# Obama unveils \$500m gun violence package

### By Erica Werner & Julie Pace

WASHINGTON (AP) — Braced for a fight, President Barack Obama on Wednesday unveiled the most sweeping proposals for curbing gun violence in two decades, pressing a reluctant Congress to pass universal

background checks and bans on military-style assault weapons and high-capacity ammunition magazines like the ones used in the Newtown, Conn., school shooting.

A month after that horrific massacre, Obama also used his

presidential powers to enact 23 measures that don't require the backing of lawmakers. The president's executive actions include ordering federal agencies to make more data available for background checks, appointing

## How To Combat Climate Change

ROSEAU, Dominica, Dec. 26, 2012 (IPS/GIN) - Imagine Guyana and Dominica without forests and rivers, or Antigua, Barbados and St. Lucia without beaches.

Atherton Martin, a conservationist and former minister of agriculture in Dominica, says climate change should be forcing Caribbean countries to take a hard look at how they are managing their natural resources, lest they eventually disappear.

"What the climate change principles tell us is that basically when your natural resource systems are debilitated, weakened or destroyed by climate change, your economy is thereby destroyed." he told IPS.

is thereby destroyed," he told IPS.

But all is not bleak. Martin
believes climate change could
potentially benefit the Caribbean
in two ways – firstly, by forc-

ing a change in mindset where countries take the lead instead of simply reacting; and secondly, by allowing governments to build stronger economies by accessing millions of dollars in climate change funding.

He pointed to Guyana's push to become a low carbon economy, noting that it has already drawn down more than 70 million dollars from carbon credits on just 10 percent of its forest systems.

"They expect to draw down a total of over 250 million dollars over the next year and this is a deal made on carbon credits and sequestration valuation with just one country, Norway," Martin said.

In July 2009, Guyana launched a low carbon strategy aimed at promoting economic develop-

### Caribbean

Morocco will send a technical team this year to the Bahamas to lure investors from the United Arab Emirates (UAE), Bahamas Foreign Minister Frederick Mitchell said.

This followed recent talks between officials from several CARICOM countries and their Moroccan counterparts as the region seeks to attract investors from the UAE.

Mitchell said apart from the Bahamas, the other CARICOM countries represented at the talks were St. Lucia, Dominica, Antigua and Barbuda and Grenada

He said the discussions with

the Morocco government included the possibility of scholarships Caribbean



students to attend Moroccan technical schools, tourism exchanges, agricultural and fisheries processes and developments.

Mitchell had traveled to Morocco recently to attend the Fourth Summit of the Group of Friends of Syria and he told reporters that the summit afforded The Bahamas can opportunity to have an outreach to Dubai.

He said Morocco which attracts an estimated ten million tourists annually, is interested in The Bahamas program of promoting the tourism industry.

### **Antigua**

The second suspect in the double murder of two Dominican men has escaped police custody. Kergus Martin Jr. jumped through a bathroom window at the St. John's Police Station recently. It is not the first time a suspect has used the window as an escape route.

Martin's escape came hours after another person of inter-

est in the killing broke loose from Montserrat police.

Cannonier said the primary focus of his new government "is to get our economy growing again, creating the conditions for new jobs and opportunity... creating the conditions to help people meet their daily needs and to ease the pressure they face."

The work ahead will not be easy, but we will get the job done. One of my government's goals is to change the way we conduct politics, to bring forward a new emphasis on cooperation and collaboration" he said.

"People of this country are going through very tough times and it is essential they know that their elected representatives are with them. We cannot expect Bermudians to tighten their belts without their leaders doing the same. Sacrifice must be shared," Cannonier said.

### **Dominica**

The Dominica Public Service Union (DPSU) says it will not accept the gov-

ernment's offer of one percent for public servants even after the parties agreed



to meet this month for another round of talks.

The two parties met last month and according to DPSU general secretary Thomas Letang, the Roosevelt Skerrit administration is not moving from the offer on the table. The union is seeking a three percent increase for the period 2010-2012 and has not ruled out the possibility of industrial action.

Letang made it clear the union would be sticking to its demands.

"We made it quite clear that under no circumstances we would accept the government's one percent," he said.

### Guyana

Guvana savs it will receive an additional US\$45 million in cash from Norway as a reward for protecting its Amazonian rainforest.

President Donald Ramoutar

says the money will help fund a hydroelectricity project in central Guyana and



provide electricity and Internet services in remote jungle com-

He said in a statement that Guyana has so far received US\$115 million of US\$250 million grant it negotiated with Norway as part of a 2009 agreement. The money serves as incentive for Guyana to protect its lush forests through sustainable mining, timber harvesting and other projects.

Most of Guyana's 730,000 people live on a narrow strip of coastal island, leaving the interior largely unoccupied. About 70 percent of Guyana is covered in forest.

### Haiti

Haitian officials have renewed the diplomatic passport of former dictator Jean-Claude Duvalier, his attorney said.

Lawyer Rey-Georges nold said the country's Minister of Foreign Affairs



reissued the expired travel document for Duvalier last month as is customary for ex-presidents and former prime ministers.

"They have to, because he's an ex-president," Georges said.

Duvalier suddenly returned to Haiti in 2011 following 25 years in exile in France. Upon his return, Haitian authorities opened an investigation into the human rights abuses associated with his 15-year rule. But the judge instead recommended that Duvalier be indicted for only financial crimes and faces no more than five years if convicted.

The case is currently dragging its way through an appeal process, and hearing in scheduled for Jan. 24.

### **Trinidad**

National Security Minister Jack Warner says that there has been a decline in serious crime since the People's Partnership Government came into office in 2010.

# Grenadians go to the polls on Feb. 19

Hardly a week after asking Governor Gen. Sir Carlyle Glean to dissolve Parliament, Grenada Prime Minister Tillman Thomas has announced general elections in the "Spice Isle" for Feb. 19.

Thomas made the announcement at a rally on Sunday afternoon, Jan. 13, of the incumbent National Democratic Congress (NDC).

"The time is right to seek a new mandate from the people of Grenada, Carriacou and Petite Martinique," said Thomas, who is also NDC party leader.

"With God's grace and guidance, we shall be victorious," he added.

With the dissolution of Parliament last week, voters in Grenada were expected to go to the polls within 90 days.

General elections in Grenada were constitutionally due by October this year.

"I wish to advise that today I advised his excellency the governor general to dissolve the Parliament of Grenada," said Thomas in a brief radio and television address on Jan. 9.

"This act paves the way for the setting of an election date within the next 90 days"," he added. "All such persons who are yet to register are urged to do so now.

"Given the need to ensure that all Grenadians who are 18 years, and over and are registered to vote, are given a fair chance to exercise their hard earned franchise, and against the background of the introduction of a new voter registration system, my government's focus was on ensuring that the new system was properly put in place," the prime minister added.

"It should be noted that if an election was called before the new voter registration was put in place, the old system has to be used. This system, as many of you know, needed to be urgently improved, because, among other

things, the equipment was obsolete and the list padded," he continued.

Thomas said the "isolated calls" for an early election before the completion of the new system, was "irresponsible, self serving and not in the best interest of all Grenadians.

"Every Grenadian needs to be given an opportunity to participate in a free and fair process of choosing a government," he said.

"I now wish to convey that, in my view, much progress has been made with our electoral preparation. Many Grenadians have responded to the call to be registered. This has contributed significantly to our state of readiness," he added.

Thomas said that on the naming of an election date, the Governor General's responsibility is to "promptly issue the relevant writ."

"When this is done, voter registration ceases immediately," he said.

The Grenadian leader said 2013, despite the lingering challenges, will "usher in some exciting possibilities.

