Climate change worries

CODRINGTON, Barbuda (IPS/GIN) -- Local scientists are warning the tiny 62-square-mile island of Barbuda is becoming one of the most vulnerable spots on earth to the consequences of climate change.

"We are small, we are flat... and if the climate change predictions come true, especially with respect to sea level rise, you are looking at potentially a third of the island being not available for the sort of things we are using it for

Ahead even of his Saturday swearing in, last week, Mexican President-elect Enrique Pena Nieto met in Washington on Tuesday with President Barack Obama to lay out a vision for a new bilateral relationship based more on economics and less on security issues.

Speaking with President Obama, Pena Nieto noted that the two leaders share a "very important vision ... of creating more jobs". The president-elect, who won his seat in July, also noted that a modernising Mexico has "the opportunity to grow ... (and) to integrate North America, to be

Carib Fears Of EU Aid Cut-Off

The Caribbean trade group Monday said it is opposed to plans by the European Union (EU) to amend the criteria used for disbursement of development aid, saying nearly all of its members, barring finance-starved Haiti will largely be disqualified from accessing concession aid loans if the European Parliament approves the new system.

Caribbean Community (CARICOM) Secretary General Irwin LaRocque told a regional forum in the Dominican Republic that the new so-called process of "differentiation" will see the EU looking at economic indicators like gross domestic and gross national products to determine which countries should still qualify for development aid while ignoring age-old vulnerabilities like hurricanes and other national dieasters

He described the new EU approach as "disquieting", arguing that if the policy is applied without considering other factors "this will have a negative impact on certain programs and the levels of assistance to some of our member states" currently getting financial assistance from the European Development Fund (EDF).

The issue is to be discussed in detail when leaders of the African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) group of former European colonies meet

Barbados

Barbados Prime Minister Frenduel Stuart has reassured Barbadians that the Caribbean Broadcasting Corporation (CBC) will not be privatized.

"Under the Frenduel Stuart administration there will be no privatization. Whatever influences are out there in the broadcast environment, the government of the day must have a say in setting the tone for what people see and what they hear," he said during the recent St. Michael East and Central Branch meeting at Springer High School.

"We believe that there is a role for the government, the role of

the state in certain areas of this economy and we believe that there is a role for the



private sector, in certain areas of the economy. However, we are not getting rid of the CBC. Other players are coming into the market but CBC belongs to the government, like how the Transport Board also belongs to the government," he pointed out.

Guyana

The Malaysian news agency has reported that a container from Guyana was intercepted with cocaine in coconut milk and that a Nigerian drug syndicate is believed to be behind it.

Bernama reported that Bukit Aman Narcotics CID Director Datuk Noor Rashid Ibrahim said the tactic was foiled by the Selangor Customs Department after detaining the ship carrying a container of cargo in which a section contained drugs worth RM22 million.

"Based on information from the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (USDEA), the ship which arrived on Nov. 12 at Port

Klang was filled with 980 cartons of cans containing coconut milk and pieces of pineapple.



"Sixteen cartons comprising 384 cans of coconut milk were identified as mixtures with 400 grams of cocaine in each can by the Chemistry Department," he told a media conference, according to Bernama.

He said the container which originated from Guyana was to be

sent to Mozambique with South Africa as a transit point to transfer the container into another ship.

Haiti

Haiti's government has warned a group of soldiers that it will not tolerate any



action aimed at disrupting law and order amid concerns the former soldiers were planning more public action to support calls for the establishment of a military in the French-speaking Caribbean Community (CARICOM).

A statement from the Ministry of Defense said it had word that the former soldiers were preparing to mount new public demonstrations, trying to pressure President Michel Martelly administration so they could "obtain undue privileges."

In the past, the former soldiers and their supporters have paraded in public with mismatched camouflage uniforms, with some of them also carrying rifles and pistols.

The soldiers have been calling on President Martelly to honor his campaign pledge to restore the army that was disbanded in

1995, but the international community has warned that an army would not be in the best interest of a country still recovering from the devastation caused by a powerful earthquake in 2010 that killed an estimated 300,000 people and left more than a million others homeless.

Jamaica

The Jamaica Home Circuit Court has temporarily lifted the curfew order that was imposed on murder accused Ninja Man, whose real name is Desmond Ballentine. The waiver will expire on Jan. 7 next year.

Previously, term of his J\$2 million bail condition was that he be at home



between 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. each night. But when the matter was raised in court recently, his lawyer Valerie Neita Robertson told Senior Judge Gloria Smith, that despite the variation in the bail condition, the restriction was affecting the earning potential of the artiste especially for the festive season.

The judge then decided to lift

the order. The trial of the murder case against Ninja Man was also put off to May 13 next year.

St. Lucia

St. Lucians will soon benefit from a further reduction in the electricity tariff.

St. Lucia Electricity Services Ltd. (Lucelec) has announced

that the pendreduction ing comes as early as US\$300,000 is being made



available by the light and power company for redistribution to customers, in accordance with the requirements of the Electricity Supply Act.

Under the Electricity Act, as amended in 2006, Lucelec is required to set aside 50 percent of profits above the company's allowable rate of return each year to be redistributed to qualifying customers.

Electricity customers are identified by the Electricity Supply Act as "industrial and hotel consumers" and "consumers or groups of consumers in need of special protection" as determined by the minister of finance.

Lucelec communications officer Roger Joseph explained that the funds are distributed equitably among all qualifying customers and reflected as a reduction in the price the customers pay per unit each month until the poll of funds is used up.

Based on Lucelec's financial performance for 2011, qualifying customers have been receiving a tariff reduction of approximately half a cent per unit each month.

The additional funds will effectively reduce what qualifying customers pay for electricity by nearly two cents per unit for the remainder of the year.

Trinidad

BP Trinidad and Tobago (BPTT) announced recently it had discovered an estimated one trillion cubic feet of gas off the coast of Trinidad and Tobago, doubling the estimated gas in place in the Savonetta gas field to two trillion cubic feet.

BPTT made the announcement during a recent meeting in London, which was attended by T&T's Energy Minister Kevin Ramnarine and T&T's High Commission to London, Garvin Nicholas and other BP repre-

sentatives. The gas well

discovered began production in

October 2012, and if successful the two additional development wells are also expected to be brought into production over the next 18 months.

BPTT President Norman Christie said: 'This is exciting news for both bpTT and the industry since this represents the largest discovery for BPTT since 2005.'

Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar said the Savonetta 4 discovery will no doubt aid the arrest in the decline of natural gas reserves.'

In a statement, she said: "We are advised that this is BP's largest discovery in Trinidad and Tobago in seven years and the largest discovery of natural gas in Trinidad and Tobago since 2007. This discovery augurs well for confidence in the Trinidad and Tobago economy."

