Top US official travels to Haiti

Just eight days after granting limited Temporary Protected Status (TPS) to 58,000 undocumented Haitians living in the United States, a senior Trump administration official is traveling to the French-speaking Caribbean.

The US Department of Homeland Security (DHS) said on ment that Kelly will "discuss Tuesday that its Secretary, John F. Kelly, will travel to Haiti on issues related to repatriation, Wednesday "where he will meet with President Jovenel Moïse and other senior government

officials."

DHS said in a very brief stateinternational cooperation and as well as efforts to build Haiti's maritime law enforcement

Caribbean countries worry over oil deal with Venezuela

Despite repeated assurances from Venezuelan diplomats and authorities in Caracas, governments in a growing number of Caribbean Community countries are becoming increasingly worried about the continued existence of a concession oil deal Venezuela signed up with the bloc 12 years ago as the economic and political situation worsens in the oil and gasrich South American nation.

Apart from anxiously monitoring events in the country. many are worried about whether a change of government at elections in about two years, or before, could lead to a cancellation or severe altering of the PetroCaribe Agreement that late leftist President Hugo Chavez signed with more than a dozen Caribbean countries in

Bipartisan effort to give ex-youth offenders a fresh start

US Rep. Hakeem Jeffries (NY-08), a member of House Democratic leadership and the Judiciary Committee, along with US Rep. Trey Gowdy (SC-4), a Republican member of the Judiciary Committee, this week introduced the "Renew Act," a bipartisan measure to reduce corrections costs and help young ex-offenders become productive citizens

"This is a common-sense measure that will improve the lives of millions of people across New York City and this great nation," said Jeffries, whose district encompasses parts of Brooklyn and Queens.

"It serves as a ripple of hope that will allow hardworking people to get back to work and provide for their families," he added. "Rep. Gowdy should be applauded for his leadership in this regard."

Gowdy said federal convictions for non-violent low-level drug offenders often prevent young individuals from finding work, housing and education, posing additional challenges as they work to transition back into society.

"By raising the expungement eligibility age from 21 to 25, the Renew Act promotes opportunities for young former offenders and reduces the risk of recidivism," he said. "I want to thank Rep. Jeffries for his longstanding commitment to promoting a fair and equal justice system and for his bi-partisan effort on this bill."

Jeffries noted that, in 1984, President Ronald Reagan signed into law 18 U.S.C. § 3607, which allows a young person convicted of misdemeanor possession to expunge that conviction if that person meets a certain criteria.

The criteria comprises committing the offense while under age 21; the individual is a low-level, first-time state or federal drug offender; the court uses its discretion to order the individual to probation; and that person successfully completes probation.

If those conditions are met, Jeffries said then the misdemeanor possession is expunged and "shall not be considered a conviction for the purpose of a disqualification or disability imposed by law."

Jeffries said the Renew Act would increase the expungement eligibility age from 21 to 25.

He said this will allow judges to use their discretion under Section 3607 to help more young people earn probation needed to expunge a misdemeanor possession.



Antigua

Public outcry and condemnation by the main Opposition United Progressive Party



(UPP) has forced Antigua and Barbuda Prime Minister Gaston Browne to scrap a proposed plan to give investors permission to build a gun-assembly plant in the proposed Economic Zone on the island.

The prime minister announced on Radio Observer that he had instructed the attorney general to scrap the deal.

Browne had called the radio station earlier in the afternoon and confirmed that the plan was going ahead.

But scores of residents called the radio station to criticize the prime minister for agreeing to the gun factory.

The prime minister claimed that he was not on the island when the decision was made in Cabinet to set up the gun manufacturing plant in Antigua, for export.

He agreed that it was a risk and it was in the best interest of the nation to scuttle the deal.

The UPP in a release said this reflects the "scant regard that the Gaston Browne administration places on the safety of the residents of the country through a proposal to establish a gun assembly plant in Antigua and Barbuda."

Bahamas

The new Bahamas Prime Minister Dr. Hubert Minnis has sent a warning of immediate dismissal




as a consequence of "unethical" behavior from Cabinet ministers and permanent secretaries.

This includes 12 ministers and three ministers of state.

Dr. Minnis told the persons who attended his swearing in ceremony recently that the government will be marked by "order and punctuality."

He noted that his administration was one of less talk and more action.

conduct in performance of their duties.