"We will see the implementation of many programs and projects that we have been working on over the past four years,"

"These programs and projects constitute key elements of the foundation that we have laid for the growth and development of our beloved country," he added.

# N.Y. seals new state gun laws

ALBANY, N.Y. (AP) — New York lawmakers agreed to pass the toughest gun control law in the nation and the first since the Newtown, Conn., school shooting, calling for a stricter assault weapons ban and provisions to keep guns out of the hands of the mentally ill who make threats.

"This is a scourge on society," Gov. Andrew Cuomo said Monday night, six days after making gun control a centerpiece of his agenda in his State of the State address. The bipartisan effort was fueled by the Newtown tragedy that took the lives of 20 first graders and six educators. "At what point do you say, 'No more innocent loss of life'?"

The measure also calls for restrictions on ammunition and the sale of guns. It is expected to pass Tuesday.

"This is not about taking anyone's rights away," said Sen. Jeffrey Klein, a Bronx Democrat. "It's about a safe society ... today we are setting the mark for the rest of the county to do what's right."

Under current state law, assault weapons are defined by having two "military rifle" features, such as folding stock, muzzle flash suppressor or bayonet mount. The proposal would reduce that to one feature, includ-

ing the popular pistol grip. The language specifically targeted the military-style rifle used in the Newtown shootings.

Current owners of those guns will have to register them.

Private sales of assault weapons to someone other than an immediate family would be subject to a background check through a dealer. New Yorkers also would be barred from buying assault weapons over the Internet, and failing to safely store a weapon could lead to a misdemeanor

charge.

Ammunition magazines would be restricted to seven bullets, from the current 10, and current owners of higher-capacity magazines would have a year to sell them out of state. An owner caught at home with eight or more bullets in a magazine could face a misdemeanor charge.

Stores that sell ammunition will have to register with the state, run background checks on buyers of bullets and keep an electronic database of bullet sales.

In another provision, a therapist who believes a mental health patient made a credible threat to use a gun illegally would be required to report it to a mental health director who would have to notify the state. A patient's gun could be taken from him or her.

The legislation also increases sentences for gun crimes including the shooting of a first responder that Cuomo called the "Webster provision." Last month in the western New York town of Webster, two firefighters

# Incarceration, Cause and Consequence

a director of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, and directing the Centers for Disease Control to research gun violence.

But the president, speaking at White House ceremony, focused his attention on the divided Congress, saying only lawmakers could enact the most effective measures for preventing more mass shootings.

"To make a real and lasting difference, Congress must act," Obama said. "And Congress must act soon."

The president vowed to use "whatever weight this office holds" to press law-makers into action on his \$500 million plan. He is also calling for improvements in school safety, including putting 1,000 police officers in schools and bolstering mental health care by training more health professionals to deal with young people who may be at risk.

Even supportive lawmakers say the president's gun control proposals — most of

which are opposed by the powerful National Rifle Association — face long odds on Capitol Hill.

House Speaker John Boehner's office was noncommittal to the president's package of proposed legislation, but signaled no urgency to act. "House committees of jurisdiction will review these recommendations," Boehner spokesman Michael Steel said. "And if the Senate passes a bill, we will also take a look at that."

Senate Judiciary Committee Chairman Patrick Leahy said ahead of Obama's presentation that he didn't know whether an assault weapons ban could pass the Senate, but said there are some measures that can, such as improved background checks.

"There are some who say nothing will pass. I disagree with that," Leahy, D-Vt., told students at Georgetown University Law Center. "What I'm interested in is what we can get."

Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid, D-Nev., called Obama's package "thoughtful recommendations" and said the Senate would consider legislation addressing gun violence early this year.

"The tragedy at Sandy Hook was just the latest sad reminder that we are not doing enough to protect our citizens - especially our children - from gun violence and a culture of violence, and all options should be on the table moving forward," he said.

Republican National Committee Chairman Reince Priebus dismissed Obama's measures as "an executive power grab."

"He paid lip service to our fundamental constitutional rights," Priebus said of the president, "but took actions that disregard the Second Amendment and the legislative process."

Acknowledging the tough fight ahead, Obama said there will be pundits, politicians and special interest groups that will seek to "gin up fear" that the White House wants to take away the right to own a gun.

"Behind the scenes, they'll

do everything they can to block any commonsense reform and make sure nothing changes whatsoever," he said. "The only way we will be able to change is if their audience, their constituents, their membership says this time must be different, that this time we must do something to protect our communities and our kids."

The president was flanked by children who wrote him letters about gun violence in the weeks following the Newtown shooting. Families of those killed in the massacre, as well as survivors of the shooting, were also in the audience, along with law enforcement officers and congressional lawmakers.

"This is our first task as a society, keeping our children safe," Obama said. "This is how we will be judged."

Seeking to expand the impetus for addressing gun violence beyond the Newtown shooting, the president said more than 900 Americans have been killed by guns in the month since the elementary school massacre.

ment, while at the same time combating climate change.

At the launch, then President Bharrat Jagdeo called for a platform on which developing countries like Guyana are not seen as mere recipients of aid, but as equal partners in the search for climate solutions.

A low carbon economy is one where economic activities are geared to reduce the amount of carbon dioxide that would otherwise go into the atmosphere, and where other activities and lifestyles seek to minimise the effects of climate change.

About 80 percent of Guyana's forests, or some 15 million hectares, has remained untouched over time. An expert study commissioned by Guyana estimates that the country would earn some 580 million dollars annually if it were to engage in economic activities that could lead to the destruction of

the forests, but the economic value to the world, if these same forests were left standing, would be equivalent to 40 billion dollars.

Jagdeo has described Guyana's forests as a global asset, home to at least 8,000 plant and animal species that make it one of the most biodiverse areas in the world. The forests also act as a sink to absorb carbon dioxide, one of the greenhouse gases that contribute to global warming.

With the right low-deforestation economic incentives, Guyana would avoid emissions of 1.5 gigatonnes of CO2 a year.

Earlier this year, the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) approved an institutional strengthening project for Guyana's Low-Carbon Development Strategy. The approval means that nearly six million dollars will flow to Guyana for implementation, following an initial sum of 1.06 million dollars released to the country from Norway for preparatory work.

# Anniversary of the Haiti earthquake

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti (AP) — President Michel Martelly urged Haitians to recall the tens of thousands of people who lost their lives in a devastating earthquake three years ago, marking the disaster's anniversary Saturday with a simple ceremony.

Former U.S. president Bill Clinton joined Martelly later in the day for a similarly quiet wreath-laying commemoration.

"Haitian people, hand in hand, we remember what has gone," Martelly said in the morning as a gigantic Haitian flag flew at halfstaff before him on the front lawn of the former National Palace, a pile of tangled steel reinforcement bars nearby. "Hand in hand, we're remembering, we're remembering Jan. 12."

Martelly thanked other countries and international organizations for their help since the Jan. 12, 2010, disaster.

Clad in black, several dozen senior government officials gathered where the opulent white palace stood before it collapsed in the temblor and was later demolished. Foreign diplomats and Czech supermodel Petra Nemcova, earlier named by Martelly as one of Haiti's goodwill ambassadors, were also there.

In the speech, Martelly announced a government contest seeking designs for a monument to honor those who died in the quake. He also said the government

had just released a new construction code aimed at ensuring new buildings are seismically resistant in hopes of preventing the same kind of catastrophic damage in any future earthquake.

In the late morning, Clinton, the U.N. special envoy to Haiti, joined Martelly and Prime Minister Laurent Lamothe in placing a wreath at a mass burial site north of the capital of Port-au-Prince. None of the three spoke at the event.

Clinton expressed hope about Haiti's future in brief comments to reporters after the ceremony.

