcohol, over-the-counter allergy or sleeping medications, painkillers, or cough suppressants. Ask your prescribing physician to review your medications and reduce your chances of falling by using the lowest effective dosage. Also, discuss the need for walking aids or supports while taking medications that can affect balance.

Prevent Serious Injury

Osteoporosis makes bones less resistant to stress

and more likely to fracture. Help limit the effects of osteoporosis by eating a diet rich in calcium and Vitamin D. Calcium-rich foods include milk, yogurt, fish, broccoli, collard greens, tofu and almonds. You can get your daily dose of Vitamin D with a little bit of sunlight.

If you do find yourself falling, fall forward on your hands or land on your buttocks -- not on your spine. Also, protect your head from striking furniture or the floor.

Improve Vision

Age-related vision diseases, including cataracts and glaucoma, and can alter your depth perception, visual acuity and susceptibility to glare. Schedule regular check-ups with your ophthalmologist and regularly clean your glasses. Improve your visibility so you can move safely and with ease.

Black clergy work to end AIDS

A new study reveals that for black clergy members, traditional barriers to talking about HIV prevention are giving way to faithfriendly messages about getting tested for HIV and staying on treatment. The study, recently published in the prestigious journal Public Library of Science, shows that black community religious leaders now see battling AIDS as a social justice issue compatible with their religious teachings. The study results come at a time of immense hope for turning the tide against the HIV epidemic. As a result, more and more black clergy are joining the fight to help put an end to AIDS.

"We in public health have done a poor job of engaging African-American community leaders and particularly black clergy members in HIV prevention," says Dr. Amy Nunn, lead author of the study and assistant profes-

sor of medicine at Brown University. "There is a common miss-perception that African American churches are unwilling to address the AIDS epidemic. The paper highlights some of the historical barriers in effectively engaging African American clergy in HIV prevention and provides recommendations from clergy for how to move forward."

The study consisted of interviews and focus groups with 38 African-American pastors and physicians and public health researchers from Philadelphia, a city with an exceptionally high racial disparity of HIV infection. Seven in ten new infections in the city are among black residents.

Until participating in the research, many clergy members were unfamiliar with the severity of the HIV epidemic within their communities. With 32 million lives already lost due to HIV and grim statistics underlying grim health prospects for many in the black community, nearly all of the studies 27 male and 11 female clergy said they could, and would discuss and promote HIV testing and treatment.

This seems fitting considering that according to CDC, African Americans are 14% of the US population but are 44% of new HIV infections. One in four African Americans will contract HIV within their lifetime. A recent study also showed that newinfection rates among black women in some U.S. cities are as high as in parts of sub-Sahara Africa. Infection rates in the U.S. are also alarmingly high among black men who have sex with other men. And with 20% of the more than one million people with HIV/ AIDS in the U.S. not knowing they have it, there is a ticking time-bomb hidden within already deeply impacted communities.

Across the country, black houses of faith are now trying to fight back, both in the pulpit and out in the community.

Harlem's Hue-Man Bookstore To Close

Hue Man Bookstore & Café, a Harlem literary hot-spot will no longer operate from its current location after July 31.

According to its CEO Marva Allen Allen "the confluence of events, changing landscape, the end of our lease and the international expansion of our vision, closing our physical location was the only sensible decision we could make.'

She dispatched the information via email adding that "we find no viable alternative but to go back to the drawing board."

"Closing our beloved bookstore, I assure you was a very hard decision for us."

Not since Tree Of Life Bookstore closed on 125th has there been such displeaseure about the departure of a literary establishment in New York City.

When Hue Man Bookstore opened its doors in Harlem the August of 2002, its neighbors included a Disney Store and numerous corporate retailers.

Many of those stores quickly relocated and were replaced by new operators many times over with banks dominating





the square block located a hop, skip and jump from the Apollo

Theater. Despite setbacks the small, independent store owner remained optimistic "We won't get rich doing this," she said back then, adding that along with her partners, and the eight staff people were spiritually enriched in their quest to build a reputable presence in the Black community.

