# DOLLAR SCHEME REVIEW

## Let CARICOM scrutinize economic citizenship applicants

With their banana and sugar export industries having collapsed and revenues from tourism fluctuating yearly, the governments of the Eastern Caribbean sub grouping have been looking for additional ways to bring in state revenues.

Revenues have also declined because of their membership in the 15-nation single market free trade system, meaning that goods manufactured in the region enter ports largely duty free so little or no taxes

The result is that most of the independent nations in the nine-nation sub region have turned to selling citizenship and local passports for a fee to supplement revenue shortfalls from the disappearance of banana and sugar.

But the highly lucrative Citizenship by Investment Program (CIP) came under unprecedented scrutiny recently when CBS's award-winning 60 Minutes program aimed an exten-

## SVG ex-teachers honor nurse Bramble

The Brooklyn-based St. Vincent and the Grenadines Ex-Teachers' Association of New York on Sunday honored retired Registered Nurse Celia Bramble at a gala ceremony marking the group's 34th anniversary.

The group also used the occasion to commemorate the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, which was actually celebrated on Monday, a public holiday in the United States.

"Congratulations to our honoree, Colonel Celia Bramble, a stalwart hardworking member of our community," said Jackson Farrell, the group's La Croix-born president, about Bramble, who is also a retired officer in the United States Army Reserve. "Her titles are highly deserved. We wish her good health and prosperity as she continues her endeavors in serving the Diaspora."

Bramble - who worked for the sprawling Kings County Hospital Center in Brooklyn, as part of New York City Health and Hospitals Corporation, for more than four decades - said she was "truly honored to receive this honor," stating that she accepted it with "a great sense of humility.

"The greatest award/reward is to know you've made a significant difference in someone's life," she said, stating that she was proud to have been affiliated with the Health and Hospitals Corporation and the US military, where, she said, she developed much of her teaching and leadership skills.

In an exclusive, post-ceremony interview, Bramble, the lone honoree, told Caribbean Life that "the glory and the honor belong to God.

"I have only done that which I have been ordained by Him to do," she said. "He has granted me the skills, ability and fortitude to be a blessing to others, so I use them to His honor and glory.

"To be honored by teachers is a special blessing because of the role they play in their everyday lives," she added. "They challenge, inspire, mentor, nurture, assess, and they evaluate. Who

then is better able to determine when a job is done well. I guess my evaluation was favorable, hence the reason they recognized me.

"It is also a great honor to be recognized during this historical period the eve of the birthday of the late civil rights leader, the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., as well as at a time when power and leadership of this great nation have been transferred from one Commander-in-Chief (Barack Obama) to the other (Donald Trump)," Bramble continued. "I will always remember this great honor that has bestowed upon me by Teachers."

The St. Vincent and the Grenadines Ex-Teachers' Association of New York also recognized three nationals whom they said have been very supportive over the years: Leonie Conliffe, wife of the group's public relations officer, Edward Conliffe; Donna Collis; and Morrison Matthias.

Bramble said she began her nursing career at the then Colonial Hospital in Kingstown, the Vincentian capital, renamed the Milton Cato Memorial Hospital, and migrated to the US shortly thereafter for an opportunity to advance her nursing career.

She graduated from C.W. Post College, Long Island University, where she received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing, and the prestigious Columbia University in New York City, where she received Master of Arts and Master of Education degrees in nursing.

Bramble also holds certification in Nursing Education and Staff Development from the American Nurses Credentialing Center. She is featured in the International WHO'S WHO of Professional Management, Second Edition.

At Kings County Hospital, Bramble held numerous positions until her retirement in 2009 as Associate Executive Director, Training and Organizational Development.

During her tenure at Kings County Hospital Center, she said her vision for nursing education and nursing practice, as well

as her ability to work collaboratively with Deans and Chairpersons of Colleges and Schools of Nursing, led to the establishment of an on-site Master in Public Health, an on-site Associate to Bachelor of Science Degree program, and a generic Bachelor of Science Degree program in Nursing at Kings County Hospital.

In 1981, Bramble was commissioned as a captain in the United States Army Reserve. She held numerous positions in military training schools and hospitals, including Officer-in-Charge of Curriculum and Testing, Director of Staff Development, Assistant Chief Nurse, Executive Officer and Commander.

Over the years, Bramble said her devotion to duty, attention to details, and her clinical and leadership skills earned her the rank of Colonel, making her the first known Vincentian female officer to achieve that rank.

While Bramble retired from the US

Army Reserve after 22 years of service, she remains an active member of the Retired Officers Association, both locally and nationally.

Over the years, Bramble has received numerous awards, proclamations and citations for her outstanding military and civilian service from health care organizations and elected community leaders, including a Congressional Award from former US Congressman Edolphus "Ed" Towns; proclamations from The New York State Senate, the Brooklyn Borough President, Council Members of the City of New York 45th, 40th and 35th Districts in Brooklyn; awards from The Hospice of Greater New York, Health and Hospitals Corporation and the New York State Nurses Association; and the Caribbean-American Health Care Award from Caribbean Life, the largest Caribbean-themed newspaper in the US.

#### **Antigua**

The Antigua and Barbuda government will be moving at full speed in the fight against crime in 2017.