He also warned his ministers that if they should engage in any unsavory or unethical requests to the permanent secretaries and he finds out they would be fired immediately.

The new appointees include Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance Peter Turnquest and Attorney General Carl Bethel who were also sworn in.

Barbados

Barbados Finance Minister Chris Sinkler was dismissive of a suggestion from the



governor of the Central Bank Cleviston Haynes to approach the International Monetary Fund (IMF) in a bid to safeguard the local currency.

Sinkler told Barbados Today that while the economy "is not doing well at

the moment," he is yet to see the logic in approaching the international lending agency.

He said even if the government went to the IMF it was unlikely that any tangible benefits would be realized within the next six months.

The minister said he was looking forward to the economic review by the Haynes on the country's first quarter economic performance.

Jamaica

A DNA registry has been opened in Jamaica which will make it easier for police to positively identify perpetrators of crime

National Security Minister Robert Montague in making this announcement said the DNA science will enable police to rely less on fingerprinting to guarantee a positive identification. He noted that government has invested in the Institute of Forensic Sciences and Legal Medicine and



more equipment and more pathologists will be available in the all-out war on crime.

Montague said this new technology and advancements are allowing the police to prepare better cases and enhance their intelligence gathering.

The minister said the DNA will now tie suspects to the crime scene and ensure there is no more escaping on a technicality.

Jamaica back in 2005.

Just this week, the head of Venezuela's Embassy in Jamaica thought it best to reassure authorities there that despite the daily upheavals in the country, they should rest assured that nothing will change anytime soon.

Luis Gutierrez, the deputy head of mission in Kingston talked about the extremely close relations the two countries have had over the decades and is adamant that all bilateral agreements, PetroCaribe included, will be respected and honored as the months roll by despite the problems back home. "The Venezuela government remains committed to the bilateral arrangements and trade between the two countries," she told reporters as officials nervously eye the situation in Caracas and other cities affected by violent protests and clashes with riot police.

More than 50 people have been killed as the opposition ramps up pressure on the administration of President Nicolas Maduro to either call early elections or to step down as a chronic foreign exchange shortage in a country with, ironically the world's largest oil reserves, has led to massive shortages of food, medicines and other basics.

capacity, and to encourage cooperation between the Dominican Republic and Haiti's nascent border security unit."

Kelly's visit comes after announcing last week Monday that he was granting a six-month TPS extension to Haitians living illegally in the US. The extension, which becomes effective on Jul. 23, 2017, rans through Jan. 22, 2018.

But Kelly warned that the extension should allow Haitian TPS recipients living in the US "time to attain travel documents and make other necessary arrangements for their ultimate departure from the United States, and should also provide the Haitian government with the time it needs to prepare for the future repatriation of all current TPS recipients."

In making the decision to grant Haitians limited TPS, rather than the usual 18 months, Kelly said conditions in Haiti had "substantially improved since the earthquake in 2010."

He cited, among other things, the impending withdrawal of the United Nations Stabilization Mission (MINUS-TAH) in Haiti after 13 years; newly elected President Moïse's promise to rebuild the razed National Palace; and the closure of most of the tent cities.

But Haitians in the US are querying their fate after the limited TPS ends. Miami resident Evita Fremont, 48, like thousands of her compatriots, wondered what she would be going back to, according to the Miami Herald.

"If they tell you to get out, you have to get out," she told the paper. "Haiti is my country, but it doesn't have jobs. So, I am going back to do what?"

Fremont and others, however, take issue with DHS' assessment, according to the Herald.

Seven years after the devastating earthquake, they say, Haiti is still recovering from the collapse of its economy, and is struggling to restore social and economic normalcy, the Herald said.

"They are doing politics. They haven't gone to Haiti," said Fremont, a mother of four. "If you just look at the South where I am from, there is no way anyone can say it has improved."

Fremont has been in the United States since 2008, the Herald said.

"I can't even think about going back," said Fremont, who suffers from hypertension and diabetes. "All I know is that if I go back, I am not going to live long. I am a sick woman."

An official with the International Monetary Fund (IMF), which keeps a close eye on Haiti, told the Herald that Haiti depends heavily on remittances from nationals living abroad, like Fremont.

Their dollars account for 20 percent of the income of people in Haiti annually, the unidentified official told the Herald.