Antigua faces stark environmental realities

ST. JOHN'S, Antigua, Dec. 4, 2012 (IPS/GIN) - Tourism-dependent Antigua may have been spared the ravages of superstorm Sandy, but the island is nevertheless feeling its effects on environmental, political and economic fronts.

The country is preparing for a drop in visitors from the United States, a key source of tourists for Antigua. Tourism Minister John Maginley pointed to the importance of the northeastern states of New York, New Jersey and Connecticut, which were hit hard by Hurricane Sandy and which he called "the destination's largest source market in the United States".

University of the West Indies (UWI) Professor Norman Girvan has suggested that the economic impact of Sandy could be as bad as that of the terrorist attacks in the United States on Sep. 11, 2001. "We will see a downturn...from now until January and February," he said. "I think the initial impact will possibly be as great as 9/11, but in terms of the long-term effects it is too early to tell."

Local officials say Sandy, which brushed Antigua on Aug. 22 as a tropical storm, has served as a wake-up call for the country, blowing the topic of climate change back to front and center.

"Events like Hurricane Sandy tend to bring our focus back," Diane Black-Layne, chief environmental officer in the environmental division of the government of Antigua and Barbuda, told IPS. "There are a range of adaptation measures that have to take place."

"We now have to adjust to a new world or to a new norm...every single country will experience extremes in weather fluctuations at a frequency that is unprecedented," she added. Although many remain skeptical about climate change, Black-Layne said she was pleased to see that the Antigua and Barbuda government is taking steps to prepare the island.

She pointed out that in the Land Use Plan recently passed by Parliament, "climate change issues have been taken into consideration." She added, "In a few years when we are reviewing applications for development, especially on the coastline or in flood prone areas, we will have to take climate change into consideration."

"If you think you can go to a minister and the minister would tell you, 'Yes, build whatever you want, wherever you want," she warned, "the sea will come and take away your building or insurance companies will not insure you."

In July, Agriculture Minister Hilson Baptiste announced that the government intended to join with the Nature Conservancy, a global climate change organisation, to take advantage of its debt-for-climate-adaptation swap. The body is expected to pay off Antigua and Barbuda's debt of 18 million U.S. dollars to Brazil in exchange for the country's involvement in coastal zone management.

The government has until the end of 2012 to put its proposal in writing and submit it to the Nature Conservancy.

Signs of change

Brian Cooper, a British scientist who moved to Antigua in 1986, told IPS he has been observing stronger rainfall and other signs of a changing climate on the island over the past few years.

U.S. teacher helps build school in Dominican Republic

ALLENTOWN, Pa. (AP) - Erich May was a newspaper reporter in rural Clearfield County, a cabinet maker in the Eastern Shore of Maryland, and a high school English teacher in affluent Centre County before trying his hand at urban education in Allentown.

"Urban education is not for the faint of heart," said May, supervisor of instruction at Trexler Middle School. "Challenges spring from poverty."

Since taking the job in Allentown last year, May, like a lot of his fellow educators, has tried connecting with the district's student population, about 88 percent of whom are poor and 66 percent of whom are Hispanic. He's been practicing Spanish and learning the customs of their native culture.

"I hear Spanish in the hall-ways," he said.

Now, the 38-year-old will take his quest for understanding to another level when he travels to the Dominican Republic to help build a school in a place that happens to be the hometown of Trexler sixth-grader Job Rodriguez, 10.

"It is a very nice place," Job said. "It is a beautiful place."

Constanza is a farming community nestled in one of the fertile valleys of the

rugged highlands and mountains of the Caribbean nation on the island of Hispaniola.

"I'm told the only time I am going to see the beach is from the plane," May said.

May will help with concrete work and building classrooms in the charitable construction project that began last year and is known as Lifetouch Memory Mission.

The mission is being run by the National Association of Secondary Principals, the American Association of School Administrators, and the National Association of Elementary School Principals in partnership with the school yearbook company, Lifetouch. May's weeklong trip will run through Dec.

11

May said when he saw an ad looking for volunteers for the trip, he applied online, thinking it would be a good learning experience for himself and Trexler students. Months passed and he forgot about the application.

Then a letter arrived in the mail. He'd been selected.

"I thought, 'Oh my gosh, what's Holly going to say?"

May said

Holly, his wife and mother of 5-year-old Henry and 3-year-old Owen, said go.

"I was just really excited for him," she said. "I thought it was a good opportunity."

So did his bosses, who did not mind when he asked for vacation time.

in Equatorial Guinea from Dec. 10 to discuss aid and trade relations with the EU.

LaRocque said the proposed arrangements "will cast a shadow" over relations with the EU as these had "matured and broadened to the benefit of both parties."

The bloc is known to complain bitterly about the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund (IMF) using similar criteria to 'graduate" some of the more prosperous member states like, Trinidad, Barbados, the Bahamas and Antigua from concession loans. Now the region fears that the EU is on the same track but the EU is contending that the new system will ensure money goes to the poorest of the poor rather than to nations which could fend for themselves.

Both the EU and CARICOM have in recent weeks waged a public relations campaign against the EU's plans, as its parliament debates the issue and as fears mount that all the traditional concessions dating back to the colonial era are being slowly but surely chipped away by the ACP's former colonizers.

right now," marine biologist John Mussington told IPS.

Worsening the problem is the long-time practice of sand removal from the island, he says.

"You have land, sand and water, and when you take sand out of the system, sand will move from somewhere else to replace that which is moved. So the amount of sand which has been taken out of Barbuda over the years has impacted our shoreline.

"We already have accelerated erosion taking place because of the sea level rise, and added to that you are taking sand out of the system so what you find happening, that beautiful beach that stretches all the way from the north come around to the south, most of those areas where 10 years ago you had grape trees and coconut trees, they are just not there anymore and you are actually seeing the collapse of the vegetation into the water," he added.

In July 2011, Barbuda renamed a three-mile stretch of beach after the late Princess Diana of Wales, who was a frequent visitor. Mussington says the island could well lose that very beach, along with others that attract tourists and

boost economic growth.

"You experience the sea level rise which is being predicted, and one of the ways in which the shoreline responds to that is that the shoreline will move so the beaches will recede closer to the solid land." he told IPS.

"The low-lying area which is created by all that sand being excavated, now potentially is an area that becomes flooded with every storm. The last serious ground swell we had three years ago was sufficient to flood the entire area for quite a few weeks."

Dr. Brian Cooper, who heads the Antigua and Barbuda Environmental Awareness Group (EAG), said both islands have been experiencing their share of extreme weather conditions – one of the consequences predicted by climate change scientists.