"I think that you will see, particularly in the economic sphere, a lot more in the coming year, where Haiti is projected to have the highest growth rate in the Caribbean," he said. "Well, we hope to speed up some of the infrastructure. We have to repair the agriculture and ... build a lot more houses. We've got to get those people out of those tents."

# Archeologist challenges Ponce de León myths

St. Augustine, FL - Jan. 14, 2013 -- As Florida celebrates 500 years in 2013, the world's leading light station and maritime museum, The St. Augustine Lighthouse & Museum is determined to set the record straight. There are many myths concerning Ponce de León's discovery of Florida. While some myths are entertaining and fun, some myths can be very confusing and misleading. And the Lighthouse's Director of Archaeology, Dr. Sam Turner wants to debunk a few of them.

"Many believe that Ponce de León sailed in search of the Fountain of Youth", said Dr. Turner, "Or that he sailed directly from Spain to what would one day soon be named Florida. Some believe that April 2 was the first sighting of the coast of Florida by Ponce de León and his crew when it actually was March 27,

1513. But maybe the biggest misconception would be that he landed in Melbourne Beach, Florida."

Dr. Turner is a maritime history expert and is currently working on writing a book about Ponce de León. He will begin a new series on Ponce De Leon and his La Florida 500th Anniversary Journey beginning Sunday, January 20 on the Lighthouse's website www. staugustinelighthouse.org.

Dr. Sam Turner studied history as an undergraduate student at Antioch College and took a master's degree in Nautical Archaeology at Texas A&M University. His doctorate is from King's College of the University of London in Spanish and Spanish-American Studies. He has lived in St. Augustine since 2006, doing research for the St. Augustine Lighthouse & Museum, a Smithsonian Institution Affiliations Program.

# T&T to elect new prez

A new president for Trinidad and Tobago will be elected next month. The Electoral College will meet to elect the new president.

The Electoral College comprises members of the House of Representatives and the Senate-which means that that a nominee is elected based on a simple government majority.

Minister for Communications Jamal Mohammed made the announcement during the first post-Cabinet news conference for the year at the Office of the Prime Minister, St. Clair, Port of Spain.

President George Maxwell Richards is expected to complete his second five-year term on March 17 and under the Constitution a president has to be elected at least 30 days before the term expires.

Mohammed said the election was being held in accordance with Section 26 (4) of the Constitution, which provides that an election "shall be held not more than 60 days or less than 30

days before the expiration of the term of that office."

He said the election must be held no sooner than Jan. 17 and no later than Feb. 18.

Mohammed said Speaker of the House of Representatives Wade Mark will inform members by letter of the meeting of the Electoral College.

"The speaker has recommended to the prime minister and Cabinet has duly noted that Friday, Feb. 15, 2013, is the date selected by the Speaker of the House for the convening of a meeting of the Electoral College for the election of a president of Trinidad and Tobago," he said

Richards was first elected on March 17, 2003, replacing President ANR Robinson. He was re-elected on March 2009, for a second term.

Richards previously served as principal of the St. Augustine Campus of the University of the West Indies (UWI) and was awarded the country's highest award - The Trinity Cross, as it was called in 2003.

T&T's first president under the Republican constitution was Sir Ellis Clarke, who served from Sept. 24, 1976 to March 19, 1987.

He was followed by President Noor Hassanali, who served from March 20, 1987 to March 17, 1997.

He was followed by Arthur NR Robinson, a former prime minister of T&T.

There is widespread speculation as to who will be elected as the names of several prominent citizens have surfaced.

were killed after responding to a fire set by the shooter, who eventually killed himself.

The measure passed the Senate 43-18 on the strength of support from Democrats, many of whom previously sponsored bills that were once blocked by Republicans. The Democrat-led Assembly gaveled out before midnight and planned to take the issue up at 10 a.m. Tuesday. It is expected to pass easily.

The governor confirmed the proposal, previously worked out in closed session, also would mandate a police registry of assault weapons, grandfathering in assault weapons already in private hands.

It was agreed upon exactly a month since the Sandy Hook Elementary School tragedy.

"It is well-balanced, it protects the Second Amendment," said Senate Republican leader Dean Skelos of Long Island.

Cuomo said he wanted quick action to avoid a run on assault weapons and ammunition. He estimates there are already about 1 million assault weapons in New York state.

Republican Sen. Greg Ball called that political opportunism in a rare criticism of the popular and powerful governor seen by his supporters as a possible candidate for president in 2016.

"We haven't saved any lives tonight,


except one: the political life of a governor who wants to be president," said Ball who represents part of the Hudson Valley. "We have taken an entire category of firearms that are currently legal that are in the homes of law-abiding, tax paying citizens. ... We are now turning those law-abiding citizens into criminals."

In the gun debate, one concern for New York is its major gun manufacturer upstate.

Remington Arms Co. makes the Bushmaster semi-automatic rifle that was used in the Connecticut shootings and again on Christmas Eve when the two firefighters were slain in Webster. The two-century-old Remington factory in Ilion in central New York employs 1,000 workers in a Republican Senate district

The bill was the first test of the new coalition in control of the Senate, which has long been run by Republicans opposed to gun control measures. The chamber is now in the hands of Republicans and five breakaway Democrats led by Klein, an arrangement expected to result in more progressive legislation.

Former Republican Sen. Michael Balboni said that for legislators from the more conservative upstate region of New York, gun control "has the intensity of the gay marriage issue." In 2011, three of four Republicans who crossed the aisle to vote for same-sex marriage ended up losing their jobs because of their votes.

# We're Not Broke

Last January, when our documentary film, "We're Not Broke," premiered at the Sundance Film Festival, we were elated. The film's message about how multinational corporations are cheating the American people out of desperately needed tax revenue to the tune of \$100 billion a year was sure to reach the masses. The night after it screened for the first time, we gathered around the television and watched President Obama's 2012 State of the Union address. Our jaws dropped. "No American company should be able to avoid paying its fair share of taxes by moving jobs and profits overseas," he said to a round of tepid congressional applause. "From now on, every multinational company should have to pay a basic minimum tax." It was as if our president had been at our film screening and was aghast from what he'd learned.

That speech was the last time we heard anything from The White House about making billion-dollar corporations pay their fair share. Obama campaigned in 2008 with the promise to close corporate tax loopholes. And as a U.S. senator from Illinois, he'd been a co-signer on Sen. Carl Levin's CUT Loopholes Act. But in his first four years as president, Obama made zero attempts to reign in the tax dodging of GE, Verizon, Apple, Pfizer or any of the biggest 300 companies that squirrel profits offshore to avoid paying income tax to the U.S. Treasury. While multinational corporations experienced

record profits, the American people suffered a recession that rivaled the great depression.

Last year saw the most public light ever shed tax inequality, with a big part of the Occupy Wall St. movement devoted to calling out tax dodgers. Still, Washington remained silent on changing the broken system. In mid-December, CEOs of the biggest multinationals came to the White House for closeddoor meetings. Two weeks later, a deal was drafted in the Senate, passed by Congress and signed by Obama that had a total of zero revenue from multinational corporations to help our staggering deficit.

The fact that the New Year's fiscal cliff avoidance package completely ignored any source of revenue from multinational tax dodgers is an abomination. With the country scrounging for revenue only from the very, very wealthy, this "deal" actually increases the deficit by \$4 trillion over the next decade. There wasn't a single mention of closing corporate tax loopholes, ending deferral (the practice that lets multinationals wait until they repatriate their profits to pay tax) or making them bring back the \$1.5 trillion they've been stockpiling untaxed during the past eight years. Nothing was mentioned about this enormous rip-off that leaves domestic business scrambling to compete while multinational corporations are laughing all the way to their shareholder meetings.