Banking impasse hits Barbados commerce

Lawyers are threatening to take the Barbados government to court if an amendment to the Revenue Act is not repealed, in the latest turn of events after a protest by commercial banks that halted real estate business.

This amendment to the act that became effective in March demands that persons wishing to conduct business transactions involving their property must have a clearance certificate showing that all due taxes were fully paid up, or that an arrangement to pay has been worked out with the Barbados Revenue Authority.

Government officials said the change is a measure to close loop holes in tax collection and bring in much needed revenue that is anyhow due to the Treasury.

But after commercial banks last week halted some 330 real estate transactions valued at an estimated Bar\$221 million (Bar\$1 = 50 cents US),

the Bar Association a few days later issued an ultimatum giving government by June 09 to revoke the amendment or face the court.

The banks claimed that the amended law was unclear on how they can conduct future real estate-related business and argued that demanding a tax clearance certificate from each client takes too long, and the lawyers supported this view.

"Several members of the bar, who in fact are integral to every land transaction completed in Barbados have reported significant challenges with obtaining the clearance certificates and consequently are unable to conclude property transactions on behalf of their clients," the Nation newspaper this week quoted Bar Association President, Liesel Weekes.

When banks had halted their attempts to process real estate transactions the Bankers Association issued a statement asserting, "the association further advises that until such clarifi-

cation is obtained, commercial banks will not be in a position to close real estate related transactions and disburse monies associated with same."

This stoppage in real estate business transactions comes while the Barbados economy continues to wilt under a recession characterized by generally slow commerce, low foreign exchange earnings and government struggling with a high deficit.

The Opposition Barbados Labour Party did not miss a beat on this matter, dispatching a press release after the Bankers Association statement reminding government that the BLP had vigorously opposed the amendment in Parliament.

Opposition Leader, Mia Mottley, stated, "when this amendment was introduced by the government two months ago, the BLP took the position that this action would be the death knell of business in Barbados."

She contended, "the amend-

ment to the Barbados Revenue Authority Act would cause total and complete chaos in the lives of citizens and businesses, conducting ordinarily routine transactions. The Barbados Revenue Authority sim-

ply does not have the institutional capacity to undertake the role of issuing this volume of Tax Clearance Certificates in acceptable timelines required for commercial transactions in Barbados."

Why international financial crises?

Jomo Kwame Sundaram, a former economics professor and United Nations Assistant Secretary-General for Economic Development, received the Wassily Leontief Prize for Advancing the Frontiers of Economic Thought in 2007.

KUALA LUMPUR, Malaysia, May 31 2017 (IPS) - International currency and financial crises have become more frequent since the 1990s, and with good reason. But the contributory factors are neither simple nor straightforward. Such financial crises have, in turn, contributed to more frequent economic difficulties for the economies affected, as evident following the 2008-2009 financial crisis and the ensuing Great Recession still evident almost a decade later.

Why international coordination?

Why is global co-ordination so necessary? There are two main reasons. One big problem before the Second World War was the contractionary macroeconomic consequences of the 'gold standard'.

In 1944, before the end of the Second World War, President Franklin Delano Roosevelt convened the United Nations Conference on Monetary and Financial Affairs - better known as the Bretton Woods Conference – even before the UN itself was set up the following year in San Francisco. After almost a month, the conference established the framework for the post-war international monetary and financial system, including the creation of the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and the Interna-

tional Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD), or World Bank.

To be sure, the Bretton Woods system reflected sometimes poor compromises made among the negotiating government representatives. Nevertheless, it served post-war reconstruction and early post-colonial development reasonably well until 1971.

In September of that year, the Nixon Administration in the US – burdened with mounting inflation and unsustainable budget deficits, partly due to the costly Vietnam War – unilaterally withdrew from its core commitment to ensure full US dollar convertibility to gold at the agreed rate. Thus, the unilateral US action did not involve a transition from the Bretton Woods system to any coherent, internationally agreed alternative.

Birth of a 'non-system'

The pre-1971 post-Second World War period has often been referred to as a Golden Age, a period of rapid reconstruction, growth and employment expansion after the devastation of the Second World War. It was also a period of development and structural transformation in many developing countries.

All this came to an end when coordination and multilateralism collapsed following President Nixon's decision to renege on 1944 US commitments at Bretton Woods which became the basis for the post-war international monetary system.