Dr. Cooper told IPS extremes of weather inflict human trauma, cause economic damage and destabilise agriculture.

"We need first of all to look at our agriculture and our food supply, because the way the world is going, the way the population is increasing, and if these predictions about climate change come about, a lot of the world's foodproducing areas are probably going to be affected," he said.

"I think we need to take our own food production very seriously and that to me means we ought to be looking very, very critically at the agricultural land we are putting into housing," he said. "I think too much of that has happened already."

Dr. Cooper also said the country needs look at the water supply for agriculture because if droughts are going to be serious and prolonged, this would affect food production.

"We have desalination but the cost of desalinated water is really not amenable to wide-scale use for agriculture and we've done very little to look at increasing our other sources of surface water or ground water, and ground water itself is likely to be affected by rising sea levels because all our well-fed areas are very close to the coast," he said.

He pointed to recent floods in Russia and Pakistan, and weather extremes in the United States and Canada as clear evidence that climate change is real and happening now.

"It's really falling in line very much with what was predicted... we get extremes of weather anyway, things go in cycles, you have various climatic cycles coming together and giving you exceptional weather conditions, but all those things are exacerbated by the increase in CO2 in the atmosphere, at least that is what the climate change scientists are more or less unanimously agreed on," Cooper said.

Dale Destin, a climatologist at the Antigua and Barbuda Meteorological Service, told IPS that over the past two years, the country saw a period of wet conditions that has now transitioned into what may become a mild drought.

"These things would generally happen in cycles but with climate change some of these observations become more extreme," he said.

Mussington said despite the grim predictions, climate change need not be a death sentence, adding that Small Island Developing States like Antigua and Barbuda have to adapt.

However, he laments that the adaptation issue is not being taken seriously and is absent from policies governing certain critical areas.

participating in this part of the world."

Indeed, ahead of his sixyear term, Pena Nieto is laying the groundwork to turn global attention away from the image of his country as crime- and drug-infested, and instead to focus on Mexico's four-percent growth rate, one of the strongest in the region and well above the global average, including that of the United States.

Ahead of closed-door discussions, President Obama conceded the new dynamic.

"I know the presidentelect is also interested in ... a discussion about both regional and global issues," Obama said, "because Mexico has become not simply an important bilateral partner, but is today a very important multilateral, multinational leader ... not only on regional issues, but also on global issues."

There is much to support greater economic ties between the two countries, which already sustain trade worth a half-trillion dollars a year. According to a new policy brief from the Mexico Institute at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars, a nonpartisan Washington think tank, Mexico is the second largest market for U.S. exports.

"There's a reason for putting the economic issue back in the spotlight, and it has to do with making tangible progress on issues of importance – jobs, exports – in both countries," Christopher Wilson, a co-author of the Mexico Institute brief, told IPS.

"That's not leaving aside immigration or security, which will stay important pieces. But the president-elect is clearly trying to change the narrative to one of more complexity – beyond the image of drugs and illegal immigration."

Further, Wilson suggests, "Changing the tone of the relationship, focusing on opportunities rather than challenges, could also facilitate progress on other sticky

issues, including security and immigration."

Calderon Turnaround

"Few countries will shape (the United States') future as much as Mexico," the brief suggests, noting that the bilateral relationship has already started to change.

For one, there now seems to be a crystallising understanding by officials on both sides of the border that the U.S.-funded "war on drugs" has been a failure. Pena Nieto ran on a campaign of repudiating the costly and incredibly bloody antidrugs assault launched by his predecessor, Felipe Calderon, which resulted in the deaths of some 60,000 to 100,000 Mexicans.

The president-elect stated instead that he would focus on working to reduce the violence that has wracked Mexican society over the past half-dozen years. He has said he would refocus funding on the police over the military and reorganise the decentralised security forces back under the Interior Ministry.

"Certainly we've witnessed a renewed intensity and frequency of storms. We have seen what I think has been quite a departure from what we've experienced before, that many of the storms have very farflung rain bands which are often a great distance from the centre of the storm," he said.

"In the case of [Hurricanel Omar in 2008 we didn't feel anything much of it until after it had passed... [when] we we got this rain band ,which didn't last very long but it dumped a tremendous amount of rain in the south of the island. There was tremendous flooding in the Body Ponds Valley and Bendals Village was cut off for a while because water was flowing over the bridge going into Bendals by several feet."

"We had the same thing

with [Hurricane] Earl in 2010, a tremendous burst of rain that had similar effects," Cooper added.

A local resident, Winston Derrick, now in his sixties, pointed to the destruction of a road, which he said had existed since his childhood, as clear evidence of the effects of climate change. Just days ago, he tried to drive from Sweetes Village to Bendals Village but could not, he said. "The road has become impassable. It's all washed out."

Cooper said a combination of Earl and Omar washed out the road, with which he too is familiar.

"That is the result of some of the torrential rainfall that we have been having particularly in the southwest part of the island. I've been living in Sweetes for about 10 years and I used to drive down that road and I can't drive

there now" he said

But despite all the evidence, Dr. Cooper said people are still not taking climate change as seriously as they should.

"Most of it is too far away," he said. "I think when we had that series of hurricanes people were beginning to think, 'Okay, what's happening?' But it is also difficult for...scientists to pick up changes that happen over a long period of time," he told IPS.

Black-Layne disagreed.

Black-Layne disagreed. "It is frightening when you have to listen to the science and the projections," she said, especially when one has children who will be affected by these changes. "To some extent you are saddened by the slow pace in which the world is reacting," she added. "It's terrifying what is happening and what is going to happen."

Caribbean Community (CARICOM) states on Nov. 29 voted overwhelmingly with the rest of the world to grant Palestine Non-Member Observer State status at the United Nations.

They also expressed the urgent need for the resumption of negotiations between Israel and the Palestinians leading to a permanent twostate solution.

The resolution on the status of Palestine in the UN was adopted by a vote of 138 in favor to nine against, with 41 abstentions, by the 193member General Assembly.

Antigua and Barbuda, Belize, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Jamaica, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Suriname, and Trinidad and Tobago voted in favor.

While no CARICOMmember state voted against according Palestine Non-Member Observer State status, three CARICOM states - Bahamas, Barbados and Haiti – abstained.

Other nations that voted against the accord were Canada, Czech Republic, Israel, Marshall Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, Nauru, Panama, Palau and the United States.

Equatorial Guinea, Kiribati, Liberia, Madagascar and Ukraine were absent for the vote.

Jamaica said it voted in favor of the resolution based on a "firm commitment to a

just and lasting peace in the Middle East region.