# Adjusting Pentagon Spending

### By John Adams

At year's end, everyone's eyes were on what is now known as the "fiscal cliff." At the eleventh hour, Congress came to a deal on taxes and unemployment, effectively holding off automatic budget cuts until this March. Now we will likely see a showdown on government spending.

With revenue largely off the table for future negotiating, we need to resolve our budget woes by putting the breaks on runaway government spending in a balanced, strategic way. Given that the Pentagon budget makes up more than half of all discretionary spending, smart savings there should be a key part of the solution to the current budget battle.

Rather than thinking incrementally, policymakers should rise to the challenge of adjusting our national security strategy by crafting a budget deal that funds programs based on their real contribution to our security. The Pentagon budget has grown

exponentially over the past decade with relatively little scrutiny while political battles have primarily focused on revenue and domestic spending. This does a disservice to both our economic and security needs.

Despite the winding down of two wars, the Pentagon still has the highest budget in real dollars since World War II. It's time to reexamine Pentagon spending with an eye towards our longterm strategic goals instead of allowing unnecessary or strategically marginal programs to continue to coast on their own momentum.

For example, we are current-

ly slated to spend \$640 billion over the next decade on a nuclear arsenal far larger than we need and more relevant to the Cold War than the threats we face today. The bloated nuclear budget includes a \$6 billion factory to produce new plutonium cores for nuclear bombs and a \$10 billion life extension program for the nuclear weapons deployed in Europe. Eliminating unnecessary nuclear programs will save billions of dollars that can then be invested in more effective defense programs.

Billions more will be spent on tanks the Army doesn't want and maintaining large numbers of troops in Europe to prevent an invasion from the now defunct Soviet Union.

A growing number of policy-makers agree that it's time for us to reshape the Pentagon budget to address our 21st century needs. Many fiscal conservatives elected in 2010 and re-elected this year

# Let's have more Cabinet Room diversity, please

Congressman Charlie Rangel was evidently in no mood for pulling punches the other day when he weighed in on the matter of picks the president had to that point made for his second-term cabinet. It was "embarrassing as hell," Rangel said. This was the congressman joining in pushback against the white male bias reflected in the choices Obama announced for state, defense, treasury and C.I.A. director. Parrying the mini assault, the president noted that it was early yet in the process of filling his cabinet slots. But, given the first term as precedent, raising a bit of a ruckus over these early indications may not have been all that indelicate or unjustified, albe-

it coming from Obama partisans.

The point surely couldn't be lost on any reasonable observer that upon his historic election in '08, fixation with a "black" presidency was precisely where Barack Obama's head didn't need to be. And, savvy operator that he is, no way was this president going there. But that being said, there's no reason that with respect to cabinet choices, the new president could not have followed the path first walked by Bill Clinton in his deter-

mination to have a cabinet "that looks like America" back in 1992.

As far as the inclusion of Blacks. although UN Ambassador Susan Rice and senior advisor Valerie Jarrett were given what are regarded as cabinet-rank positions, as "frontline" cabinet posts go, Attorney General Eric Holder has for the most part been the one publicly identifiable African American cabinet figure. By that vardstick, coming up being bested big time on the diversity front by George W. Bush's record on cabinet choices means effectively throwing folks into double-take territory... even allowing for the Bush selectees being "black" or "minority" with an asterisk.

Jarrett -- who is said to have the president's ear to a degree that might be the envy, reportedly, of other inner circle players - is probably a good bet to return for second-term duty. But curiosity naturally surrounds Rice, after all the hubbub the Benghazi incident generated and what it did to short-circuit the speculation about her being in line to succeed Hillary Clinton as secretary of state. She and Obama are supposedly close friends but one won-

ders, after a post-Benghazi trail that wasn't as smooth as it might have been (indeed quite bizarre, to be blunt about it), whether she will be retained as UN ambassador, whether she cares to be, or what other role, if any, she'll be asked to assume in Obama II.

Generally, though, Obama's first-tem showing on diversity, as it pertains to women, was one the administration didn't have much about which to be defensive...at least as far as high profile placements. Clearly out front in this regard would be the two Supreme Court vacancies the president filled. The elevation of Justices Sonia Sotomavor and Elena Kagan, in the process tripling the distaff component the Court has had since the 1980s, was bold, momentous action for which the president deserves credit, certainly not just from the women's lobby. Entrusting to Janet Napolitano (who is rumored to be a second

term holdover) what would normally be perceived as the typically male domain homeland security portfolio demonstrated uncommon Obama spunk as well.

One would imagine that, given the strategic role the Hispanic vote played in many parts of the country last November, to the president's and Democrats' advantage, he must be getting an earful about tangible manifestations of gratification for that support. Hilda Solis was the secretary of labor and the sole Hispanic in Obama's 15-member first term cabinet. If she's not returning, it's pretty safe to assume that the Hispanic element will be represented when they gather in the Cabinet Room for the first time in th new term.

And what of the African American presence in the new schematic? Truth be told, it's really no longer early in the timeline for revelation of names and assignments, as the president countered, with the Inauguration but a few days away. What's behind this unseemly delay in announcing the bulk of cabinet appointments? What's the buzz on Eric Holder — will he be back and whether or not he will be, has the president thought

to enhance the African American component among the 15 he designates as Cabinet Room regulars? There's second-term leverage here, some of which, if invested toward that end, would elicit a full-throated "Amen!" from a broad swath of the brethren.

Congressman Rangel, even if he jumped the gun a bit by popping off after a relatively small piece of the cabinet personnel mystery had been revealed, was definitely not alone in that discernible angst over how will the president be tracking, in terms of major appointments, in round two. Despite some on the Republican side brazenly acting like November's election results are not yet carved in stone, the president knows well that among the spoils of battle was shedding some of the first-term restraints that perhaps warranted treading gingerly on occasion. No more. And where better to project a robust new independence than in the cabinet, that special knot of men and women with whom he regularly counsels? Men and women of proven ability, obviously. But with first-term inhibitions put to rest, "looking like America" among the criteria would be pretty neat this time around.

agree that the "sacred cow" of Pentagon spending should be part of our budget solution. And late into the fiscal cliff debate, Secretary of Defense Leon Panetta pleaded with Congress to cut expenditures that "needlessly divert \$74 billion over the next decade into programs, equipment and activities we don't want or need."

Reshaping Pentagon spending to bring our national security strategy in line with 21st century needs will make us stronger in the long run. Frankly, we bog the military down when we let wasteful spending go unchecked as we are largely doing, once

There are those that claim that Pentagon spending should be immune to fiscal discipline, but this fails to consider the full picture of our national security. America's ability to compete in a global economy is our greatest asset. This requires that we equally invest in job creation and education as well as the traditional elements of

defense.

A strong economy benefits our troops as well. We can best support our service personnel serving throughout the world by investing in 21st century capabilities, not Cold-War relics.

The budget showdown should be the push that we need for both parties to work to develop a more effective national security strategy today.

There is a growing consensus for adjusting our spending priorities to address 21st century challenges and the Pentagon budget should remain on the table in the year ahead. Our national security tomorrow depends on policymakers making smart and strategic budget decisions sooner rather than later.

# 2012 Carnival winners receive their awards

The West Indian American Day Carnival Association wrapped up its 2012 season recently with an Awards ceremony at Brooklyn Borough Hall. The newly minted president since last April, Thomas Bailey, only the third in the 45-year history of the Association, led the ceremonies. 

In a statement to the House of Representatives last week Warner said from the beginning of 2010 to the end of 2012, murder had declined by 26 percent; wound-

ing by 18 percent; breaking and robbery by 26 percent; fraud offences by 45 percent; general larceny by 11 percent; larceny of vehicles



by 41 percent and larceny from dwelling house by 14 percent.