"If I had a dollar for every person who comes in and thanks me for what we're doing -- I would be rich."

That the 4,000-square-foot space it occupied would invite U.S. presidents, celebrated athletes, movie stars, singers, fashion icons, and scores of African-Americans to its 124th St. location seemed unlikely back then.

And from the store's opening party -- attended by singer Stevie Wonder, actor Wesley Snipes, rapper Jay-Z, and poet Maya Angelou - indications were widely optimistic that this would be no ordinary bookstore.

Former President Bill Clinton said his hand suffered cramping after signing books while promoting his 2004 publication, "Mv Life."

"American Gangster" Frank Lucas returned to Harlem after Denzel Washington portraved him in film to field guestions about his character and flamboyant lifestyle. It was at the bookstore that reporters and critics met him for the first time.

For a time, Allen along with co-founders Clara Villarosa, filmmaker Melvin Van Peebles, Rita Ewing, wife of Knick's player Patrick and Celeste Johnson held firm with their enterprising venture.

But after a decade, a chapter ended and the store is destined for closing later this month.

"Closing the existing format of Hue-Man is forward thinking on our part and as we take pause to re-imagine the future of books and how to ensure that their purpose of entertaining. imparting knowledge and honing creativity is preserved."

"There is no way to re-imagine the bookstore of the future in our current space. To try to do so would be a stop gap and a waste of resources.'

Allen said she wants to "reboot" the brand, and figure out a business model that embraces new technology.

"There are people who are going to want to read books, and there are people who are going to want to read e-books, and as an industry, I mean, it is the onus to try to figure out what is that balance," Allen explained.

Hue-Man plans to offer an online store with discounted publications an incentive to start.

The store has also applied for a grant from Chase Bank that would allow it to reopen its physical location at a later date, if awarded.

She also said rising rent prices factored in the decision to close.

In order to remain she would have had to sign another 10-year lease at the Frederick Douglass Boulevard location.

Although book sales were up 37 percent during the first half of the year she said it was not feasible to re-sign a new lease.

"The gentrification of the neighborhood ... doesn't seem to take consideration of the small businesses in the neighborhood, and/or the people who have been in the neighborhood," she said. Leases in the location she said are "somewhat predatorv.'



In 2004, the turmoil in Haiti disrupted the school calendar and Paul Beaubrun, found himself in the U.S. finishing the school year. He graduated from Prospect Heights High School.

The youngest of four children of Manze and Lola Beaubrun, founding members of the esteemed racine (roots) band Boukman Eksperyans, Paul grew up in the band's sphere. It was "like going to music school," he says, while naming all of the musicians in that circle he was exposed to: Eddy Francois, Bonga, and Zilibo.

Internationally performing and Grammy nominated Boukman Eksperyans was one of the early bands that mixed traditional vodou songs and rhythms with rock music. The band also incorporates folk melodies into their repertoire in addition to original music with very political lyrics. (The band fled the country in the early 90s because of their political stand.) So much of their songs are "classics" for Haitians that when the band is performing the audience sings all the lyrics.

Paul, who is the image of his father – like turning the clock back 30 years - said, "I think I really look like him and we have similar personalities and similarities in how we see life spiritually. My dad is my hero, I really look up to him."

He doesn't leave out his mom. "My mom is everything, she's the backbone and conscience of the family. "

When Columbia Pictures first brought Spider-Man to the big screen in 2002. the Marvel Comics adaptation was such a box-office bonanza that it spawned a couple of equally-phenomenal sequels. Now, just a decade later, the studio has already seen fit to reboot the popular franchise.

Although that might strike some as too soon

to attempt to replicate a winning formula, director Marc Webb (500 Davs of Summer) proves himself to be more than up to that daunting challenge. For "The Amazing Spider-Man" easily eclipses the earlier trilogy via a relatively-sophisticated combination of shadowy cinematography, edgier dialogue, seamless special effects and palpable romantic chemistry.