Attorney General Steadroy Benjamin in his end-of-the-year press briefing warned criminals that the government will flush them out and prosecute them in an effort to keep the crime rate down.

He warned them that "if you commit crime, then you will pay the time, if you make life unsafe, you will be sought after and prosecuted."

Benjamin said the government is determined to create a safe and secure environment and to ensure



that all persons who seek to engage in criminal activity will be met with the full brunt of the law.

#### **Bahamas**

Bahamas will host the Ninth Inter-American Meeting of Ministers of Education from Feb. 9 - 10 this year at the Atlantis Resort, Paradise Island.

Among the issues to be discussed would be regional developments and challenges in education.

The ministers will also chart a way forward for the 34 representatives of the Organization of American States (OAS), and observer states, during the ministerial forum.

Conference Chairman, Jerome K Fitzgerald, who is also the Bahamas' Minister of Education, Science



and Technology said ministers of education from the OAS will gather in The Bahamas to discuss the Education Gender of the 34-member countries by extension the Latin American and Caribbean region.

He said The Bahamas has made significant progress in education and it has been at the helm of the global discussion on education.

The meeting is jointly organized by the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology, the OAS, the Inter-American Council for Integral Development and the Inter-American Committee on Education.

#### **Barbados**

Barbados recorded a 1.1 percent decline in its unemployment rate for the third quarter of 2016.

Official figures released recently showed that the unemployment rate for July to September 2016 stood at 10.2 percent down from 11.3 percent recorded for the same period in 2015.

The statistics derived from the Continuous Household Labor Force Survey, the unemployment rate among males stood at 9.7 percent and 10.8 percent among females.

In the review period, the number of persons employed totaled 132,100;

of whom 66,400 were males and 65,700 were females. The total number of unemployed persons stood at



15,100; 7,100 males and 8,000 females.

In total, the number of persons in the labor force stood at 147,200.

During the third quarter in 2016 the Wholesale & Retail Trade Sector generated jobs for the largest number of

persons, employing 22,400, whole the Accommodation & Food Services Sector employed 16,500.

The Construction, Mining and Quarrying Sector generated employment for 14,100, while 9,500 were employed in the manufacturing Sector.

#### Guyana

The Guyana government recently launched a National Drug Strategy Master Plan to combat the illicit drug use and trafficking.

Public Security Minister Khemraj Ramjattan told the ceremony that the figures coming out of the drug use in a school survey tells a worrying story.

He said the plan which will run until 2020 will "reduce drugs in the community and minimize the harm that they cause to individual users and the community at large.'

The main objectives of the plan include the reduction of demand and supply of illicit drugs; providing treatment options; institutional strengthening and policy coordination to respond

to drug use; and strengthening international cooperation.

Ramjattan said the plan will undertake research to improve intervention and control, as



well as monitoring the drug threat.

#### Haiti

Several suspected cases of cholera in Haiti increased sharply from 2,377 in September to 4,980 in October in 2016.

The rise is being blamed on Hurricane Matthew, which struck the impoverished country during October.

Some 48 percent of these new cases were reported in the areas of Grand Anse and the South.

In November, the situation in areas affected by Matthew improved, with a 25 percent decrease in the number of suspected cases between October and November, from 2,400 to 1,800 suspected cases.

From January to November 2016 there were 39,439 new cases of cholera com-

sive investigative piece on the scheme.

The conclusion from weeks of investigative work basically indicated that these small island nations lack the capacity to properly investigate the backgrounds of applicants, particularly those from flashpoint countries or regions such as the Middle East.

As the program was being aired, many in government in St. Kitts, Antigua, Dominica, Grenada, and St. Lucia shook their heads in frustration knowing that such global publicity will obviously cast a negative spotlight on a revenue scheme and bring unwanted attention to it. The current administration in St. Vincent has vowed never to involve inself in the CIP despite the demise of banana and fluctuating income from tourism as it looks down on any dollar scheme for local citizenship and passport priviliges.

Critics say that the fact that applicants from around the globe do not even have to set foot on Dominica for example, might have triggered alarm bells for the CIP just as the Trump Administration is coming into office with its avowed anti-immigrant rhetoric and as similarly negative sentiments are sweeping through Europe, through Germany and the United Kingdom in particular.

Anticipating the possibility of increased pressure from western nations, governments are tacting to circumstances and looking for new ways of making the program credible and above board.

This week, the head of one of the world's leading citizenship advisory groups struck the first blow to ensure that the program survives for his clients, mostly Caribbean governments and the applicants the firm brings to them.

Chairman of Henley & Partners Christian H. Kalin is now suggesting

that governments should turn to the regional intelligence system to help authorities properly scrutinize applicants and ensure the future and longevity of the CIP.

"There should definitely not be any competing on that level but rather the Caribbean should strive to adopt common standards, such as ensuring each application is vetted and approved from the Joint Regional Communications Centre," he said.

The Antigua Observer reported the firm credited with pushing the scheme as saying that this should be the preferred route as the Trinidad-based body handles areas such as "the identification of and monitoring the movements of persons of interest, including those who may be a high security threat to the safety and security of the region." The intelligence agency also has expertise relating "to assisting regional law enforcement personnel in the detection of persons who are travelling with stolen, lost and fraudulent travel documents.'