The leading international monetary economist of the post-war period, Robert Triffin, described the post-1971 arrangements as amounting to a 'non-system'. Now, with the international monetary system essentially the cumulative outcome of various, sometimes contradictory and ad hoc responses to new challenges, the need for coordination is all the more urgent.

A strong case for co-ordination has long been made by the United Nations. For example, soon after the global financial crisis exploded in late 2008, the 2009 mid-year update of the UN's World Economic Sit-

uation and Prospects showed how better coordinated and more equitable fiscal stimuli would have benefited all parties – developed countries, developing countries, transition economies and, most of all, the least developed countries.

Anarchy and fragility

Since the collapse of the Bretton Woods system in 1971, a small handful of currencies – especially the US dollar, the international favourite by far – have been held by others as reserve currencies. This has allowed the issuers of these currencies – especially the US – to run massive trade deficits, contributing to unsustainable global imbalances in savings and consumption.

A second underlying cause of international financial crises has been the ascendance, transformation and hegemony of the financial sector – termed 'financialization' – over the past three to four decades. Partly as a consequence, many decision-makers are now often more concerned with short-term financial indicators than other key economic indicators, often presuming that the former reflect the latter despite the lack of such evidence.

A third factor has been growing 'financial fragility', part-

ly due to the global financial 'non-system' in place since the collapse of the Bretton Woods system. Referring to this 'non-system' as an international financial 'architecture' is really insulting to architects. The lack of coherence and coordination has been exacerbated by financial deregulation, liberalization and globalization over the past three decades.

Finance calling the shots

The growing and spreading subordination of the real economy to finance in recent decades is a fundamental part of the problem. While finance is indeed a very important, if not an essential hand-maiden for the functioning of the real economy, the subordination of the real economy to finance has transformed macro-financial dynamics, with unproductive, contractionary, even dangerous consequences.

So, to address the root causes of crises, much better, including more appropriate regulation of the financial system is needed to ensure consistently countercyclical macro-financial institutions, instruments and policies, and to subordinate the financial sector to the real economy.

The 2008 financial crisis has catalyzed many debates on these issues – some old, some new – for instance, between Keynesian/Minskyian economists and their opponents; between Anglo-American and continental European worldviews; and between the global North and South. Any sustainable solution will clearly require much better international cooperation and co-ordination.

Hence, almost a decade since the 2008 global financial crisis began, there is no shared political commitment to much needed international financial reforms. It took fifteen years from the beginning of the Great Depression, a world war and Roosevelt's extraordinary leadership before the world was able to reform the international financial system in 1944. But sadly, there is no Roosevelt for our times.

Just ask Trinidad & Tobagoborn NASA aerospace scientist Dr. Camille Wardrop Alleyne, accomplished as the only woman of Caribbean descent in a top position at NASA she is now on a mission to inspire thousands of girls across the organization of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) to greatness.

"When you empower and inspire youth to believe in themselves and their capacity for greatness, they embrace their power to be the leaders of tomorrow — leaders who will create positive and lasting change in their communities and our world," the space engineer said.

On a mission to infuse a message to "dream big dreams and know there is no limit to success with hard work, determination, focus and a strong self-esteem," Alleyne plans to motivate at least 10,000 girls by touring OECS countries and on each stop deliver the empower-

ing passport to success.

As the founder of the Brightest Stars Foundation — an organization she established in 2007 to benefit girls in Africa, the Caribbean and Latin America by directing them to STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) fields — she envisions her brainchild as a motivator that will empower girls in the sub-region to achieve against all odds.

To that end she has partnered with the OECS Commission to achieve her goal.

Along with her team of experts, they plan to visit 10 Caribbean islands by the end of the year.

The aim is to host 1,500 girls in each island.

Deserving girls will be pooled from underserved rural and urban communities.

Allegedly, Dr. Alleyne will use the facts from the recently nominated Academy Award film "Hidden Figures" to motivate, inspire and empower thousands of girls throughout the region to reach their full potential.

The film depicts the experiences of African-American women mathematicians who worked at NASA during the 1950s. Unsung heroines of a nail-biting space race with the Russians during that era, they were instrumental in calculating the flight trajectories that made the mission of astronaut John Glenn a successful first for an American to orbit the earth

Alleyne was born in 1966 in Port-of-Spain, Trinidad.

Reportedly she had a fascination with space and planes from an early age.

After leaving her homeland at 17 years old, she was determined to study aeronautical engineering.