The film stars Andrew Garfield as unassuming Peter Parker-turnedsuperhero Spider-Man, opposite Emma Stone as his love interest, Gwen Stacy. Marcus Miller's musical 'Renaissance'

A generation is roughly defined as a period of about 30 years. Thirty years ago – in the early '80s - America was rolling with Ronald Reagan at the wheel and his conservative "back to family values" tenets.

While most of the thenyoung flock was looking back. Marcus Miller was looking ahead. By the middle of that decade in 1986, Marcus - the musician, composer and producer - was at the helm of one of the most impactful modern jazz masterpieces

of the era with some futuristic roots music he composed for the legen-July 13-19, dary Miles Davis entitled "Tutu."

Now with "Renaissance" in 2012. Marcus Miller surveys the landscape of not just music but society as a whole. In the same profound way that anointed gospel-soul singer Sam Cooke prophesized 50 years before in 1963, Miller feels that "a



change is gonna come."

And just as with "Tutu," he is ahead of the storm with "Renaissance," for release on Aug. 7, 2012 from Concord Jazz, a division of Concord Music Group.

Fortified by a team of hungry young players that includes trumpeters Sean Jones and Maurice Brown. alto saxophonist Alex Han, drummer Louis Cato, guitarists Adam Agati and Adam Rogers, and keyboardist Kris Bowers along with veteran keys wizards Federico Gonzalez Peña and Bobby Sparks, Miller is creating the soundtrack for this musical, cultural and spiritual revolution.

"I feel like a page is turning," Miller muses. "The last of our heroes are checking out and we are truly entering a new era. Politically, things have polarized and are coming to a head. Musically, we've got all these cool ways to play and share music - MP3 files, internet

radio and satellite radio - but the music is not as revolutionary as the media. It's time for a rebirth."

Renaissance finds Miller offering up an especially emotive 13-song collection that includes eight richly inspired original compositions that swing from a tip of the porkpie to the CTI Records sound of the `70s ("CEE-TEE-EYE") to an introspective and ultimately hope-filled rumination about the island off the coast of Dakar in Africa known as "Gorée (Go-ray)."

"Renaissance" also includes five cover songs that canvas works by soul-jazz culture band WAR, new wave-soul starlet Janelle Monáe, New York jazz dignitary Weldon Irvine, Brazilian musical ambassador Ivan Lins and Christian composer Luther "Mano" Hanes. Though the CD primarily features Miller's smokin' new band, it also features special guest vocalists Dr. John, Rubén Blades and Gretchen Parlato.

"Renaissance is a word that resonates on a lot of different levels for me," Miller explains. "It's about getting back to the essential aspects of art. I'm focusing less on production and more on composition, so this is a very clear album for me. People have often called me a 'Renaissance Man.'Deeper still, "Renaissance" houses some of Marcus' most inspired and emotionally penetrating writing to date - particularly "Gorée (Go-ray)" which was inspired by a visit Marcus and his impressionable young band paid to the African island historically remembered as a warehouse for human cargo before it was shipped from the motherland to places elsewhere for the people to become slaves.

Marcus' current touring band consists of trumpeter Maurice Brown (Tedeschi Trucks Band, Mava Azucena, Aretha Franklin), alto saxophonist Alex Han (Paguito D'Rivera, James Moody, Geri Allen), drummer Louis Cato (Beyoncé, Q-Tip, Sean Jones), guitarist Adam Agati (Lalah Hathaway, El Movimiento and Mary Mary), and 2011 Thelonious Monk International Jazz Piano Competition Award winner keyboardist Kris Bowers (Louis Hayes, Jay-Z & Kanye West, José James).

"I've got these next generation musicians in their `20s with me now that aren't afraid of breaking boundaries," Marcus concludes. "They're absorbing and admiring the whole picture - from Clifford Brown to J.Dilla - honestly feeling both sides which, to my Black Experience, is what it's all about. This young band fears nothing so we are free to go anywhere. I'm finding that to be incredibly inspiring. I am writing music for us that encompasses the full landscape."

The storyline follows two individuals caught between centuries to tell a familiar 21st century story.