He said the statistics were provided by the Crime and Problem Analysis unit of the Police Service.

Warner pointed out that the figures for 2012 were lower than those of 2011, not-withstanding the fact that there was a state of emergency in 2011. He said there were 1,221 serious reported crimes by November 2011, while there were 1,1184 by November 2012.

He said in 2012 there were 377 murders compared to 354 in 2011.

The National Security Minister promised this year there will be more police vehicles, a sustained police presence, visibility and

enforcement.

### Dominica

Dominica will have access to EC\$50 mil-

lion under the European Union Banana Accompanying Measures (BAM) during the first quarter of this year,



Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Agriculture, Samuel Carette, said the funds had been allocated to Dominica over a three -year period.

"Government is embracing collaborative approaches in charting a course for the transformation of the agricultural sector,' he said, noting that some people have been advocating for the government "to implement the same prescriptions administered over the past 40 years and of course they expect change in the sector."

He said the loss of the market preferences in Europe and the support mechanism from the European Union "which supported the production and export infrastructure seems to be really a distant past."

# 'THRIVE' competition to support immigrant entrepreneurs

The New York City Economic Development Corporation (NYCEDC), Deutsche Bank Americas Foundation, Garfield Foundation, and the Lawrence N. Field Center for Entrepreneurship at Baruch College on Friday, Jan. 11 announced the second annual Competition To Help Reach Immigrant Ventures and Entrepreneurs (THRIVE).

Competition THRIVE seeks to generate proposals for programs to assist immigrant entrepreneurs in starting, operating, and expanding their businesses in New York City. Community groups, businesses, and other organizations from the public and private sectors submit proposals for programs that address challenges faced by immigrant entrepreneurs, which commonly include access to credit, financial management, language barriers, and access to business networks. Proposals are reviewed by a panel of judges comprised of business and non-profit leaders, representatives from New York City government and academics. The panel will select five finalists to receive \$25,000 of seed funding to pilot their program for six months. After the six month pilot, the judges select the

winning program based on scalability and sustainability. The winning program receives \$100,000 to further implement their program.

The first year of the competition was such a success that the Maytree Foundation's Cities of Migration initiative has recognized Competition THRIVE as part of an international showcase of excellence and innovation in urban integration practice. Due to its success last year, the competition has been renewed for a second year. While the first

year of the Competition was primarily focused on soliciting ideas from Community Based Organizations, in the second year, NYC-EDC intends to broaden the applicant base by conducting significant outreach to organizations including banks, industry groups, chambers of commerce, foreign diplomatic organizations, tech companies, and private sector organizations and businesses.

"New York City has long gained strength from its immigrant population, and

the purpose of Competition THRIVE is to ensure the City's immigrant entrepreneurs will continue to contribute to our economic growth," said New York City Economic Development Corporation President Seth W. Pinsky. "Thanks to the success of last year's competition, we have redoubled our efforts and expanded the competition for a second year. I look forward this year's program and the opportunity to solicit new and innovative ideas from the private sector that will support the next generation of immigrant entrepreneurs in New York City."

"The first round of Competition THRIVE demonstrated that investing in our City's immigrant entrepreneurs and small business owners is a smart way to fuel economic growth and create more jobs for all New Yorkers," said Commissioner of the Mayor's Office of Immigrant Affairs Fatima Shama. # Community leaders take a stand on violence

In honor of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s legacy of non-violence, a coalition of community leaders and notables will come together Monday in Manhattan to launch the fourth annual Peace Week at 11:00 a.m. and hold a news conference in the wake of the recent tragic loss of life in Newtown, CT. Included in the group are activist Erica Ford, Cheryl "Salt" Wray,

NYC Council members Leroy Comrie, Ruben Wills, Jumaane D. Williams and Terrie M. Williams.

The organization, LIFE Camp, Inc., which enjoys programmatic support from the likes of Russell Simmons, Deepak Chopra, Amare Stoudemire, and Cheryl "Salt" Wray, works to promote the value of LIFE and to reduce teen violence. At the press conference Ford, LIFE Camp

Inc. founder Wray and Terrie M. Williams, renowned public relations practitioner, psychotherapist, author and mental health advocate will announce a series of events designed to create a culture of peace throughout NYC for seven days, as well as a three-year violence prevention pilot program the group will be running.

Peace Week 2013 is designed to combat the challenges facing young people in New York City, where Black children are killed regularly. Homicide is the leading cause of death among youth, one in 10 teens are not going to school because they feel unsafe at or on their way to school and many youth don't expect to survive beyond the next five years.

At the press conference, details of LIFE Camp's Love My LIFE Violence Intervention & Prevention (VIP) Program will be disseminated. The VIP program is a three year pilot project targeting 13- to 25-year-old South Jamaica, Queens teens and young adults, families who have been touched by violence-related tragedies and service providers handling the aftermath of such incidents. The project is designed to fundamentally change how interpersonal violence is experienced, perceived and man-

aged to assist in eradicating the reasons for youth gun violence.

LIFE Camp, Inc. was founded by Ford in 2002 to teach violence prevention in schools, following the tragic murders of two community children. The organization has since expanded its role to also generate empowerment opportunities for youth who are educationally, economically and socially disadvantaged.

Guyana's REDD+ (Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and Forest Degradation) Investment Fund, dubbed GRIF, was established in October 2010 in order to fund projects of the country's low-carbon strategy.

The project will strengthen the technical and administrative capacity of those institutions responsible for implanting the strategy, and develop an MRV (Monitoring, Reporting and Verification) system on a national level.

The partnership between Norway and Guyana is the second-biggest REDD+ partnership in the world, according to the Guyanese government.

Martin pointed out that there are arrangements with the World Bank, the Organization of American States (OAS), other financial institutions and the United Nations that could allow Caribbean countries to earn financing as a result of their climate change resilience activities.

"They could value their natural resources on the basis of their sequestration of CO2 and then convert that sequestration property into hard cash, as Guyana is doing, or convert it into expanded negotiating room on debt reduction and expanded negotiating room on getting more concessionary loans," he said.

President and founder of the Dominica-based Waitkbuli Ecological Foundation, Bernard Wiltshire, an attorney, agrees that a new way of thinking is necessary. He told IPS that Caribbean countries now need to build "appropriate industries" and get involved in "the right kind of tourism", for example.

"Dominica could have a tourism industry that could far outstrip Antigua. Antigua has the sun, sand and sea and so on, but Dominica has the sea and in addition to that it has a lot more than Antigua," Wiltshire said.

"Everybody is saying sun, sand and sea are what you need for tourism and are ignoring nature tourism, adventure tourism, heritage tourism and wellness tourism," he said.

"These things are growing. Just slouching, drinking rum under a palm tree — that is going out of fashion. The tourism industry in the Caribbean is going downhill because we are competing with the larger countries. Tourists are going farther afield, they want more adventurous things," Wilshire added.

ast Asia and the jungles of Burma as new hotspots, adding that "Dominica has its own Caribbean jungle right here" and could attract thousands of people who are looking for a jungle adventure.

Martin lamented that a region like the Caribbean, with so many extraordinary opportunities, has such financially strapped economies.

"You have countries with national annual budgets of 600 million dollars. If you can draw down in a year or two years half of that or even more from converting the silent work of your natural systems into hard dollars from the international financial community, you are home free," he told IPS.

# What you need to fight the flu and common

Decongestants like pseudoephedrine (PSE) relieve a stuffy nose and congestion by actually narrowing the blood vessels in nasal passages so you can breathe more easily.