Focused and motivated by all she had seen and read, she received a bachelor's in mechan-

ical engineering from Howard University, a master's degree in mechanical engineering from Florida A&M, and a master's in aerospace engineering from the University of Maryland. She also has a PhD in Educational Leadership from the University of Houston.

the doors of NASA's John F. Kennedy Space Centre in Florida as a spacecraft engineer.

Her first job was as an aerospace systems engineer with the Department of Defense, where she worked on missile defense systems. She began working at NASA testing environmental equipment for the

Farm Up Jamaica!

This promises to be a major fundraiser food festival, and last Thursday evening at the Consulate General Office of Jamaica, Farm Up Jamaica, a non-profit organization held it media conference to launch its first drive of a "Jerk, Roots and Yam Festival." The food festival is slated to help struggling farmers in Jamaica, also young agriculturalist students who are enthusiastic about farming and want to be self-reliant.

Festival, he explained is an exposition for some of the food produce coming out of Jamaica and other Caribbean nations. The items utilize in the festival will be highly favoured Caribbean foods. The Food Festival is expected to help the Diaspora businesses who buy and sell Jamaican food items as well. These vendors participating in the festival will earmark and promote their food produce and their businesses. The food festival exposition will encourage food vendors to show their best displays, Curtis emphasized.

Farm Up Jamaica is also hoping to have the diaspora community members who are concern or passionate about agriculture galvanize on the importance of this matter, and work to help make a reduction, on the importation of foreign foods to Jamaica a realization. According to Curtis, the organization, through its research methods have identified onion as a produce that is imported from the United States, "we took a look at the growth of onion and learnt that over 90

In further explaining this situation, he said that Farm Up Jamaica will now assist onion farmers in Jamaica who have the land to produce. These farmers, he said, will work with young agriculturists who are enthusiastic about farming and are willing to take the steps to produce more than the nor-

> The organizers also hope that the June 11 event will help expose the Jamaican farmers to new possibilities for them to consider while engaging their work. Curtis said organic agriculture is at the top of the agenda for Farm Up Jamaica. He added that some research and testing are being done on locally grown foods including ginger. He said that some 200 at risk young people are involved in the process to have clean organic farming as part of this development. Some farmers in Jamaica are also asked to identify foods that are imported that can be grown at maximum capacity in Jamaica to help Jamaicans. Once



the foods are identified. Farm Up Jamaica will run tests and research ways on how to assist those farmers.

The artistes will all perform at the June 11 Food Festival at Roy Wilkins Park to help make their contribution to the struggling farmers in Jamaica.

Dr. Garvey, in his remarks at the media conference, said Farm Up Jamaica is one of the best ways to help build Jamaica. "Agriculture is the best place to start to help Jamaica's economy. Jamaica has the numbers to help promote our local foods and develop agriculture," Dr. Garvey noted. Farm Up Jamaica has also been introducing its organization and its work since the last four years to schools across Jamaica to help expose the students to a better understanding of agriculture.



Caribbean American politicians denounce limited TPS for Haitians

Two Caribbean American legislators in Brooklyn have denounced as woefully inadequate the limited extension of Temporary Protected Status (TPS) for undocumented Haitians living in the United States.

New York State Assemblywoman Rodneyse Bichotte, the daughter of Haitian immigrants, and New York City Assemblyman Jumaane Williams, the son of Grenadian immigrants, said on Wednesday, May 24 that the Trump administration's decision this week to extend TPS for six months, rather than 18 months. is an insult to nationals from the French-speaking Caribbean country.

"The extension for Haiti's TPS designation was needed, but the length of six months is not enough," said Bichotte, who represents the 42nd Assembly District in Brooklyn.

"It definitely begs the question, 'why would the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) only extend the designation for six months and not for 18 months, which has been the normal practice?"" asked Bichotte, the first Haitian American from New York City to be elected to New York State Assembly.

She said while the US' premise is that conditions have improved in Haiti, it is "patently false."

Bichotte noted that Haiti was struck by Hurricane Matthew last year, "the worst hurricane to hit Haiti in 52 years," and that the country is still experiencing a cholera epidemic, "which has killed nearly 10,000 people and made another 800,000 very sick."

"Combined, these two events have also resulted in extreme food insecurity on the island," she said, adding that the Trump administration "would have TPS recipients living in

us believe that most of the camps that were created for those displaced during the hurricane have been dishanded.