Both are young, ambitious, Black and fearful of their bigoted community.



Don't be blind to the problem of sun glare

here are certain driving hazards that people often expect when getting behind the wheel, including slippery roads, an animal darting out, or reduced visibility due to driving rains. But sun glare may not be something drivers expect to contribute to hazardous conditions.

Sun glare can be a nuisance and make for dangerous driving, particularly in the early morning or late afternoon when the sun is low on the horizon. The angle of the rays may render sun visors useless. Accidents due to sun glare do occur and more frequently than drivers may know.

In October 2007, sun glare was responsible for at least two accidents in Colorado. In the first few months of 2010, data compiled by the Abu Dhabi Traffic Department showed the sun's glare was blamed for 22 minor crashes. Sun glare is a problem all around the world.

To prevent sun glare from becoming a hazard when you're driving, consider these safety tips.

•Delay driving times to occur before or after sunrise or sunset.

 $\bullet Use$ polarized sunglasses that can help prevent glare.

•Do not use high-gloss products on the dashboard, which can contribute to extra glare.

 $\ensuremath{\cdot}\xspace {\rm Keep}$ the inside and outside of the windshield clean.

• Make use of sun visors.

•If glare is a problem, leave extra space between your car and others in the event of sudden stopping or other road hazards.

• Drive slowly and be mindful of obstructions.

•Try taking another route that goes in a different direction than the one from which the sun is shining.

•Leave extra time so that you don't feel rushed getting to your destination.

•Eye exams or surgery can make eyes more sensitive to the sunlight. Avoid driving after these appointments.

Things that mar an automotive paint job

ost people purchase a car for its looks and performance. However, unless it is kept in a garage and never driven, it is impossible to keep it in pristine condition. In many cases, damage to the clear coat or enamel paint on the car is something vehicle owners expect.

A car owner who decides he wants the car to remain in the best shape possible will have to take an active role in maintenence and damage prevention. One of the key things to remember is to never allow any substance to remain on the paint for too long; otherwise the risk for damage increases. Also, it may be very difficult to clean if the offender is allowed to sit on the paint. Here are some other factors to consider.

•UV light: Just as UV light can affect skin, hair, and other parts of the body, it also can affect the paint on a car. The rays oxidize the paint and cause a white, powdery film to form on the car. Washing the car frequently enough and applying the best quality wax will help keep UV rays from penetrating through the paint.

•Over sprays: Life does not stop to allow cars to drive through, particularly when it comes to construction zones. It's possible for a car to be doused in paint spray, tar, concrete, and other chemicals that are routinely used in construction. Do not allow these substances to harden on the car. Rinse promptly with automotive soap. Try to avoid construction zones whenever possible.

•Rain: Both acid rain and regular rainwater (and other sources of water) can dissolve paint over time. The U.S. Geological Survey has said that water is a uni-

versal solvent because it can dissolve more substances than any other liquid. Whenever the car becomes wet, it should be dried with a towel or chamois and not allowed to air dry.

•Natural substances: Tree sap, bird droppings, and splattered insects contain compounds that can erode the paint on a car. Avoid parking under large trees where sap and bird droppings may be prevalent. In terms of bug splatter, try to wash it off as soon as possible to alleviate damage.

•Bleach: A bleachand-water solution is often heralded for its ability to clean many things, but it should not be used on a car. Bleach is an oxidizer and it will pit metal and discolor paint. Be careful with pool chemicals too, as chlorinator is usually regular household bleach.

It's impossible to shield the car from everything, but there are precautions that can be taken.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration notes that tire-related crashes are most often caused by underinflated tires. Underinflation isn't always caused by a leak. In fact, gradual loss of pressure is natural, particularly when the seasons change and temperatures dip. An underinflated tire makes handling difficult and can even cause structural damage to a vehicle. Drivers should check their vehicle's tire pressure at least once a month. Those who have long commutes should check their tire pressure more frequently, and it's always a good idea to check tire pressure before and after a long road trip. Recommended tire pressures are listed in the owner's manual.