# Haitian group to rally in Washington

A Haitian group in Brooklyn is expected to be among nine busloads of immigrant activists from Brooklyn, Queens and Long Island, who will depart before dawn on Saturday for a trip to Washington, D.C., intent on making their voices heard, according to reports.

The Haitian Women for Haitian Refugees will be among demonstrators blasting protest playlists, while carrying posters and flags, from the familiar rainbow to the worn colors of Haiti, reported the New York Times on Thursday.

The paper said the groups are not going to the better known Women's March on Washington, planned for Jan. 21, the day after Donald J. Trump's inauguration.

Instead, they are heading to the nation's capital for a more modest rally focused on the rights of immigrants, called "We Are Here to Stay" and scheduled to start at 11 am at the Metropolitan A.M.E. Church, the Times said.

Ninaj Raoul, a founder and executive director of Haitian Women for Haitian Refugees, said she had seen the immigration rights movement focus on the ultra-organized Latino community since the 2012 election, according to the Times.

But she said Black immigrants, who are far less likely to be undocumented, have pressing issues of their own.

"Now, more than ever, it's important for the Haitian voice to be heard in this movement," Raoul said. "Not just for the incoming government, where we have so many reasons to be worried, but for the current government because of the actions they've taken on Haitian immigrants."

Over the last several months, she said more than 80 Haitian immigrants have walked into her Brooklyn office seeking help, anguished by the shifting American policy that has left them separated from family members, according to the Times.

She added that those living in New York, because of temporary protection granted after their country's 2010 earthquake, do not know how long that will last.

The Times said migrants from Haiti have flooded the southern border of Mexico since last spring, many making dangerous journeys through nine countries after fleeing South America.

# Fund-raiser shines light on Haiti's hurricane relief

Guests packed Space Ibiza in Manhattan to support the "Haiti Shines Bright" fund-raiser for Hurricane Matthew relief on Jan. 11.

Attending the fund-raiser were former prime minister of Haiti Laurent Lamothe, and the former tourism minister of Haiti Stephanie Villedrouin, who are both raising money in to financially assist projects of The Louis G. Lamothe Foundation which is currently rebuilding homes in towns destroyed after the hurricane.

Event organizer Jacques-Philippe Piverger said aside from raising money, he pooled together resources for the event to continue a missing conversation about Haiti in the aftermath of the earthquake, specifically people living in towns hardest hit by it.

"It didn't seem like there had been much attention placed on the issue of the hurricane and to the lives affected, and it didn't seem like there was much going in the form of providing assistance and trying to support people living there," said Piverger.

"I wanted to make sure I mustered the support in my immediate network, and try to focus on the small towns in Haiti particularly affected to provide the people with the things they need like tools and equipment."

The towns of focus are Anse d'Hainault and Anse du Clerc, which are at the southern region of Haiti. Fishing nets for fishermen, gardening tools for farmers, and water filters, are a few of the many things The Louis G. Lamothe Foundation will supply them. And the foundation also has a renewable energy plan to help farmers, said the former PM.

"What we're trying to trying to do is first ever smart village in Haiti," said Lamothe. "Our farmers are living in the darkness from 6 pm until 6 am with no light and we want to change that."

But the special guest of the night was not the PM, but a survivor of the recent hurricane and the 2010 earthquake. Ralf Etienne lost a leg in the earthquake at the peak of his media career. He came to the United States afterwards to enroll in Anderson University of Indiana, and saw a positive side to his life-changing experience. The eye-opening turn of events of both disasters encouraged him into being a devoted humanitarian he is now, he said.

## Brooklyn politicians proclaim 'this land is our land'

Four Brooklyn elected officials have united in writing a joint editorial piece, proclaiming that "this land is our land," referring to the Bedford-Union Armory "skirmish" in Crown Heights.

"We agree with the recent Crain's New York Editorial, "The Armory skirmish shows it's time to think bigger in Crown Heights," wrote Congresswoman Yvette D. Clarke, State Sen. Jesse Hamilton, Assemblyman Walter T. Mosley, and Assemblywoman Diana Richardson.

"We enthusiastically reiterate Crain's statement that we need a broader vision to grow Crown Heights in a way that preserves its economic and ethnic diversity," they said. "We are duty bound as the locally elected officials of the Crown Heights community in which the Bedford-Union Armory resides, to work to achieve this

laudable goal since the project is on public, city-owned land. Ultimately, we are all the landlords"

However, before addressing this goal of growth and the preservation of economic and ethnic diversity, the legislators said they must have "good faith and transparency."

"For us, there remain a number of unanswered questions regarding the financials of the proposed project, the benefits and the burdens," they said. "We must be clear about the facts."

According to Crain's Business News, "the market-rate rentals and condominiums will subsidize the recreational center and leave enough profit to justify the risk to the city's chosen builder, BFC Partners."

"All of the locally elected officials have asked this question repeatedly: Exactly just how much profit are we talking about

here?" the legislators wrote. "And at what cost to the community? What exactly are the details of these finances?"

The politicians said BFC has not revealed that to any of them, nor has the City, "despite repeated requests."

"It would be interesting to know whether BFC has released this information to a news organization and not to us," they said. "For the sake of governmental, journalistic and business transparency, we request that BFC share that information with us as well.