PSEs are now located behind the pharmacy counter because they are an ingredient that can be used to make the illegal drug methamphetamine (meth). Rest assured though, PSE has been safely used for decades.

If you're clogged up, consider treating your symptoms and doing your part to keep your community safer at the same time. Ask your pharmacist about new Nexafed 30mg pseudoephedrine HCl tablets, the next-generation PSE that provides the same effective cold



Not only that, eating right and getting exercise can boost your mood, make you feel younger, and give you an overall better outlook on life.

Whether you're looking to drop those extra pounds, or maintain a healthy weight as you age, keep these guidelines in mind:

• Avoidance of entire food groups or excessive consumption of others isn't healthy, realistic or sustainable. Why? Carbohydrates, fats and proteins play necessary and unique functions within our bodies and supply different nutrients crucial for health.

• Ditch wasteful calories that come from foods that are nutritionally void -- think processed and overly packaged foods, refined, flour products, all things fried or covered in creamy goop, sports drinks and other beverages with added sugar. Bottom line: eat real food.

• About half of your diet should be fruits and vegetables. Enjoy healthy fats in moderation and avoid saturated and trans fat. When eating meat, make it lean.

# SNACKING DOESN'T HAVE TO BE UNHEALTHY

nacking often elicits mixed reviews. Some health plans say that it is important to eat several small meals or snacks during the day to keep metabolism rates in check. •Edamame: These are a variety of soybeans that are sweeter, larger, and more easily digested than other soybeans. They are a natu-

ral source of antioxidants and isoflavones.

•Banana and chocolate: Rolling a banana in semisweet chocolate chips can satisfy a fruit and chocolate craving.

•Dark chocolate bark: Melt dark chocolate and add a desired fruit, such as dried cranberries, cherries, or raisins. Enjoy a small piece, which will be high in antioxidants, to fend off hunger pangs.

Another eye disease that can be aided by early detection which is the leading cause of blindness in the United States is Age-related Macular Degeneration. In the Age-related Degeneration Study, known as AREDS, it was shown that vitamins containing zinc, Vitamins A, C and E help significantly decrease the incidence of macular degeneration. In the second phase of this study known as AREDS 2, fish oil, has been added to the trial's vitamins. Dr. Fell is a specialist in the treatment of medical diseases of the retina. She treats patients with wet macular degeneration with multiple and different injections known to stop the progression of this disease.

Patients often ask what they can do to prevent eye disease. Eating healthy foods, exercising regularly, not indulging in cigarette smoking and visiting your doctors regularly is the best way to start. Early detection of any disease and prevention of disease is often the best way to stay healthy.

Taking fish oils, specifically omega-3 fatty acids in a triglyceride form has been shown to reduce heart disease, atherosclerotic disease and cholesterol levels. They have also been shown to improve joint function, hair and skin. They have been shown to help decrease the incidence of dry eyes and improve blepharitis, a chronic condition in which there is constant eyelid crusting and inflammation. They are also thought to help decrease the incidence of macular degeneration.

## Fight allergies with the help of Dr. Gadi Avshalomov

In the United States 40 to 50 million people suffer from allergy-related illnesses.

"The allergic condition can take on many different forms," says Dr. Gadi Avshalomov, an allergy specialist in Mill Basin. "Allergies may be present as nasal or sinus problems, asthma, eczema, hives, or even a life-threatening anaphylactic

reaction. Now more than ever, the patient's battle with allergies has to be addressed on all fronts."

To ease allergic symptoms, you first need to get to the root of the problem. Dr. Avshalomov performs the highest standards of testing and diagnosis, right at the office. A simple skin prick test, which is performed by pricking the skin with a bit of an allergen and waiting to see if a

hive develops, can provide the answers in about 20 minutes, says the doctor.

The results will reveal what specific allergens you are allergic to, be it dust mites, pets, pollen, mold or foods. Being allergic can result in conditions such as chronic congestion, a runny nose, eczema, sinusitis, and even asthma.

If you suffer from seasonal allergies, the doctor can ascertain what specific pollens have an effect on you.

"It's like detective work," says Dr. Avshalomov. "You break it down to what is causing the problem, and formulate a treatment plan."

Some patients can be treated with medication. Others may need immunotherapy, injections with a bit of the allergen to "desensitize them and stop the allergic reaction in their bodies," says the doctor. This treatment allows patients to get on with their lives and be part of the great outdoors. If you have a pet but develop an allergy to its dander, with injections, you may possibly be able to live with it again. The results are that good.

"The success rate is over 75 percent," says the doctor.

Often people come to him after they have tried a variety of over-the-counter remedies, which haven't helped. Dr. Avshalomov refers to these medications as Band-Aids.

"The only effective treatment is removal of allergen, when possible, and desensitization (allergy shots)," he says.

"Nothing is ever generic or one-size-fits-all. Everyone has a unique reaction to allergens, so everyone needs a unique treatment regimen." Once he knows exactly what people are allergic

to, he creates custom-made allergy shots to meet their specific needs.

There are many theories as to why allergies are so prevalent, says the doctor. Living in an urban environment, like Brooklyn, is one factor, he says, as we are exposed to large amounts of dust mites, cockroaches, mice and molds. Other factors include genetics, human migration, and hygiene.

Interestingly, he says that modern medicine has also contributed to creating some conditions. "Once upon a time, people with asthma used to die," he says. "Now, thank God, they're living full lives, but they're passing the problem down to the next generation."

Dr. Avshalomov is board-certified to treat both adults and children. He specializes in the treatment of asthma and allergies. As a specialist in immunology, he deals with all disorders of the immune system, including sinus infections, pneumonia, and bronchitis.

"We offer the most current, scientifically-approved treatment in the field," he says. Most major medical plans are accepted.

The doctor studied medicine at Tel Aviv University Medical in Israel. He has done specialty training at North Shore Long Island Jewish Hospital and at Schneider's Children's Hospital. In addition to his private practice, he is an assistant professor at Schneider's Children's Hospital.



# SIMPLE WAYS TO REDUCE FATIGUE

### Alter your eating habits

If you're a proponent of three large meals per day but are battling fatigue, then it might be time to alter your eating habits. # Do you know your risk of stroke?

aking the time to answer a few questions may help to reduce vour risk of stroke. Stroke is the number three cause of death of Americans and is a leading cause of dis-

This year, it will strike 700,000 Americans of all ages, genders and ethnicities. A member of your family, a friend or neighbor — or even you — could be a victim.

Many Americans are not aware of their stroke risk factors, many of which can be prevented or controlled. You can start to take control by knowing what factors put you at risk. Check all that apply to you.

• Age: For every decade after age 55, your chance of stroke doubles.

Your mother, father, sister, brother or grandparent had a stroke, or your father or brother had a heart attack before age 55, or your mother or sister had a heart attack before age 65.

•Previous stroke or transient ischemic attack: You have had a stroke or transient ischemic attack ("ministroke").

•Blood pressure: Your blood pressure is 140/90 mm Hg or higher (high blood pressure), a healthcare professional has said your blood pressure is high, your blood pressure is 120/80 to 139/89 mm Hg (prehypertension), or you don't know what your blood pressure is.

**history:** people who smoke tobacco regularly.

> ·Diabetes: You have diabetes (a fasting blood sugar reading of 126 mg/ dL or higher), you need medicine to control your blood sugar, or you have been told you have an impaired ability to control your blood sugar (a fasting blood sugar reading greater than 100 mg/dL).

•Total cholesterol: Your cholesterol is 240 mg/ dL or higher, or you don't know your level.

•HDL cholesterol: Your HDL — or "good" cholesterol — is less than 40 mg/dL, or you don't know your HDL cholesterol levels.