"Such a peace could only be brought about by a negotiated settlement," said the island's UN Ambassador Raymond Wolfe.

He said Jamaica sought a balanced approach to the issue, which recognized, among other things, Israel's right to exist.

In its view, Jamaica said the granting of Non-Member Observer State status to Palestine was on the same level as the status afforded to the Holy See delegation, noting that it was not equivalent to membership in the United Nations.

"The moment has arrived for the world to say clearly: enough of aggression, settlements and occupation," said Mahmoud Abbas, president of the Palestinian Authority, as he called on the 193-member body to "issue a birth certificate of the reality of the State of

He charged that following Israel's "latest aggression against the Gaza Strip," the international community now faced "the last chance" to save the long elusive two-state solution, adding: "the window of opportunity is narrowing and time is quickly running out."

"We did not come here seeking to delegitimize a State established years ago, and that is Israel; rather we came to affirm the legitimacy of the State that must now achieve its independence, and that is Palestine," Abbas told the General Assembly before the vote.

He said the world was being asked to undertake a significant step in the process of rectifying the "unprecedented historical injustice" inflicted on the Palestinian people since 1948.

"Your support for our endeavor today will send a promising message - to millions of Palestinians on the land of Palestine, in the refugee camps both in the homeland and the Diaspora, and to the prisoners struggling for freedom in Israel's prisons – that justice is possible and that there is a reason to be hopeful and that the peoples of the world do not accept the continuation of the occupation," Abbas

Israel's Ambassador to the UN, Ron Prosor, said his delegation could not accept the resolution.

Raglan George, executive director of DC 1707, which represents Childcare Local 205/95, can be seen every Monday outside of City Hall, a one-man picket. Supporters frequently join him.

George is protesting Mayor Bloomberg's recently implemented EarlyLearn early childhood education program. This "untested program," George asserts, puts in jeopardy long-running NYC subsidized day care and Head Start programs that did not receive EarlyLearn awards and do not have funds to continue. "He's taken the childcare program and tried to fix it when it wasn't broken."

"EarlyLearning does not work; the mayor should take a look at it," George says. "Working parents, who feed the economy, need affordable daycare."



Not so Sunnyside in Queens, New York

To The Editor:

The Fair Housing Justice Center (FHJC), along with Emery Celli Brinckerhoff & Abady LLP (ECBA), announced the filing of a lawsuit today in federal district court against a New York landlord and the superintendent at a large building with over 100 rental apartments located in Sunnyside, Queens for racial discrimination against three African Americans who inquired about rental apartments in the defendants' building.

The lawsuit alleges that the superintendent of the building, located at 41-41 46th Street and owned by NASA Real Estate Corporation, engaged in racial discrimination by lying to the African Americans, claiming that no apartments were available for rent, and refusing to show them apartments in the building. In contrast, the superintendent showed the same. vacant one-bedroom apartment to white individuals, some of whom arrived less than an hour after the African Americans to inquire about available apartments. The superintendent told the white individuals, "I chose the people. . . . You look like nice people, that's why I show you." He described the building as one made up of "choice people. Not everybody."

Discrimination in the area is likely systemic. According to the 2010 Census, fewer than 2% of all rental housing units in this area of Sunnyside, Queens are

occupied by African-American households. In contrast, African-American renters comprise 18% of all renter households in Queens and 27% of all renter households in New York City.

Over the past few years, FHJC systemic testing investigations have uncovered discriminatory practices by housing providers in New York City and surrounding suburban areas. "Testing is the only investigative tool capable of comparing and documenting how similarly qualified renters of different races are being treated in the housing market," according to FHJC Executive Director Fred Freiberg. "Individual renters are often unaware that discrimination is occurring. If housing discrimination is not detected, it is not reported. Yet, these odious practices restrict housing choice and perpetuate residential segregation."

The FHJC's testing has uncovered or documented race discrimination in New York City or the surrounding suburbs that led to over \$2 million in damages and extensive injunctive relief affecting thousands of housing units. For example, earlier this year, the FHJC settled a case for \$225,000 against landlords who allegedly engaged in racial discrimination in apartment buildings located in Brooklyn neighborhoods with a similar racial composition. "Regrettably, race discrimination in housing remains one of the rawest

A corporate tax structure in need of urgent reform

There's been a lot of talk about what we can't afford as a nation and who is getting what "gift" or which free ride. When President Obama recently met with CEOs and chatted with Jamie Dimon, we should hope he issued a stern warning that legal tax avoidance games played by banks and multinational corporations are on the chopping block. After all, free enterprise isn't free.

In the coming weeks there will be pivotal conversations about how and where to tax corporations and how to reform our corporate tax system. Don't believe the hype that these issues are too complicated. They're not. If you paid more than 1.9 percent in income tax, you paid a higher rate than Apple. Period.

Both political parties need to combat the damaging effects of the offshoring of jobs and revenues. Our current system drains our Treasury and threatens basic services and national security.

Citizens get it. According to a new poll by Hart Research, "84 percent of voters approve of increasing taxes on the profits American corporations make overseas, to ensure that they pay the same taxes on those as they do on domestic profits."

These issues were put on the national stage because of a presidential candidate who uses offshore accounts, and by the reporting of tax shell games by Apple, Google, Starbucks, Microsoft and General Electric. Now, in the U.K., Amazon, Starbucks and Google are being questioned by the government for shady tax practices.

The Obama administration and Congress need to correct

a flawed system that has fostered legal tax avoidance and raised the ire of progressives and conservatives alike.

Who can defend companies making record profits skipping out on their tax bills? Who can honestly keep holding up the disingenuous argument that multinational corporations in the U.S. pay the highest rate in the world when the fact is, it just ain't so? Consider: According to the Congressional Budget Office, the average tax rate corporations pay on domestic profits in the U.S. is about 12 percent.

Moving forward, we'll hear lofty-sounding ideas about broadening the base, lowering the rates, closing loopholes, and more technical ideas about moving to a territorial system of taxation.

Let's start with the former: The loopholes that need to be closed are those that enable corporations to pay extraordinarily low tax rates or no tax at all by shifting profits, patents and headquarters offshore. These cost us \$100 billion per year.

With respect to the latter, lawmakers are in danger of making a bad situation worse. A territorial system would be tantamount to a permanent tax holiday for corporations. Under this system, companies would not have to pay U.S. federal income taxes on foreign earnings when they bring the profits back to the United States. These "foreign" earnings include the money that companies such as Google pay themselves for their own products or patents conveniently parked offshore.

Powerful special interests and CEOs have already lined up money, lobbyists and their media machine to lull lawmakers and citizens into believing they're the grownups at the table and know what's best. They don't. Instead, they benefit from a system rigged for their interests. And now they want more, at your expense.