Clarke, Hamilton, Moseley and Richardson said another very important concern that was omitted from the Crain's article was: What happened regarding Slate Property Group, formerly a partner in the project?

A government statement quoted Prime Minister Dr. Keith Mitchell as saying the mission would also facilitate communication with potential investors wishing to come to Grenada.


The prime minister recently met with Russian Ambassador to Grenada Nikolay Smimov to discuss a wide range of matters, including debt relief for the



# Traveling to Guyana is quite a hassle

To The Editor

First, let me commend Guyanese business owners who work diligently to offer lowcost, efficient, aviation service to Guyana. Except for Captain Ronald Reece and Roxanne Reece of Fly Jamaica Airways, who own their fleet of aircraft, others like Travel Span's Nohar Singh, and Roraima Tours' Gerry Gouveia, are continually disappointed, despite placing their trust in charter service carriers like Eastern Airlines, and Dynamic Airways, for guaranteed on-time, proficient

Issues of mechanical failure, late arrival and departure, lack of permanent positioning at JFK, inexperienced pilots who fail to navigate away from turbulence, lack of piloting skills during a storm, and incompetent customer service, are all failures Guyanese face in their journey home. We are left at the mercy of ill-prepared charters like Eastern Airlines, and Dynamic Airways that continue to disregard, and disrespect travelers who pay their wages.

Case in point, my Christmas trip to the homeland that left a bitter taste in my travel mouth. I recounted my in-bound on Easter Airlines (thank God I arrived safely), and hoped for a better return. I arrived as CJIA, three hours ahead of departure time, checked-in, and was pleasantly surprised with an upgrade to first class — Seat #1F. But before my departure, I was subjected to lackadaisical, incompetent staff at CJIA, who allowed me to pass through

immigration and customs, after which, I heard my name over the loud speaker being asked return to luggage checkin over and over again...I had already paid my new departure fee of GYD\$5000 (USD\$25.00), purchased duty free items, and at the gate waiting on boarding calls. I did not panic, however, because I knew I had nothing 'foreign' in my suitcase... except for my seasoned fish, black cake, Salara (redcake) and a few other Christmas delicacies, I had not broken any

I hurried back to the scanner, but while my suitcase was being examined, ... Again my name was shouted to return... etc...I was like?? I am right here.... my point is...a traveller must be present! as a suitcase passes through the scanner.... that traveler should then be asked to open his / her suitcase there and then if something looks suspicious...not be called back over a loud speaker ... I felt like a smuggler.. Of course...I was cleared and now had to go through the same process all over again...Duty Free items passing through the scanner... Fortunately after all of this... the flight left the gate 15 minutes later than its scheduled departure time of 4 pm and soared to the skies.

I have traveled to 26 countries, flying on the A-380, and many other aircraft to get to my many destinations... but never have I ever experienced such a shaky flight on a round trip. Maybe it's the instability

# Recreational facilities at the Bedford Armory will be a win for Crown Heights

The Crown Heights community is in desperate need of quality recreational facilities for youth sports leagues, senior activities and other neighborhood-based programming. While other more affluent communities have had access to many of these facilities for decades, we have been struggling to find adequate recreational space for far too long.

That is why we and so many other Crown Heights residents and stakeholders strongly support the city's plan to provide new recreational facilities as part of the redevelopment of the Bedford-Union Armory. While we greatly respect the local elected officials who recently weighed in on the project, we disagree with their claim that this planned rec center is a "Trojan horse" and we hope these elected officials will take the time to gather more community feedback regarding our support for this development.

The recreational facility proposed for the Armory will include three multisport courts, three hardwood basketball courts, an indoor athletic field and a 25-meter competitive swimming pool. These are the exactly the kind of resources needed for young people in Crown Heights — especially youth basketball and soccer leagues who simply cannot

find the same kind of quality practice space enjoyed by the counterparts in other parts of Brooklyn and the city at large. Seniors in our community will also greatly benefit from quality athletic space for exercise and other wellness programs.

We also know that, unfortunately, many of Crown Heights' local public schools in District 17 have had no choice but to use cafeterias, auditoriums and other inadequate spaces for school athletic programs. Providing real sports facilities at the Armory would be a game-changer for these schools, especially because the planned pool is the proper size for athletic competition.

Additionally, we cannot overstate the value of these resources in efforts to decrease violence in Crown Heights. It is a sad reality that too many young people in our community fall victim to violence because they do not have a safe place to gather and play sports, especially with regard to after-school programming. By bringing these facilities to the Armory, we can provide Crown Heights with a

powerful new tool for keeping young people safe and empowering them to succeed in athletics and education.

Most importantly, the city has committed to ensuring that community members are able to utilize these recreational facilities at discounted rates at any time. The operator of the space will be required to partner local organizations and non-profit groups that provide the kind of sports and community programming that will take place there.

While we understand the concerns raised by some of our local elected officials, it is our sincere hope that they will consider meeting with us and others in our community who support new recreational facilities at the Armory because of the powerfully positive impact they will have. When our community voices are heard, we are confident that we will succeed in bringing this muchneeded resource to Crown Heights and strengthening our community for generations to come.

## Trump's AG rejected three decades ago by King

The saying 'what goes around comes around" could well apply to Jefferson Bueregard Sessions and his assessment of being tapped to be the next attorney general.