Look for abnormal wear and tear

Tires will wear down over time. gradually losing tread. However, drivers should inspect tires for excessive wear and tear, which could be indicative of other issues, including underinflation and

alignment problems with steering and suspension. Additional issues to look for include bulges or cracks on the sidewalls or tread and any signs of a punctured tire.

Rotate tires

Most drivers have heard of tire rotation but might not know how often tires should be rotated or even why rotation is necessary. The owner's manual will solve the first problem, identifying how often tires should be rotated (most suggest every 6,000 miles). As for why it's good to rotate tires, doing so helps achieve even tread and extend the life of the tires. Tires are expensive, and rotation can help drivers get more bang for their buck. Drivers of front-wheel drive vehicles will notice their front tires wear down faster than their rear tires. That's because the front tires are doing most of the work, bearing the brunt of the force of braking, steering and driving. Rotating tires effectively levels the playing field.

Stay balanced

Sometimes tires become unbalanced. When taking a car in for routine maintenance, ask the mechanic to see if there Continued on Page 36

Test drive to find right ride

ars are among the most expensive purchases a person will make during a lifetime. That said, drivers want to make sure their next vehicle is the right one for them.

Research into vehicle safety and performance history is essential, but perhaps nothing gives drivers a better idea of how well a car meets their needs and driving style than a test drive. Many dealers allow people to test drive vehicles by themselves, allowing buyers to get the feel of a car without feeling pressured or distracted by salesmen.

When test driving a vehicle, it's always good to comparison shop, test driving different vehicles to get a better idea of what's available. Drivers who have owned and driven the same vehicle for a number of years can be easily overwhelmed when test driving a new car, which is likely more smooth and boasts more amenities than an older vehicle. That's why it's important to test drive a handful of new vehicles. This gives drivers a better point of reference for what a new car offers better than its competitors, and not a one-sided issue of what a new car offers compared to an older vehicle.

The following are some of the factors to consider when deciding which car to buy.

Visibility

Many drivers buying a new car after years driving the same vehicle might find it difficult to judge visibility. Familiarity with an old car can make it hard to get used to a new one. When judging visibility, determine if the view of the road is adequate and if the side and rearview mirrors can meet your needs. Sometimes a rear window is too small for drivers used to bigger rear windows, and this can prove a safety risk down the road. Don't be distracted by the vehicle's comfort. If the visibility is poor (and visibility varies for each individual), then the car probably isn't the right fit.

Comfort

Comfort is important for many reasons. Cars are big investments, and drivers have the right to drive a comfortable vehicle. A comfortable ride can also speak volumes about a vehicle's engineering. If a car is noticeably uncomfortable, drivers should be suspicious about the rest of the vehicle. Suspension plays a role in comfort, but suspension might also depend on the type of vehicle. A sports car, for example, might feel each bump in the road, but the superior handling attracts drivers who revel in acceleration. Comfort often depends on the type of vehicle, and buyers who have a specific type in mind should only test drive vehicles within that type. This will give an idea of which one within a certain category is the most comfortable.


Braking

Braking can be hard to evaluate, but it should feel smooth and should not feel as if the car is stopping too fast or too slowly. If possible, bring a passenger along and ask if he notices anything when the car brakes.

Handling

How a vehicle handles will go a long way toward how it avoids emergency situations on the highway. The vehicle should be easy to maneuver on the road. Take note if the vehicle moves too quickly or too slowly with sudden movements. Unless you experience an emergency while test driving a car, it's impossible to gauge how a vehicle will respond in an emergency. However, publications like Consumer Reports perform road tests that include emergency handling tests. Such information should be considered before buying a car.

When test driving a car, it's best to consider a host factors beyond just cost and a car's aesthetic appeal.



Learn the proper way to rotate tires

R otating tires is something that many people do religiously, while others put off the task until they notice a problem with the car's performance. Rotating tires not only extends the life of the tires, but it also helps ensure safer driving.