Decisions made about taxation will have long-term and profound effects. It's not fair to continue to ask taxpayers to sacrifice, while failing to collect existing tax revenue from corporations making record profits.

Free enterprise isn't free. The nation's budget situation may be reason enough to close these loopholes, but the ramifications go much further. American corporations that benefit from the work force, infrastructure, courts, markets and national security of the United States shouldn't be allowed to avoid their responsibilities.

Former U.S.-based corporations that have benefited from U.S. government research and development dollars and do the majority of their business in the U.S. should not be allowed to simply call a post office box in the Cayman Islands or an empty law office in Switzerland their "headquarters."

Congress needs to close offshore tax-dodging loopholes and make large corporations pay taxes in the same country that provides them with the benefits and legal protections that make it profitable to operate in the United States in the first place.

Stepping over the gun violence issue...yet again

It is a somewhat noteworthy sequence that soon after some big players in the power-and-influence game got their comeuppance at the polls, there's been attention drawn to another of the self-assured "untouchables" of power wielding, albeit via a tragic circumstance in the world of sports. The unfortunate murder-suicide involving pro footballer Jovan Belcher and his girlfriend brought in its wake the gun violence issue, which bubbles up whenever there's a headline-making incident to remind us, fleetingly for sure, that the gun ownership matter is still there, still unaddressed, thanks to those high-rolling influence traders.

The catalyst for this latest focus on guns being used in senseless acts of violence was NBC broadcaster Bob Costas who devoted a commentary last Sunday evening to the tragic turn of events thrust upon the Kansas City Chiefs as a result of Belcher's actions. Costas quoted sports writer Jason Whitlock who had written that had Belcher not owned a firearm, he and his girl-friend would be still alive. That, of course, is conjecture. But the eruption of controversy that followed Costas' remarks became perhaps

more of a front page news nugget than what prompted the comments he made.

As one would expect, most of the braying about Costas having used an inappropriate forum (halftime of a football game) to say his piece, or critical of his point of view, came from the usual apologists for the status quo on guns – people unalterably opposed to even basic, common-sense controls being imposed on the accessibility of firearms. Quite absurdly, the anti-Costas frenzy extended to a TV discussion on one network of whether Costas should be fired.

One immediately saw, overhanging all this palaver, the ogre of the gun lobby's major players – the NRA and its big-money cronies in the firearms industry. They didn't have to weigh in on the larger issue to which Costas had linked the deaths of those two young people. They had for so long so effectively done the demagogue bit on guns and the travesty of considering gun-control legislation, they could rest comfortably that there were surrogates enough to quell any mini uprising in the bleeding-heart ranks.

But just as the great financial fix now required in Washington will

likely provide insight into how many Republicans are ready to declare themselves no longer beholden to Grover Norquist and other nut-job advocates of no tax increase, regardless of whatever, so too does one hope for a lightning bolt on the firearms front that sets in motion a reversal of the intimidation that has cowed lots of seemingly wellmeaning folk. Fear of the gun lobby's wrath has reduced many a progressive or moderate to absolute silence on the gun issue. It's been an unhealthy shackling of public officials that, like Norquist's tax noose on Republicans, cries shame on their collective wimping out. Nothing has more dramatically demonstrated the lily-livered ways of Washington on the gun issue than that shooting rampage in Arizona a couple of years ago that invaded the very halls of Congress, Rep. Gabby Giffords suffering incapacitation that would halt her career in public life, even as other victims paid

with their lives. Congress remaining largely unmoved even by this assault on its own institution said it all; loss of a moral compass in Washington was never more clearly telegraphed.

What's been downright scary in this debate on gun violence is the unobstructed path to zero opposition that the pro-gun element has been able to carve. There was juice enough in 1994 -- notably aided by the active involvement of Jim Brady, wounded in the Reagan assassination attempt - to get an assault weapons ban passed in Congress. Ten years later when the ban was up for renewal, the dynamics had so changed that serious discussion of Congress following through and doing right became a non-This, mark you, had to do with removing restrictions on the acquisition of assault weapons, items whose open-market availability no civilized society should coun-

There have been some few who have dared to buck the tide of surrender. Long Island's Rep. Carolyn McCarthy, whose life was personally touched by gun violence, has been a tireless crusader and has publicly criticized her Congressional col-

leagues' spinelessness in not standing up to the NRA. And to his credit, Mayor Michael Bloomberg has been unfailingly resolute in his advocacy of strict gun control laws. Bloomberg was moved to assail what was practically a non-inclusion of gun control in the recent presidential debate that centered on domestic matters. But such scant opposition amounts to odds the NRA and those in bed with them would take any day of the week.

We are, however, in the downdraught of an election that some believe to have been transformative. The wackos ran a right-wing extremist to challenge a "too moderate" Senator Richard Lugar in a primary in Indiana and wound up losing the seat to Democrats in November. Another extremist tried to knock off the Democratic incumbent senator in Missouri and failed. The Republican brass swear they had the presidency figured to be securely in the bag for Mitt Romney. Maybe we aren't done yet with this succession of "sure things" on the right that turn out not guite so. And maybe, to the NRA's chagrin, the timing could prove right, after all, for gun proliferation getting, via Bob Costas, that frontburner play it deserves.



Lagarde has suggested to Barbadian authorities that a devaluation of the Barbados dollar would make the country's tourism more competitive and help its economy to grow.

According to a recent press statement

issued by the Central Bank of Barbados (CBB), this suggestion was made to the bank's governor Dr. DeLisle Worrell when he attended



a recent breakfast meeting with the IMF and the president of the World Bank.

However, the island's chief economist shut down the IMF's head suggestion, pointing out in the statement, "To most of us in the Caribbean, it does not seem rational to impoverish yourself to grow your economy. To us, it is obvious that is what devaluation implies."

Former U.S. President Jimmy Carter recently visited Haiti to help build homes in a town hit by the devastating January 2010

Carter and his wife Rosalynn led a mission of hundreds of Habitat for Humanity volun-

teers in the south-western town of Leogane. The town was the epicenter of the earthquake.



Many people there still have no home or live in ter-

rible conditions. The former president and former first lady took an active part in the

construction of 100 one-room houses on about 14 acres of land. Families will get to live in the homes rent-free for five years and then will have to pay a modest annual rent to the government.

Trinidad

The Trinidad and Tobago Government has removed the 15 percent Value Added Tax (VAT) from more than 4,000 selected food items.

Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar said the VAT removal was just one of the measures to help reduce food prices.

She also promised to remove the CARICOM

duties on food as part of the ongoing bid to reduce

Persad-Bissessar said the duty removal is a mat-

ter, which would affect CARICOM's Common External Tariff (CET).