Hand-picked three decades ago by President Ronald Reagan, the then state senator in Alabama, and ambitious Republican was nominated for ascendance to become a federal judge in the US District Court Southern District of Alabama.

His nomination never made it past the Senate Judiciary Committee.

Because of his blatant and racist anti-Black stance he was denied.

Although he aspired to the lofty position he was summarily rejected because of his bigotry

That the next president of the United States now wants to overturn that decision by choosing him 30 years later to a cabinet position to decide the law of the land could well find application to a theory of vindication.

Sessions' long road to Trump tower is still pending and iron-



ically the saying might also be suited to one of his principal detractor — Coretta Scott King — who wrote a ninepage letter to the committee in deference to his appointment three decades ago.

Addressed to then chairman, Sen. Strom Thurmond, the widow of Dr. Marin Luther King Jr. penned a scathing reproach to his nomination. Written on stationary from the Martin Luther King Jr. Center for Non-Violent Social Change on March 19, 1986, when its corporate officers included vice presidents, Harry Belafonte, Walter Fauntroy and Andrew Young, the defiant letter stated:

"Anyone who has used the power of his office as United States attorney to intimidate and chill the free exercise of the ballot by citizens should not be elevated to our courts."

King did not mince her words, she said: "Mr. Sessions

has used the awesome power of his office in a shabby attempt to intimidate and frighten elderly Black voters. For this reprehensible conduct, he should not be rewarded with a federal judgeship."

"I do sincerely urge you to oppose the confirmation of Mr. Sessions."

Eighteen years after her husband was assassinated in Memphis, Tennessee, the widow punctuated the cover page of the passionate plea with a personal and final request.

Her words resonated deeply and may have been the nail that hammered rejection of Jeff Sesions' bid to become a federal judge.

According to CNN, such a decision has only been recorded twice in 50 years.

Although King asked that her statement be placed in the hearing record, until last week, the compelling document remained elusive to the

Reportedly, the Washington Post unearthed the letter and published it in its entirety one week ago.

The publication revealed that King's letter and her opposition was definitely a key element that ended Sessions' ambitious path to the bench.

Allegedly, current Judiciary Chair Chuck Grassley (R-Iowa) had the sole authority to release the letter.

Repeatedly King blasted Sessions' apparent behavior as a U.S. attorney, saying that "his politically-motivated voting-fraud prosecutions," and his apparent "indifference toward criminal violations of Civil Rights law, indicates that he lacks the temperament, fair-

of the B-737 Airbus in the air. David Roberts please enlighten me about the mechanics of this plane. Flight EA. 4213 arrived at JFK 20 minutes ahead of schedule. However, despite, the snowstorm that blanketed JFK, if Eastern had a permanent place at Terminal 7, the plane would not have had to sit on the tarmac from 10:35 pm on Saturday, Jan. 7, when it arrived, until Sunday, Jan. 8, at 4:35 am when passengers finally disembarked.

The pilot was asked to park at a Terminal 4 gate. I must say we had a sightseeing tour of JFK due to the airbus hours long ride along the snowy runways stopping ever so often, before arriving close to the terminal. Passengers then sat for another hour, before a stairway finally arrived, and angry passengers deplaned, and were then transported by bus to the terminal.

Guyanese were furious with disdain at the disrespect they suffered... many claiming that they would never fly Eastern again...comparing the airline to Dynamic... A passenger's wife suffered a medical condition and missed her appointment. Others recounted their ordeal, receiving only beverage, and later light snacks of cookies, after the long wait on the tarmac. A businessperson in first class spoke out about the lousy food he said he received after paying a fare of \$1,200.00.

When it was all said and done, passengers were left to join lines with hundreds of other passengers to clear JFK. By then, I had decided that I would in the future fly a reliable airline...and enjoy the dignified greeting of, "Welcome Home" when I arrive at the TSA booth, and not have my luggage rummaged... I did not hit my pillow until after 9 am on Sunday, Jan. 8, 2017, more that 12 hours after I was airborne from Guyana.

there were 39,629 suspected cases and 433 related deaths in 2016, according to the United Nations (UN).

Despite several initiatives to provide health assistance to those infected. environmental issues played a substantial role in the cholera rise, said a justice group.

"It's still continuing to go down from its peak in 2010 and 2011, but in 2016 it increased compared to 2015 and 2014 because in those years little rain fell and there was a little drought," said Brian Concannon, executive director of Institute for Justice and Democracy in Haiti (IJDH). "There are other issues but the epidemic is throughout the country and worst in places like the central plateau and the Artibonite region - where it started."

Concannon said in addition to the drought, there have been other various and complex issues that could have led to an increase in cholera cases, such as the closure of UN clinics, which provided vaccinations, and the lack of funding for their initiative to end cholera, he said.

"A certain number of their clinics have closed, and the measures they implemented have saved hundreds of lives," he said. "Many have been saved by the medical efforts but the problem it is not enough and never enough. It has decreased steadily since the epidemic

and reduce fatalities but money ran out and so did international support."

The UN is implementing short and long-term initiatives to solve Haiti's cholera problem. A representative from the organization said immediate improvements to the country's sanitation infrastructure and water sources are needed, as well as vaccination and treatment availability. But these efforts come with a large price tag originally the UN budgeted \$2.2 million but now it is higher.