One may not realize that the front tires often bear the brunt of the work. Making turns or parallel parking requires the force of the front tires. The frequent use and requirements of the tires produces friction on the road, and eventually heat.

Tire rotation essentially means the front passenger-side tire will be moved to the back passenger-side position. The same thing will occur on the driver's side. There's a reason for this: tires have unique wear patterns that are related to the suspension and the alignment. Should you switch the tires in a criss-cross pattern, it could affect the alignment and lead to a bumpy ride.

are any issues regarding balance. Out-of-balance tires can cause significant issues that stretch beyond just uneven tread wear. An-out of-balance tire can wear down the vehicle's suspension. When driving at highway speeds, drivers might notice a considerable thumping. This is often indicative of an outof-balance tire.

Stay cool

Sudden tire failure can often be traced back to overheated tires. A tire can overheat for a number of reasons, including aggressive driving. Frequently driving on coarse surfaces or at high speeds can also increase tire temperatures, as does ambient temperature. Driving at high speeds on a very

depend on the vehicle and the tire, however. Certain vehicles have tires of different sizes in the rear and front, which prevents front-to-back rotation.

Many tires should be rotated every 3,000 to 5,000

hot day increases the risk of sudden tire failure, as does driving at high speeds on coarse surfaces. To reduce tire temperature, avoid doing these things simultaneously. If it's an especially hot day, for example, don't drive aggressively, and maintain lower speeds.

Don't mix and match

A vehicle's balance can be affected significantly if owners mix and match their tires. Having different tires on the left and right sides is likely to upset a car's balance. When installing tires, do so in front or rear pairs or even complete sets. Pairs should also be the same size, brand, and type, and should have the same tread wear as well. Should one tire go bad, it's almost always worth it to buy two tires. When buying two, always put the two new

miles, even if they don't show signs of wear.

Consult with a service station to determine the best pattern for rotating your tires and the ideal time interval between rotations.

tires on the rear wheels, regardless of which type of transmission (rear-wheel drive, all-wheel drive, etc.) the vehicle has. The rear wheels need maximum traction so the vehicle can remain stable.

Don't overload a tire

Check tires for their maximum load range, which will be listed on the tire sidewall. This maximum load should never be exceeded. Doing so will increase tire wear and shorten the tire's life. Excessive load also increases the risk of sudden tire failure. It's important to note the maximum passenger and cargo load intended by the vehicle manufacturer is often significantly less than what the vehicle can actually hold. But drivers must adhere to this figure to ensure their vehicles are safe and reduce the risk of sudden tire failure.

WICB/WIPA negotiations


The West Indies Cricket Board (WICB) and the West Indies Players Association (WIPA) have started negotiating a revised collective bargaining agreement (CBA) and memorandum of understanding (MoU).

The negotiations recently started in Barbados in a bid to chart a positive way forward for what has been a difficult issue to resolve, WIPA said.

The meetings are to discuss the terms and conditions, which could result in a mutually agreed CBA and MoU between the two parties.

The CBA and MoU came into effect on Sept. 1, 2005 with the provision that they could be changed or replaced with the agreement of both parties. If not, they would continue to be in force.

However, in 2011 the WICB signaled its intention to unilaterally terminate the CBA and the MoU.

The New York Red Bulls (9-5-4, 31 pts.) was facing a 16-game winless streak in Foxboro Stadium when it took on the hosts, New England Revolution, on Sunday afternoon in an MLS game, but the trend continued. The winless streak

either and this is anathema to the purpose of play games - which is to win. The fact that the Red Bulls were without starters Thierry Henry, Rafael Marguez, Jan Solli and Heath Pierce obviously influenced Hans Backe's decision to go defensive, but the coach has to show confidence in his substitutes and allow them to approach the game in a positive manner.

Bengtson was the leading scorer in the Honduran National League. New York next hosts the Seattle Sounders at Red Bull Arena in Harrison (NJ) on Sunday in a 4:00 p.m. kick-off.

Didier Deschamps was named the new coach of the French National team, it was announced by the French Football (Soccer) Federation announced on Sunday after Laurent Blanc was said to have turned down a new contract offer.