"Down the road, items like rice, flour and sugar are already zero-rated but because of the duties on them they tend to impact heavily on the consumer, but those are long-term measures, this was a short-term measure," she said.

The prime minister said the next step would be for the Ministry of Legal Affairs and the Prices Council to keep monitoring so that this is not a one-shot and by tomorrow the prices have gone up again. The removal of VAT took place from Nov. 15. Alcohol has not been zero-rated.

Venezuela chocolate king thrives despite controls

CANO RICO, Venezuela (AP) - Cacao pods ripen to colors from bright vellow to crimson in the forestshaded plantations of Venezuela, where some of the world's finest chocolate is born.

The crop is transformed into gourmet bars that sell briskly in Venezuela and are exported to the United States, Europe and Japan by the country's premier chocolate maker, Chocolates El Rey, or The King. As the company has won success and international acclaim, though, it has also had to cope with difficulties brought on by President Hugo Chavez's socialist government.

El Rey's growing business illustrates how some entrepreneurs are managing to hold on and even thrive in Venezuela despite more government regulations and state takeovers of companies and farmland. Producers of crops such as coffee and sugar have struggled in the face of price controls and cheap imports.

El Rev used to go through just four bureaucratic steps to export its chocolate. Now, owner Jorge Redmond says the list of requirements has grown to more than 50.

Some cacao plantations have been taken over by the government, and while those seizures haven't affected El Rev. the company suffered a major setback a decade ago when its model farm was overrun by squatters. Those who took the land planted corn and cut down towering mahogany and saman trees.

El Rey's attempts to get the farm back have been fruitless, and Redmond acknowledges feeling worried about the possibility of

one day being targeted for expropriation by the government. Still, he remains optimistic about cacao and plans new investments to increase output at the company's plant, which is already churning out 3,000 tons of chocolate a year. El Rey has a workforce of more than 200 employees, and plans to increase its exports.

"We're going to stay here and fight it out. We're not giving up. And I think most other companies are going to do the same," said Redmond, who has been leading El Rey for nearly four decades as its majority owner and president. "You have to keep working. My philosophy is that we're going to last longer than the government."

Chavez, for his part, has talked about harnessing Venezuela's potential in cacao and increasing exports. His government has already established the Venezuelan Cacao Socialist Corporation, which has

invested in several processing plants.

Redmond said officials from the state company explained in a private meeting with buyers in November that the company plans to buy about 2,000 tons directly from growers in the region of Barlovento, east of Caracas, and then divvy it up in the industry.

"We were very clear ... that we're only going to buy what suits us," Red-mond said at his office in Caracas, which is decorated with wooden cacao pods and smells of chocolate.

Redmond's company has found a winning strategy by paying more for quality cacao, providing assistance to small farmers and marketing its chocolate in Venezuela and around the world.

Some of the aromatic cacao comes from independent farmers in Barlovento, where the lush coastal forests sprout with moss and bromeliads along with pea-sized cacao blossoms.

Lifelong grower Pablo Planchar said he is thankful to El Rey for the higher prices it pays for each burlap sack of cacao. He's also grateful that the company has provided equipment for pruning trees and special boxes made of apamate

wood where he ferments his cacao.

The cacao is then spread out and raked on a concrete patio for sun-drying, where a sliding metal roof installed by El Rey helps keep the crop dry when it rains.

"It's the institution that has helped us the most," Planchar said of the company.

On a recent morning, Planchar and six other men squatted among the trees, cracking open the cacao pods with machetes and scooping out clumps of white pulp and seeds with their fingers.

"This one's ready. Look at the color," Planchar said, cradling a golden yellow pod in his hands. While they worked, he and the other men smoked cigars and passed around a bottle of homemade liquor made from local plants and spices.

Planchar said he can earn the equivalent of \$465 a month, and he hopes for higher prices and more assistance of the sort El Rey is providing, as well as credit. His typical earnings are less than the minimum wage of \$476 for those with regular full-time jobs, and as a result many independent farmers do other work to make ends meet.

Ask the expert: How to get a good night's sleep

(StatePoint) According to the National Sleep Foundation, if you have trouble staying and falling asleep at night, or you wake up feeling unrefreshed in the morning, you may be suffering from insomnia.

Almost everyone has trouble sleeping every so often, but for many Americans having a hard time getting to sleep or waking in the middle of the night is a significant problem.

To help, board certified sleep specialist Dr. Russell Rosenberg, chairman of the National Sleep Foundation, offers answers to some questions about insomnia:

What is insomnia?

Insomnia involves difficulty getting to sleep, staying asleep, waking too early, trouble getting back to sleep or lack of refreshing sleep, as defined by the American Academy of Sleep Medicine.

Are the symptoms of insomnia the same for everyone?

Insomnia may affect people differently. Some complain of waking up in the middle of the night and having trouble falling back asleep, while others have trouble initially getting to sleep.

What can I do to help me fall

asleep at night?

Establish a regular bed and wake time. Create a sleep-conducive environment that is dark. quiet and comfortable. Allow time at night to "wind down" before climbing into bed. Doing work, watching TV and using the computer, both close to bedtime or in the bedroom, can hinder your ability to fall asleep. Avoid violent shows and news reports before bedtime as they can be agitating.

If I wake up in the middle of the night, what are some tips to help me fall back to sleep?

If you wake up in the middle of the night and stay in bed, don't stare at the clock. Also, do not watch TV, use your computer or cell phone, because use of these technologies can stimulate your brain and make it harder to fall back to sleep. Avoid drinking beverages containing caffeine or alcohol. Most importantly, you should try to relax.

What can I do during the day to help my insomnia?

Good daytime habits may help

with both types of insomnia. "I tell my patients to avoid caffeine after lunch," stresses Rosenberg. Also, get regular exercise but avoid rigorous exercise close to bedtime and always check with your doctor before starting any exercise regimen.

If those suggestions don't help, what else should I do?


You should speak with your healthcare professional if you are having trouble sleeping. He or she can determine whether or not you suffer from insomnia and if treatment is needed.

\$8.2 million grant for 'Project Hope'

Governor Andrew M. Cuomo on Nov. 19 announced an \$8.2 million grant from FEMA to provide a Crisis Counseling Assistance and Training Program called 'Project Hope' for New Yorkers in the hardest hit areas of Hurricane Sandy. The State Office of Mental Health (OMH) applied for the grant which will provide outreach, crisis counseling and educational services to individuals in New York City, Long Island and the Lower Hudson Vallev. As the state continues to recover from the storm, the program will receive additional funding to expand.