"Last year, the Ministry of Health re-evaluated the economic needs with a mid-term review of the National Plan for the Elimination of Cholera 2013-2022 and for the period 2016-2018, with an estimated budget of US\$ 182 million," said Mourad Wahba, UN humanitarian coordinator.

But Wahba reported an advancement.

"Haitian and international efforts have succeeded in reducing the cholera cases and fatalities in Haiti by almost 90 pwecent since the peak in 2011," he said. "Although it is not enough. One single case is already too many cases.'

The UN has not directly admitted fault for bringing the bacterial disease into Haiti, but did say in 2015 that their peacekeepers - who have been stationed in Haiti since 2003 — may have 'played a role' in introducing it to the country. As a result, they launched a billion-dollar campaign to end cholera, and the organization is trying to make amends with their current efforts.

## Barbados reserves perilously low

A surprise Central Bank of Barbados admission that it is losing more foreign exchange than gaining, and that more losses would threaten the currency's exchange rate has sparked accusations that government's economic policies have failed.

In his statement of the economic prospects for 2017, Governor of the Central Bank, Delisle Worrell, in essence said that unless the country stops the bleeding of foreign exchange and retains a balance between inflows and outflows of internationally tradable currencies, the Barbados dollar would be devalued.

"The country has failed to achieve that balance since 2013, and there remains a need to dampen spending further in order to protect the country's reserves of foreign exchange. The reserves are what protect us against the devaluation of our currency," Worrell stated.

The Barbados dollar is pegged to that of the United States at a ratio of Bar\$1 to 50 cents US.

quarter of 2016, Worrell reported that the island's reserves, which are held in foreign currency, stood at \$900.3 million, a reduction of \$77.3 million compared to the end of September in the previous year.

He said that the September 2016 figure gave the island 14 weeks of cover for importation of goods and services needed to maintain the current standard of living.

With reserves for only 14 weeks of import cover, Barbados has come perilously close to the minimum 12 weeks benchmark, below which the island may be called upon to devalue its currency.

The Opposition Barbados Labour Party's spokesman on economic matters, Clyde Mascoll, almost immediately responded by saying that Worrell's admission means the governor and "the (Prime Minister) Freundel Stuart government are admitting failure of the fiscal measures that started in 2009 / 10."

Mascoll said the failure to achieve a balance in the



Year on year, Barbados' foreign reserves have been on an agonizing slow descent, moving from \$1.477 billion in 2009 to a provisional figure of \$927 million in 2015.

In spite of these dire straits that the country finds itself because of the foreign exchange leakage, Worrell stated assuringly, "The Central Bank remains in a position to provide US dollars at the 2:1 exchange rate to meet all legitimate needs, if no other source is sufficient."

But Mascoll retorted.

Sessions was born in Selma, Ala-

An early supporter of Donald J. Trump, Sessions has been accused of calling a Black attorney "boy." He also allegedly referred to Civil Rights groups "un-American" and has been accused of saying that his only issue with the Ku Klux Klan is drug use.

The 69-year-old, four-term Alabama Republican is a hard-liner on free trade and immigration. One of his arguments against immigration is that prospective immigrants do not have constitutional protections.

Acclaimed to be a champion of anti-Muslim and anti-immigration extremists, Sessions' approval was described by New York Sen. Chuck Schumer this

"Given some of his past statements and his staunch opposition to immigration reform, I am very concerned about what he would do with the Civil Rights Division at the Department of Justice and want to hear what he has to say."

Sessions opposed all of Pres. Barack Obama's U.S. Supreme Court picks and also voted against the nomination of Attorney General Loretta Lynch, citing her support for the president's executive actions that shielded some undocumented immigrants from deportation.

Sessions "is a world-class legal mind and considered a truly great attorney general and U.S. attorney in the state of Alabama," the 45th president said in a statement nine days after his election.

"Jeff is greatly admired by legal scholars and virtually everyone who knows him."

Asian Americans Advancing Justice posted on their web portal that Sessions is unfit for the job.

"Sessions has opposed Civil Rights legislation and led anti-immigrant efforts throughout his Senate career. His record of disenfranchising and denying the rights of people of color, immigrants, and Muslim communities, as well as his overtly racist statements made during his career as U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of Alabama make him unfit for the position of attornev general of the United States."

During confirmation hearings last week Sessions faced a barrage of protestors some dressed in KKK outfits who jeered the Donald J. Trump nominee.

pared to the same period in 2015 and 420 new deaths, compared with the same period in 2015, health officials reported.



From October 2010 to November 2016, there have been 801,000 cases and 9,408 deaths from cholera.

#### Jamaica

A Jamaican woman has been awarded J\$4million in compensation following a blood transfusion mistake at the University of the West Indies Hospital (UWI) 10 years ago.

In March 2006, Barbara Wright was accidentally given a blood transfusion with the wrong blood type.

She later sued the hospital claiming that she suffered both physical and mental injuries and hypertension.



She was supported by medical reports from two psychiatrists, which stated she needed future therapy in order to cope with the side effects.

While the hospital admitted liability, the institution challenged the amount of money being sought for compensation

The Supreme Court found that Wright did suffer mental and physical injuries. In handing down the award, the court also made provisions for her future medical expenses.