•Physical activity: • Tobacco smoke: You Your physical activity 30 minutes on most days.

·Carotid or other artery disease: You have been told you have disease in the carotid arteries (the blood vessels that supply blood to the brain) or you have peripheral artery disease (primarily affects blood vessels of the legs).

·Certain blood disorders: You have been told

you have a high red blood cell count or sickle cell disease (also called sickle cell anemia).


•Atrial fibrillation: You have a heart rhythm disorder called atrial fibrillation.

•Other heart disease: You have coronary heart disease or other heart condition(s), or you have had a heart attack.

If one or more of these choices apply to you, studies show you are at increased risk for stroke. See a healthcare provider for a complete assessment of your risks.

# Bahamian woman pleads guilty to alien-smuggling

The United States Department of Justice says that a Peruvian national and a Bahamian national have pleaded guilty to smuggling undocumented migrants to the United States for private financial gain.

Assistant Attorney General Lanny A. Breuer of the Justice Department's Criminal Division said that Jessie Katherine Gonzales Urquizo, 37, a Peruvian national, and Irene Mildred Janette Burrows, 66, a Bahamian national, pleaded guilty to the charge.

Breuer said Urquizo pleaded guilty to three counts and Burrows pleaded guilty to two counts, before U.S. District Court Judge Kenneth A. Marra in the Southern District of Florida, of bringing and attempting to bring aliens to the United States for commercial advantage and private financial gain.

According to the plea documents, Urquizo and her mother-in-law, Burrows, "facilitated the illegal smuggling of Brazilian nationals into the United States by working for a known alien smuggler in Brazil."

It said Urquizo and Burrows provided lodging and transportation to undocumented migrants waiting on a boat to take them to the United States and charged between US\$100 and US\$125 per day.

The court documents said Urquizo and Burrows received instructions from Brazil-based smugglers on when and where to deliver certain undocumented migrants to waiting boats for passage to the United States.

"Urquizo and Burrows admitted that they brought undocumented migrants, all of whom are Brazilian nationals, to the United States for financial gain," Breuer said.

# Venezuela publishes decree with Chavez signature

CARACAS, Venezuela (AP) — Venezuela's government has published a decree signed by President Hugo Chavez, while his vice president said Wednesday that the ailing leader also sent a message of gratitude to the military for its loyalty.

It was the first time the president's signature has appeared in the Official Gazette since his latest cancer surgery in Cuba more than five weeks ago. The decree issued Tuesday and published in the government newspaper on Wednesday names former vice president Elias Jaua as Venezuela's new foreign minister. The signature is printed along with the presidential stamp.

Current Vice President Nicolas Maduro, who has been in charge of the country during Chavez's recovery, announced Jaua's appointment at a National Assembly session on Tuesday.

Chavez has not made any public comments since his operation last month, his fourth in 18 months. He has been fighting an unspecified type of pelvic cancer, and his silence has fed speculation about his medical condition.

Before the decree was published, the opposition had questioned the legality of the new foreign minister's appointment, citing a lack of publicly released documents with Chavez's signature.

The opposition has also been demanding more information about the president's condition.

"If the president of the republic can sign decrees, I call on him to appear, speak to Venezuela and talk about everything that's happening in that government," top opposition leader Henrique Capriles said Wednesday.

In a televised speech to soldiers, Maduro recalled meeting with Chavez in Havana earlier this week, saying the president was pleased with how his allies have been working togeth-

"We were with the commander in chief 48 hours ago, and yesterday we spoke with Minister Jorge Arreaza (Chavez's son-in-law), and he really feels great happiness to see, when we described how we've been interacting, the work we're doing constantly," Maduro said.

"He told us to transmit to the Bolivarian National Armed Force, from his heart, all his gratitude for so much loyalty from you all."

The government says Chavez is being treated for "respiratory deficiency," but it remains unclear how much longer he could remain in hospital in Cuba.



# Haitians mark earthquake anniversary

It was as if the Haitian Diaspora had taken over Brooklyn Borough Hall, at least for the evening of Jan. 10 when at times, those attending one of the two different Haitian events happening simultaneously, co-mingled in the Hall's staircase-framed marble lobby.

An interfaith gathering organized by International Humanitarian Outreach Ministries (IHOM, Inc), for an evening of hope, healing and remembrance marking the Haitian earthquake's third anniversary, began with a reception. Representatives

from the faith community, HALEFO, and a wide swath from the Haitian professional and political community greeted each other before the ceremonial part of the evening took place in the formal court chambers upstairs.

Among those in attendance was a former president of Haiti, the 48th. The first woman in Haitian history to hold that office, Ertha Pascal-Trouillot, provisional President of Haiti from March 1990 to early February 1991, visiting from Haiti, paid tribute along with local diplomats and metro-New York denizens.

Meanwhile the organization,

community2Community(C2C), with representatives from numerous Brooklyn community organizations at info tables circling the main floor multimedia room, held a different kind of commemorative event. A kind of town hall celebrated with a progress report: Three Years Later, Building Forward Together.

C2C was founded and is directed by Marie-Yolaine Eusebe who emigrated from Haiti when she was five years old. Following the earthquake, Eusebe quit her job as a marketing executive at American Express to work for significant change in Haiti, targeting her father's home town area of Petit Goave. Initially she focused on access to drinkable water—C2C's first project, a complete water system in Piton Vallue, Petit Goâve, utilizing a team of local volunteers.

Subsequently, C2C also distributed 25,000 aqua tabs for water purification and provided a one-day training for cholera prevention.

An informative video shown at the Boro Hall event illustrated how this non-profit service organization works on the ground, partnering with local residents.

Additionally, now there are 15 latrines, when before C2C, there were none.

Marie-Yolaine is especially conscious to get together to meet different partners, find out who is working on the ground in order to better engage with each other. "It's the people that are keeping us in Haïti." Both the Diaspora and in the homeland.

C2C is a bridge. Eusebe notes, "Folks approach us all the time to help out in different areas," she says. "Some are part of the Haitian Diaspora and are interested in going back home, or they've never been 'home' and aren't sure how to embark on such a journey."



# **Hundreds pay tribute to Monte Burke**

Hundreds of mourners on Jan. 2 paid their last respect to Guyanese-born baritone extraordinaire Monte Burke, who died on Dec. 27 after a brief illness. He was 85.


Mourners at Fenimore Street United Methodist Church paid tributes in songs, words and musical instruments to the man, who they said was also a jazz singer, "fashion statement" and role model for the younger generation.

"Monte embraced the new commandment of Jesus Christ – 'Love One Another,'" said the Guyanese-born Rev. Dr. William Lloyd Andries in his eulogy.

"He was kind and always willing to help others," he added. "His charismatic and vivacious personality permeated the surroundings. He respected everyone, and this was reciprocal.

"He was a role model for younger men," Father Andries continued. "He was open-minded. He captured

many audiences. Monte was a jazz connoisseur. He was an evangelist by virtue of his contribution. He had done a marvelous work while he was here."

Opera singer Juanita Faulkner, who paid tribute to Burke with "Panis Angelicus" and "The Holy City," said she "had the privilege to sing with Monte many, many times.

"Monte was not intimidated," she said. "We'd do roman-

tic duets. In stature, he was short, but I thought he was singing to a 7 ft. giant."

Educator Dr. Marguerite Thompson, president of the Allied Association of Guyana, U.S.A., of which Burke was an active member, read a proclamation, describing him as a "community person" and "a lion."

Yet, she said he was "one of the most humble peoples" she'd ever met, adding that there wasn't a "Silent Supper" at Fenimore Street United Methodist Church without him. Dr. Thompson and Burke were prominent members of the church.