Project Hope is administered through an interagency federal partnership between FEMA and the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA). The program will be collaboration between state and local governments. It is expected to employ nearly

1,000 trained crisis counselors throughout the impacted regions to help traumatized individuals understand their situations, regain a sense of control, identify and express emotions, adjust to the disaster, manage stress, and take action with the use of coping strategies and community resources. These crisis counselors will join the nearly 100 OMH Disaster Mental Health staff members currently operating in Disaster Recovery Centers throughout the state.

New York State residents experiencing emotional distress as a result of Hurricane Sandy can access free, confidential crisis counseling 24/7 by calling LifeNet 800-543-3638.

"Hurricane Sandy wreaked destruction on our buildings and roads – but the impact was not only physical," Governor Cuomo said. "The storm turned the lives of thousands

of New Yorkers upside down, inflicting damage that was also emotional and mental. Project Hope will provide mental health support for New Yorkers in the hardest hit areas of the state, and I encourage those who may be experiencing trauma or simply need to talk to someone to call for help. I thank the federal government for their assistance."

Project Hope seeks to help victims of Hurricane Sandy recognize that, in most cases, their emotional reactions are normal. Crisis counselors will use the proven practices of Psychological First Aid, which uses relationship-based contact to provide secure and comfortable settings for victims to recover and obtain information, assistance and referrals. Project Hope aims to help thousands of New Yorkers return to their levels of functioning and mental health from before the storm.

Always dressed to the hilt, sporting long colorful fingernails, Maynard performed alongside Lord Shorty's on his Canadian concert tour, and went on to win numerous awards that include the JetStar Award, the Music Volks Award in Germany a Reggae Award, best Calypso and best Gospel Awards in Canada among others


The Guyanese community said they would especially miss Maynard's special performances she put on to entertain citizens at the Guyana Consulate in Ontario, Toronto.

Honored African endorses Ethiopian dam

The widow of the late Robert "Bob" Marley recently accepted a special African Diaspora award in Lilongwe, Malawi at the 7th Annual Living Legends Banquet.

Attended by President Joyce Hilda Banda, the event was hosted by the African Communications Agency (ACA).

"Rita is one woman who is very proud to be African," Dr. Erieka Bennett, ACA president/founder said. "She lives in the Bahamas, Jamaica, Ghana and Ethiopia, but she has schools for needy African children in Ghana."

"I'm very proud to be African, and it's very nice to be here with so many nice people in community as one people," Marley said.

The Living Legends Banquet annually honors various outstanding individuals by looking at how well they have represented the African Diaspora.

As Ethiopia stands precariously isolated by neighbors in the region due to



its effort to build a water reserve they named the Grand Ethiopian Renaissance Dam, while on the continent the reggae singer joined forces with advocates to promote, support and help raise funds for its construction.

The death of Ethiopian Prime Minister Meles Zenawi this summer, who took power in 1991, prompted her visit to the capital city of Addis Ababa.

Throughout his leadership he lobbied for the construction of a massive 6,000-megawatt hydroelectric dam on the Nile River.

The cost he said would be five billion dollars. He proposed 2017 as the completion date.

Throughout his presidency, Meles built seven small dams on the Nile. But with

construction of this GERD, opposition has heightened to include threats by Egypt's military regime.

An observer claimed: "Cairo fears that once the dam is completed in 2017, it will take two to three years, depending on rainfall, to fill up the 67 billion cubic meter reservoir, which could reduce the amount of water that flows into Egypt by 25 percent."

"After the reservoir fills up, there is no guarantee that Egypt will maintain its present share of the water, and Ethiopia is already planning multiple agricultural projects on Nile tributary rivers flowing from the Ethiopian highlands."

Marley is alleged to have admired Meles for his vision of lifting Ethiopia out of abject poverty, an aspiration

she reportedly shares.

Briefed on her visit by her Ethiopian representative Dr. Desta Meghoo, the celebrated matriarch received pertinent information related to opportunities and challenges posed by construction of the massive structure.

Afterwards, she expressed solidarity with Ethiopia's mission to improve standards in Africa.

"We can look forward to electric power that will benefit millions of Ethiopians and help neighboring countries too," Marley added.

"We have to do this. We have to do this with Ethiopia, for Ethiopia, for Africa. This is about African unity."

The reggae singer and mother said she is committed to support the nation that spawns the Blue Nile.

It was then that she announced the launch of Africa Unite Ring Back Tone; fine art and photographic exhibition and a black tie banquet.

"Africa Unite" marked an historic occasion in 2005 when Ethiopian led a global birthday celebration for Robert "Bob" Marley. Staged in Addis Ababa, millions packed into Meskel Square to show solidarity with the words and message of the reggae icon.

"How good and how pleasant it will be, before God and man, to see the unification of all Africans..."

The widow re-stated from lyrics penned in song by her famous husband.



A Grammy winner in 1996, that year Shaggy ruled the charts with Continued on Page 28



Crime victim turns vigilante in revenge flick

John (Scott Adkins) was sadistically beaten with tire irons and left for dead by three assassins dressed like ninjas during a home invasion. When he came out of his coma nine months later, all he could remember about the attack was how his wife and daughter had been murdered right in front of his eyes by a creep who had the nerve to taunt him.

In fact, their assailant, Luc Deveraux (Jean-Claude Van Damme) even had the temerity to remove his mask and show his face. As he recovered from his wounds, John

realizes he doesn't have much to live for with his family gone. So, he decides to take the law into his own hands, rather than wait for the police to bring the perpetrators to justice.

That is the deceptive point of departure of "Universal Soldier 4: Day of Reckoning," a high bodycount splatterflick ostensibly revolving around an embittered vigilante bent on revenge, ala Charles Bronson in Death Wish. Directed by John Hyams, the film is the fourth in a grisly franchise launched way back in 1992.

The plot thickens while John is searching for Deveraux, when he finds himself being relentlessly hunted by a mysterious figure (Andrei Arlovski).

Furthermore, getting to Deveraux proves easier said than done, since he is protected by an army of rogue Universal Soldiers in his capacity as high priest of the Unisol Church of Eventualism.

Previously, these liberated

Unisols had been remote-controlled sleeper agents, operating under the thumb of the government like latter-day Manchurian candidates. But trust me, trying to sort out this complicated storyline isn't



'Elza' opens in a new Harlem theater

For director Mariette Monpierre, the current two weeks of screenings at MIST Harlem is particularly sweet. Not only is this a theatrical run for her debut feature film in an Oscar-qualifying theater, but the Elza screening is also helping launch a fantastic new cultural hub at 40 West 116th St, in Harlem. (And, it's on the same block as the African Mart.) Elza is now playing daily at MIST Harlem until Dec. 14.