#### St. Vincent

The long-awaited Argyle International Airport in St. Vincent will open on Feb. 14,



2017 — five years behind schedule.

The announcement was made by Prime Minister Dr. Ralph Gonsalves who said the airport will be opened on Feb. 14, Valentine's Day- the day of love.

He said that the date of Feb. 14 had been hinted on social media and he held a meeting with all the stakeholders to make sure it was the right date.

There is speculation that the first commercial flight into the airport would be a chartered flight.

It is understood that regional carrier

LIAT and Amerijet, an American cargo airline, will service the new airport while the government works out details to continue to woo other carriers.

The EC\$729 million airport has missed construction deadlines annually since 2011 and has been a major issue in the 2005, 2010, and 2015 general elections.

#### St. Lucia

Six people were killed recently in various incidents in St. Lucia, prompting Prime Minister Allen Chastanet to summon a meeting of top police officers

The first murder was that of an unidentified man at Grand Rivere, Corinth, a community about four miles east of the capital, Castries.

The stabbing took place just hours after two men, identified as Gillian Charles, 37, and Dequan Joseph, 16, were shot dead at Jacmel, a west coast community, while a third was seriously injured and taken to hospital.

The third victim Kyle Richards later succumbed to his injuries at hospital.

Chastanet recently told reporters that criminals were the enemies of St. Lucia and he would meet with the Royal St. Lucia



Police Force and officials from the Social and Family Development "to see how best we can deal with this alarming situation."

#### **Trinidad**

Trinidad and Tobago oil company Petrotrin averted a major strike which could have disrupted the country.

After 30 hours of reconciliation talks with the Labor Minister Jennifer Baptiste, Petrotrin President Fitzroy Hare-



wood and officials of the Oilfield Workers Trade Union (OWTU) last Monday the union decided to accept a five percent wage offer and pulled back the strike which was already started.

The increase in the workers' wages which will be applied immediately will cost the company TT\$80 million annually.

The company had offered the workers 0/0/0 percent over the three-year-period (2011-2014).

## Online based thrift-shop offers style and grace

Get thrifty for the kiddies.

A Flatbush couple is giving Brooklyn parents an opportunity to thrift shop for decent kids clothing, and even sell back clothing that their youngsters no longer wear, with their children's thrift store Everything Jiggy. When David Dean and Angela Azorer began realizing that their daughter had a lot of unworn clothes attached with price tags, they chose to sell back to thrift stores. But in their search the pair found dead ends or thrift shops in northern Brooklyn, far from where they are based in Flatbush. They also noticed a lack of thrifting options for chil-

"We knew of thrift stores for adults so we naturally assumed there was one for children's clothes, and when we did find places where we could trade the clothes, the locations weren't accessible to us," said Dean. "We would only see them in different parts like Greenpoint and Park Slope — none in Flatbush."

That is where the couple got the idea for EverythingJiggy. com, an online-based children's thrift store. Dean found himself constantly buying clothes to keep his daughter nicely dressed, but she never got to wear many of them before needing bigger sizes and other clothes. They figured other parents were experiencing a similar predicament,

and probably searching to buy and thrift, and they discovered this fact when they officially launched last January, immediately noticing a lot of buzz.

'We weren't even telling everyone but once we had our plan down everyone was really receptive," he said.

Catering to children from 12 months to 12 years old, unused and used stylish clothes are priced with close to 85 percent discount, and posted on the site. Parents can buy and trade with Everything Jiggy by inquiring through their site. Once a request is received from a trader, they arrange pickups for clothes, determine pricing on the spot, and reward the parents with either cash or store credit to buy at their store. The clothing they sell are current fashions such as distressed jeans, bomber jackets,

skinny jeans, and other trendy styles. They can be mid-range to even high-fashion brands, said Dean.

"We get everything from Old Navy to Burberry, and we recently got a pair of Gucci sneakers.'

Clothing that is not high enough in quality is donated, but not because the clothing is not up to par. But to also give children in shelters in fashionable clothes to sport as well,

"They have to be in great condition, even the clothes we decide to donate. We don't donate clothing that is faded or stained," he said. "They deserve the same respect we deserve for ourselves because we are all about helping families and people who are less fortunate.'

Still in the early stages, the couple's business model priority is to look out for their community, and even take on an environmental approach.

"It's all about community for me, but it's tied together with an environmental aspect,"

"Tons of people have clothing they can't use or need but don't want to spend more on clothing, so they can buy, sell or trade — but we are recycling clothing and giving them a longer life."

The couple also hope to provide younger parents in lower or middle income parts of southern Brooklyn, an opportunity to thrift.

"We can't deny the fact that these stores are lacking in predominately West Indian and lower income areas," said Dean. "We see the need for these businesses and we hope to be in areas where they don't exist.'

At the afternoon literary feast, Barack Obama's inauguappointment were noted.

Angela Flournoy read Maya Angelou's inaugural poem, "On the Pulse of the Morning." U.S. Poet Laureate's Rita Dove and Robert Pinsky read inaugural poems. 

If you can't say something

Sometimes, it's hard to say nothing at all. There are times when you need to speak out, to confront, share your opinion, rant, or vent. And then there are times, as in the new book "Audacity" by Jonathan Chait, where you must praise.