"This man made it when there were not many Black men in banking," Thompson said. "He was honorable. He's resting in peace because he'd worked hard for his family."

Vincentian Registered Nurse Cynthia Grant, president of the Chancel Choir at Fenimore Street United Methodist Church, of which Burke was a member, said members will especially remember him during "Silent Supper."

She added that Burke was always "impeccably dressed."

Guyanese lawyer and community activist Colin Moore said it would be a "travesty of justice" if he did not pay tribute to Burke, who he met 25 years ago at the People's Cathedral, where he did a rendition of the "Allelujah Chorus."

"Not only was he a great vocalist, but he was a talented individual," he said. "He had a very extensive personality. Monte was a very sharing personality.


"Monte had hope of Job," Moore added. "Monte, you have fought a good fight."



The apostle Paul, at the end of a glorious spiritual marathon exclaimed: "I have fought a good fight. I have finished the course. I have kept the faith. Henceforth, there is reserved for me a crown of righteousness which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall gave me at that day". [2 Timothy 4:7-8]

Ewart, I have looked on, with bated breath, as you have run this magnificent marathon. It is a journey that began in the sleepy hamlet of Vryheid in New Amsterdam, Berbice, where you attended your father's elementary school and learnt the fundamentals of arithmetic, algebra and geometry which you later developed to perfection.

The marathon continued at Queens College in Georgetown, where you won the Guyana scholarship in 1959, and became one of the first Guyana scholars to have earned distinctions in all three science subjects - Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics.

In 1960 you won a UCWI open scholarship and proceeded to the Mona campus of the University of the West Indies where you graduated in 1963 with first class honors in mathematics.

The marathon continued at St. Johns College in Cambridge, U.K. where you were awarded the PhD in statistics in 1967. Your dissertation involved the

creation of a mathematical model of the brain.

The marathon culminated at the University of California at Stanford where vou became Professor of Mathematical Psychology in 1974, then chairman of the Department of Psychology at Stanford the largest psychology department in the world. In 1988 you became dean of the School of the Humanities and Sciences, the first person of African ancestry ever to achieve this feat. In 1989 UWI granted you an honorary Doctorate of Laws for being the most outstanding student in the quarter century since your graduation in 1963.

As you continue your magnificent marathon, I tip my hat in tribute to a great Berbician, a famous Guyanese, a celebrated West Indian, a renowned alumni of Queens College, an illustrious alumni of the University of the West Indies, a mathematical genius, an outstanding scholar, teacher and administrator.

In spite of his monumental academic achievements Ewart Thomas remains at heart "a simple country boy" without the hubris and affectations so often found in Afro-Saxon academics. He is a "people's person" who has become a friend and confidant to the Caribbean community at Stanford. When asked by a reporter why he was so famous on campus, Ewart replied, in his usual selfdeprecating and unpretentious manner, "Because I throw the best fetes on campus"

One day when this marathon is completed I have no doubt that the Creator will meet Ewart at the Pearly gates, and confer on him that blessed crown of which St. Paul spoke, and greet him with the words, "Come ye blessed of my

father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundations of the world."

[Matthew 25:34]

It is a serious travesty of justice that, in spite of his outstanding academic credentials, the University of the West Indies, his alma mater, has not seen fit to appoint him as Vice-Chancellor. It is even more pathetic that the University of Guvana, a second-rate academic institution, has not seen fit to appoint this first-rate Guyanese scholar as its Vice-Chancellor. I can only hope that President Barack Obama, who has often spoken of the need for minorities to do well in mathematics and sciences, would appoint this outstanding black scholar as Presidential Advisor in Mathematics and Science at the U.S. Department of Education, where he would be an inspirational role model to young Black and Hispanic students in the United States.





The 17 minute monologue from the nation's capital called for an end to racism in America.

"I have a dream that one day this nation will rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed, 'We hold these truths to be selfevident; that all men are created equal'," Dr. King explained during the March on Washington, Aug. 1963.

That year Dr. MLK was named Man of the Year by Time Magazine.

The following year he was named the youngest person ever awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. At the end of the speech, King reportedly, departed from his prepared text and partly improvised his message on the theme of "I have a dream."

According to Wikipedia. the speech was ranked the top American speech of the 20th century by a 1999 poll of scholars of public address.

"The King Center's challenge to people of all nations is to begin a new era of nonviolent conflict reconciliation bringing people together across racial, religious, political and cultural divisions in keeping with Dr. King's vision of the essential unity of all people," she added.

# 'Circumstances' - A play about choices



# Sean Penn shines in crime saga about legendary mobster

Mickey Cohen (Sean Penn) was born and raised in Brooklyn where he started out as a prizefighter before moving to Chicago during Prohibition to become an enforcer for Al Capone. In the Forties, he was sent by Meyer Lansky to Los Angeles to establish extortion, gambling, prostitution and loan shark operations on behalf of the Jewish Mafia.

Mickey gradually began to make inroads, which didn't sit well with LA Police Chief Bill Parker (Nick Nolte) who was determined to prevent any crime syndicate from gaining a foothold in his city. But that would prove easier said than done since the vicious mobster had already succeeded in bribing and/or intimidating many cops, judges and powerful politicians.

Given the frightening degree of corruption, Parker decided that the only way to bring down Mickey was to behave just as ruthlessly. So, he asked one of his most fearless officers, Sergeant John O'Mara (Josh Brolin), to form a top secret team whose mission would be to enforce the law by breaking it.

For, the so-called Gangster Squad's mission was simply to enter each of Cohen's establishments anonymously in order to break kneecaps and generally trash the place. Of course, if any of O'Mara's goons were killed or captured, the Commissioner would have to disavow any knowledge of their actions.

Thus unfolds Gangster Squad, a stylized costume drama with

far more charm than one would ordinarily expect to find in an oldfashioned shoot 'em up. Directed by Ruben Fleisher (Zombieland), the film is based on the clever Paul Lieberman best-seller of the same name.

The production was blessed with an A-list cast which includes Sean Penn, Ryan Gosling, Josh Brolin, Emma Stone, Nick Nolte, Anthony Mackie, Giovanni Ribisi, Michael Pena, Robert Patrick and Mireille Enos. Therefiore, there are no throwaway roles here, with even lesser characters benefitting from development as a consequence of veteran thespians putting their all into their performances.

As a result, you come to care not only about whether or not Mickey will ever be brought to justice, but about surprisingly-engaging subplots involving a lawman (Gosling) going gaga over the gangsta's moll (Stone), and about a pregnant wife's (Enos) worry about whether her gung-ho hubby's (Brolin) will live long enough to witness his baby's birth. Nevertheless, the front story does feature all the staples of the genre, from flashy Zoot suits to Tommy guns to street smart dialogue mixing slang and savoir faire in a manner reminiscent of Damon Runyon.

Wambach led the Olympic tournament with five goals as the U.S. went undefeated and untied; in fact, the U.S. finished 2012 with the best record among women's national teams, 28-1-3, as Wambach scored 27 goals.

The tall, solidly built forward carried the U.S. many times, scoring the winning goals on numerous occasions. Although teammate Alex Morgan scored one more goal (28) than Wambach last year, Morgan was the first to admit that it was "Wambach's selfless off-the-ball work, aerial battling and off-field mentorship..." that aided her success. It was Wambach who twice scored to pull the U.S. even in that memorable 2011 World Cup final that went into double overtime.

Now 32, and after scoring 152 international goals, second only to Mia Hamm (158), Wambach's amazing career is obviously nearing its end; she may survive the very competitive U.S. team and could be around for the 2015 World Cup in Canada, but that is no guarantee. She has not won a World Cup, so maybe a World Cup ring could be the impetus to keep on kicking until 34, at least for another two or three more years.