"The shooting was four weeks throughout Guadeloupe in April 2011 and beginning scenes were shot in Paris," says Monpierre, who has a small part in opening scenes. This is the first feature film made by a Guadeloupean female.

The world premiere was appropriately in Guadeloupe, this past summer and the current New York run began November 29, the second day in the "soft opening" of MIST Harlem.

Autobiographically inspired, the film is about Parisian college grad Elza, who, to her mother's intense disapproval, returns to Guadeloupe-her birth country-to find her biological father, a man who had abandoned her and her sis-

ing night-her first time in New York, the audience learned during the Q&A that Roumillac quickly stepped into the role after the production had begun and when another Elza, miscast, was let go. Monpierre plays the disapproving mother.

In Guadeloupe, Elza stumbles into a job, using a false name, as a babysitter in her father's household for his granddaughter. Up close, she and the audience witness the intense dysfunction in the family. The men in the family are

cheating dogs. Race relations within the class structure are exposed. Her father is no prince. Yet in spite of what she experiences, Elza still obsesses for reconciliation. The story unfolds on an island of sun, sand, and sensuality.

The director received support from a number of entities for the film production including the Department of Guadeloupe and French TV and prior to this screening has been shown at a plethora of international film festivals, most recently in Brazil.

Stagnation or growth in the Rasta movement

Eighty years after a segment of Jamaica's African population mobilized to peacefully protest colonial oppression and distinguish themselves separately as Rastafarians, allegedly, the lifestyle is gaining traction and may have recruited many more followers in the 21st century.

According to the Associated Press, "more people are joining Jamaica's homegrown Rastafarian religion..."

A report in the Jamaica Observer agreed with this position stating that "The Rastafarian faith is indeed rising in Jamaica, where new census figures show a roughly 20 per cent increase in the number of adherents over a decade, to more than 29,000."

That figure was disputed by Jalani Niaah, a lecturer at the University of the West Indies and expert in the Rastafari movement.

Niaah reportedly stated that the true figure may be closer to eight to 10 per cent and represents "a tiny sliver of the mostly Christian country's 2.7 million people, population."

He attributed the dispar-

ity to the fact "many Rastafarians disdain nearly all government initiatives and not all would have spoken to census takers."

While both media entities focused on the Bobo Ashanti commune in Bull Bay, Jamaica -- who differ from other Rasta sects in the belief that their founder, King Emmanuel Charles Edwards was the Black incarnation of Jesus Christ -- Rastafarians living off the island claim the opposite and contend the report does not fully represent the various communities that comprise the total Rastafarian sect.

Here in New York, Rastafarian advocate Paul "Jah Paul" Haughton agrees that in some areas of Jamaica there are some progressive movements.

He told Caribbean Life that "in New York, Rastas are stagnant."

"There is no progressive move," the avowed 'Honorebel Rastaman" assert-

"It has become a party thing...there is nothing concrete...it's all about reggae... very commercial."

Haughton said on significant dates such as --

Ethiopian Christmas, the birthday anniversary of Marcus Garvey, anniversary of the coronation of Emperor Haile Selassie I -- there is hardly ever any commemoration.

"People just grabbing at red, gold and green and reggae," Haughton said.

"And the church and state doing better because at least they have places to meet and reason."

Back on the island, the belief is that "its contemporary appeal is particularly fascinating to young men, especially in the absence of alternative sources for their development."

The Rasta movement's growing appeal there is attributable to its rejection of Western materialism, the scarcity of opportunities for young men in Jamaica and an increasing acceptance of it.

"For the Black Nationalist Bobo Ashanti commune, the Rastafarian faith is a transforming way of life, where Rastas strive to live a frugal existence uncomplicated by binding relationships to "Babylon" -- the unflattering term for the Western world." Niaah added.







"Nine years ago I was here with Allyson, now I am back, that means I am getting old, which is slightly worrying," said the 26-year-old Bolt. "But I will continue to work hard."

Felix won the 200-meter gold medal in London after settling for silver four years earlier in Beijing.

"My biggest defeats have come at the Olympic Games. After Beijing I was devastated, I had worked as hard as possible but I came up short," she said. "But I decided to rededicate myself even harder and it was a blessing in disguise. I was able to work harder than ever before and finally it all came together."

The other finalists for the women's award were New Zealand shot putter

its fourth overall. The Galaxy had defeated the Houston Dynamo, 3-1, to win the 2012 MLS championship.

A teary-eyed Beckham, who now leaves MLS after six years, four MLS Cup appearances and two championships, told reporters after the game that the Galaxy and MLS will continue to be a "special place to me," he said that he was "thankful to be a part of the Los Angeles Galaxy" as the 30,515 fans at Home Depot Center cheered in agreement.

Beckham was subdued for most of the game in his last outing for the Galaxy. He played from deep in his team's defensive third but still was able to deliver and few of his trademark long and dangerous passes to his favorite recipients, Robbie Keane and Landon Donavan; one such pass found Keane streaking down the left side, which Keane latched onto, dribbled into the penalty area to set up Donovan, who missed an open goal from inside 12 yards.

Beckham's slow start was the result of the very aggressive Dynamo team, which took the field in positive gear and took the game to the home team. Houston outplayed Los Angeles in the first half and kept the pressure on, which led to

Calen Carr's goal in the 44th minute; the striker stormed down the right side, held off

Galaxy defender Tom Meyer and beat Josh Saunders at the near post with a shot that shook the roof of the net for a Dynamo, 1-0, halftime lead. Unfortunately for Carr, he sustained an injury in a collision with Galaxy defender Omar Gonzalez and was limited to just a few minutes in the second half.

The contest turned out to be a game of two halves: the first half belonged to the Dynamo, but the second was all Galaxy. Gonzalez reflected on the subdued Galaxy locker room at half time when he said, "Everyone knew we would get a goal, and once we do, we'd win." It was the mantra of the 2012 Galaxy; this was a team that got off to a miserable start and lingered at the bottom of the Western Conference for most of the season; in hindsight, the season struggles emboldened the Galaxy, which put together a late season surge that saw it squeeze into the playoffs as the fourth seed among five and never looked back.

In the 60th minute on Saturday, Gonzalez climbed above Houston defender Kofie Sarkodie to head home Juninho's 36-yard free kick for the equalizer and the turning point in the game, which led to his MLS Cup MVP award; five minutes later, Dynamo midfielder Ricardo Clark was whistled for a hand ball in the penalty area, and Donovan, who along with Jeff Agoos and Brian Mullan are the only players to win five MLS Cup titles, registered his record 22nd MLS postseason goal and his 146th overall, from the penalty spot to score the winner as he did a year ago.