For perhaps the last few months of Barack Obama's presidency, media outlets have debated about something that definitely matters: was he one of the best presidents, or one of the worst?

It's the former, says Chait, even though he admits there are times when it looks like the latter. Obama, he says, however, absolutely succeeded at what he set out to do, and this book follows that argument.

Though the Civil Rights movement was forty-some

years prior to the day a Black man moved into the White House, racial issues keenly split the country over the last eight years, not along lines of race, but on political lines. White America often denied it, but Obama forced a harder soulsearch on racism.

He reportedly had a large agenda upon taking office in 2009, but it quickly became clear that his work would be to avoid, rather than fix, another Great Depression. He succeeded, but no President gets kudos for things like that. Instead, says Chait, there was - and still is - criticism about his actions, economically.


Health care legislation insured

millions of Americans who otherwise would have no coverage, thanks to Obama and a surprising number of ideas that first came from the Republicans. As a new President, Obama boosted the economy by spending money on green energy, with an eye toward global climate concerns. He helped restore America 's world-wide "standing"; and foresightfully recognized China and India as budding superpowers.

So why is anyone questioning his audacity, or the legacy he leaves behind? The answer to that lies in the recent past, and in the history of Twentieth-Century American politics. Understanding both, and what happens from here, is enhanced by learning what's inside "Audacity."

Just know first that there's a lot to absorb.

Because author Jonathan Chait is also a political columnist, the goings-on behind-the-scenes in Washington are presented in great detail in this book. That can be both a good thing and a bad thing: good, because Chait is clear in reasoning and thorough in fact-finding, in favor of arguments for a stellar Obama legacy; bad, because this thoroughness becomes quite heavy at times.

## Lincoln's 'D' lifts Railsplitters over Iona Prep

It wasn't the offensive explosion either team was hoping

Lincoln and Iona Prep both struggled to hit their scoring stride in a non-league tilt on Jan. 15, but the Railsplitters managed to grab just enough momentum to pull off the victory, downing the Gaels 53-44 at the Martin Luther King Showcase in Coney Island. "We try to play defense," said senior Donald Cannon-Flores, who racked up nine points and 11 assists. "Defense creates offense."

Lincoln (15-2) made some key halftime adjustments and came out on fire early in the third quarter, out-scoring Iona Prep 11–2 in the first five minutes of the period. Lincoln coach Dwayne "Tiny" Morton said spurring the offense after the half was simple as the Railsplitters were determined to turn the game around.

"Just had to be unselfish," he said. "Pass to the open man. Run the offense. Play basketball the way it's supposed to be played."

The team found a way to break through Iona Prep's defense throughout the second half, working the ball into the of the game's tempo.

"Coach just said we need to pass the ball more," said Reid on what changed the matchup's momentum.

Iona Prep (9-5) was able to stay close throughout the game, thanks in large part to guard Bryce Willis. The Gaels standout racked up a teamhigh 15 points, including a pair of shots from downtown that gave his squad a bit of lategame confidence.

Iona Prep rallied late in the third quarter — going on a 7-1 run in the final three minutes - but Lincoln matched with its own scoring outburst to open the fourth. The Gaels made it a nine-point game with just over four minutes left, but that was as close as they'd get.

Lincoln held down defensively, and once again, hit shots when it had to. The Railsplitters wrapped up the victory with a seven-point run in the fourth quarter.

"They want to play to win,"




Bounding and leap: Lincoln senior Kclejuan Ferguson goes up for the rebound. Photo by Joshua Winata





"They have great voices no doubt, but it's the messages in their music and what they stood for," he said. "I don't want to do random music. I want to use my time and I want to stand for something. I want people to know the bigger we get, we're not gonna fade into a penthouse view, but we want to keep our relationship with our fans."

T-Kross does not have an album release date, but his debut album is expected to be released this year.







opening eight minutes of play. That was, however, about as good as things would get for the squad.

The board is trying to garner support from local leaders to push for the construction of a cricket stadium to house future games.

"We see the United States as a potential host for a world event in the period of 2023 to 2031," said Cameron. "My objective is to try to help and to identify a suitable area and support them in bringing cricket to the state of New York and to build a stadium."

With the support from councilmen Alan Maisel (D-Marine Park) and Jumaane Williams (D-East Flatbush) in particular, they can lobby on behalf of the board with the Parks Department for building a stadium.

Cameron also announced the West Indies upcoming tour with Pakistan. The West Indies will play Pakistan on March 25 and 26 at Central Broward Stadium in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. This comes after a recent victory for the team.

But even as the West Indies cricket ranking has fallen over the years, their recent efforts show their improvement.

"Our performance has been better - we beat Pakistan for the first time in 21 years and it was the first time we beat a team ranked higher than us," he said. "We have made tremendous strides in the last four years."

And Cameron promises to see programs for cricket for children and they want to see it in schools, in the Caribbean and locally. He noted that the lack of cricket's popularity has denied them some advantages in that area as opposed to other sports.

"Part of the challenge with cricket now versus other sports in the region is that it is the least attractive in terms of educational opportunities," said Cameron. "The top advantages are track and field and basketball because they know they can get scholarships to the United States."

Cameron said it may be longer to implement programs for men, but the board is aiming to get things going for their female counterparts, as they want to lobby for college opportunities for women's cricket, which is easier to obtain, he said.