"That is true, however not because people have been provided with adequate housing but because they were forcibly closed due to large scale evictions by landowners," she pointed out. "Unfortunately, these evictions have mostly gone unchallenged.

"It has even gotten to the point that now several of the larger camps have been reclassified as 'permanent housing' simply because the residents had attached so much salvaged building material to their make-shift housing," Bichotte continued. Williams, who represents the 45th Council District in Brooklyn, said that the six-month extension, announced by DHS Secretary John F. Kelly on Monday, is unfathomable, stating that it puts the administration's "ignorance on full display — to believe that Haiti will be significantly better in six months.

"This also shows a continued lack of consideration on viewing immigrants humanely and forcing them to live under a continued cloud," he added, calling for continued unity and strategy in helping Haiti rebuild after a series of natural disasters, "and focus on how we can create a path to permanent residency for the thousands of Haitians, who now call the US home.

"I stand committed and ready to advocate for and with the Haitian community for the months and years to come," Williams affirmed.

Kelly said on Monday that the TPS extension is effective July 23, 2017 through Jan. 22, 2018.

But he warned that the six-month extension "should allow Haitian

the United States time to attain travel documents and make other necessary arrangements for their ultimate departure from the United States, and should also provide the Haitian government with the time it needs to prepare for the future repatriation of all current TPS recipients." Prior to the expiration of this limited six-month period, Kelly, however, said he will re-evaluate the designation for Haiti and decide anew whether extension, re-designation, or termination is warranted. But he maintained that Haitian TPS recipients, who do not have another immigration status, to use the time before Jan. 22, 2018 to "prepare for and arrange their departure from the United States — including proactively seeking travel documentation — or to apply for other immigration benefits for which they may be eligible."

With a decision looming on TPS for 58,000 undocumented Haitians living in the United States, a number of immigration lawyers in the United States had urged Haitians worried about deportation to start contingency plans.

At a forum in Miami on Friday, organized by the Haitian Lawyers Association and Haitian Women of Miami, at the Little Haiti Cultural Complex, lawyers and others said it's time for TPS holders to begin making contingency plans in the event that John Kelly had decided to end the program in January, according to the Miami Herald.

Bichotte pointed to reports last month that the Trump administration "was trying to characterize Haitians as criminals and people who cheated our welfare system."

But she said TPS recipients are ineligible for welfare benefits.

Caribbean exports increase

Washington, D.C.-based Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) says that after four consecutive years of contraction, Latin American and Caribbean exports returned to "a path of growth."

In the first quarter of 2017, the IDB said the value of goods exports increased 17 percent year-on-year, having contracted 2.9 percent in 2016.

The recovery was driven primarily by a rebound in commodity prices, according to an analysis conducted by the IDB using detailed data for 25 countries in the region.

The update to the annual report, Trade Trend Estimates of Latin America and the Caribbean," argues that, in 2016, regional exports followed a trend similar to that of world trade, "whereas the recovery observed in the beginning of 2017 was more intense."

"The trend reversal is great news for Latin America and the Caribbean. Yet, in the current context, one should not overestimate the drivers of this export expansion, which remain unstable and still restricted to a few regional economies," said Paolo Giordano, principal economist of the Integration and Trade Sector and coordinator of the report.

He said countries with a high share of oil and mineral products in their export supply posted the largest increases, due to the recovery in commodity markets.

Meanwhile, export volumes in the entire region registered only a slight acceleration of 2.2 percent on average, and real export growth was observed in just a few countries, Giordano said.

He said South American countries exhibited the strongest recovery, with an average export growth of 23 per-

Noteworthy in this group were the performances of Venezuela, with a 75 percent increase, followed by Peru with 39 percent, Ecuador with 34 percent, Colombia with 31 percent, and Brazil with 24 percent, the IDB said.

It said Mesoamerica (Mexico and Central America) and the Caribbean registered an expansion of 11 and 12 percent, respectively.

"The return to an export growth path marked the end of the longest trade recession in the region's recent history, which lasted 24 months," the IDB said.

Despite the expansion, it said the value of exports remains 10 percent below its peak registered in 2014.

Surviving childhood in the neighborhood

"The Cook Up: A Crack Rock Memoir" by D. Watkins c.2017, Grand Central \$14.99 / \$19.49 Canada 262 pages

Everything has a price.