Deschamps was the captain of France when it won the 1998 World Cup and 2000 European Championship. He also won the 1993 Champions League with Marseille, the club he coached until a week ago, after leading it to a league title and three French League Cups.

"Didier Deschamps is obviously the right man for this job," French league president Frederic Thiriez said. "In this difficult context, the France team needs a man with his character and experience."

Legendary Portugal and Benfica FC forward Eusebio is reportedly recovering well in a Lisbon hospital after suffering a stroke at the recently concluded European Championships, where he traveled with the Portugal National Team. The 70-year-old Eusebio da Silva Ferreira, named one of FIFA'S 10 best players of all time, is still the only player to score four goals in a World Cup finals game. He did this against North Korea at the 1966 World Cup in England. Eusebio, "The Black Panther," led Benfica to numerous titles in the 1960s.

Cvclones left fielder Stefan Sabol is on a tear — but he wouldn't even know it if his father hadn't tipped him off.

The first-year phenom from California's Orange Coast College went on an 11-game hitting streak from June 25 through July 5 — but he didn't realize it until he heard from dear old dad.

"I was aware I was seeing the ball well, making good contact," said the California native, who started his string of successful at bats with a single in the team's shut out victory over the Hudson Valley Renegades. "It wasn't till I was talking to my dad and he just said, 'You've got a seven game hitting streak going on,' that I realized it."

But Sabol - who sent a fastball over the left-center field wall on July 4 against the Crosscutters for his first minor league home run — said he made sure not to let his success at the plate go to his head.

"It's in the back of my mind, I'm sure," Sabol said before last Friday's game, when his streak came to an end. "But if I get a sac fly or a key walk that gets in a

run, I'll be happy with that."

Sabol didn't get a hit that night, but he ended up reaching base on a throwing error and crossing the plate on a wild pitch — helping lift the Clones to a 7–6 victory in the rubber match against the Crosscutters.

Sabol said he never picked up hits in more than four straight games while playing ball in school and wasn't eying the all-time Mini-Mets record: 17 in a row, set by left fielder Lucas Duda — now a full-grown Met — in 2007.

"I'm just trying to have good at bats, find the holes, and help the team win."

Record-breaking will have to wait for now, but Cyclones skipper Rich Donnelly said he definitely hasn't been putting the pressure on his left fielder.

"The only thing I've said to Stefan since he's been here is 'Hello' and 'Good game,'" said Donnelly. "When a guy's doing his work well, you don't need to say much to him."

The 19-year-old is batting .308 in the last 10 games with a .413 on-base percentage, is trailing only first baseman Cole Frenzel on the team in hits.



PROBLEM IMMIGRATION



 MARITAL PROBLEMS: Are you married to a US Citizen and experiencing serious marital crises or abandonment? You may be entitled to work permit and green card even if you are divorced or have certain criminal record. You do not need your spouse to file for you or sponsor you or attend an interview with you. This relief is also applicable to child (including step child), fiancée and parent of US citizens or green card.
 2. DISTRESS PARENT: Are you a parent of US Citizen Child?

3. ILLEGAL ENTRY: Are you an alien who entered the country illegally?

4. **ILLEGAL REENTRY:** Are you an alien who entered the country illegally after being deported?

5. DEPORTATION, ASYLUM AND VOLUNTARY DEPARTURE: Are you a fugitive alien previously

ordered deported or your asylum denied or failed to leave after an order of Voluntary Departure?

6. <u>STEP-PARENT</u>: Are you an alien step-parent of a US Citizen Child? You may be entitled to your green card even if you had divorced.

7. <u>STEP-CHILD</u>: Are you an alien step-child of a US Citizen? You may be entitled to your green card even if your parent(s) have divorced.

VICTIM OF CRIME: Are you a victim of past or present crime including female genital mutilation, violence, fraud, sex crimes and so on?
 CONDITIONAL GREEN CARD PROBLEMS: Do you have conditional green card and you are having problem getting the permanent

one?