You say you'll never sell your granddad's watch, your dream car, or that collectible you coveted because it's priceless — until it's not, because everything is for sale. But in "The Cook-Up" by D. Watkins, it may cost your entire life.

Around the country, headlines scream about a heroin epidemic every day. It's shocking, but what many (white) people don't know is that, as Watkins says, "if you're black and poor, the heroin epidemic has been around."

He should know. For a time, he sold drugs on the streets of Baltimore, where the average life ends so early that "We go through midlife crises at 15...

He was much younger than that when he saw his first shooting; much younger when he understood that drugs were as easy to get as oxygen. He idolized his big brother then; Bip was larger-than-life, a dealer who doted on Watkins and urged him to stay in

school. He wanted Bip to be proud of him, so when his brother was murdered just blocks from home, Watkins tried to stay in college but his heart wasn't in it. Instead, he created his own business with the contents of a safe Bip left him: miscellaneous items, a brick-anda-half of raw cocaine, guns, and thousands in cash.


With help from a childhood friend, Watkins cooked the cocaine into rocks to sell and as his clientele list grew, so did the number of workers he needed to stay one step ahead. His level of responsibility grew, too; Watkins made sure that folks in his neighborhood were fed, clothed, and safe. That took money, but there was plenty of it.

For months, Watkins and his boys had whatever wanted, the "fiends" had their highs, and cops looked the other way. Things were good until suddenly, Watkins looked around and into the future: he'd met a girl, and he needed to come up with an "exit strategy" for himself and one of his boys.

The problem was, he said, "dudes don't know when to leave the block alone."

The first thing you need to know about "The Cook Up" is found on its cover: Watkins himself is in shadow, on the bleakest of stoops, near a doorway covered in plywood. An inexplicable feeling of electricity, then, screams that what you're about to read is going to be raw, and it's right.

With a fascinating tone that sometimes seems impassioned, almost matter-of-fact, author D. Watkins writes about childhoods spent in poverty - his, and that of his friends — and the things it led them to do to survive. Read further, however, and you'll see that his quiet voice almost quivers with righteous anger and anguish as Watkins' story progresses to an ending that feels happy and perfect and depressing, all at the same time.



US issues advice on summer travel to the Caribbean

With the Memorial Day weekend kicking off the start of the summer travel season, the United States Customs and Border Protection (CBP) agency is inviting travelers to learn the guidelines concerning international arrival at any port of entry, particularly those arriving from international destinations into Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

At the ports of entry, CBP said its officers inspect passengers for compliance with United States immigration, customs and agriculture regulations, stating that the more international travelers know about what to expect, "the easier and quicker the process becomes."

In preparation for the summer travel season, CBP's San Juan Field Office issues an advisory to improve every visitor's experience when entering United States via the territories in the Carib-

"Programs such as Global Entry, expedite the arrivals process, but travelers can make their own experience better by being ready and aware of the requirements when entering the United States," said Vernon Foret, acting director of field operations for Puerto Rico andUnited States Virgin Islands (USVI).

"Tourists, US citizens (USC) and legal residents can take additional steps to smooth their arrivals process by familiarizing themselves with US rules and regulations before departing to avoid potential penalties and fines upon their return," CBP said.

On arrival to a United States port of entry, CBP said travelers must declare items they purchased and are carrying on return to the United States; items bought in duty-free shops, on a ship or on a plane; repairs or alterations to any items taken abroad and then brought back, even if the repairs / alterations were performed free of charge; items brought home for someone else; and items intended to sell or use in personal business, including business merchandise that was taken out of the United States on their trip.

In addition, CBP said individuals traveling abroad must have approved travel documents when returning home, such as a valid passport, United States Military ID with official orders, Merchant Mariner's Document for USC's on official maritime business, or permanent resident card for international air travel.

The Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative (WHTI) requires United States and Canadian citizens, age 16 and older, to present a "valid, acceptable travel document," such as a passport, a United States passport card, a "trusted traveler" card, permanent resident card or an enhanced driver's license that denotes both identity and citizenship when entering the United States by land or sea, CBP said.

It said United States citizens who board a cruise ship at a United States port within the Western Hemisphere and return to a United States port on the same ship (Closed Loop Cruises) may present a government issued photo ID, along with proof of citizenship (birth certificate, Consular report of Birth Abroad or Certificate of Naturalization.)

United States and Canadian citizens under age 16 may present a birth certificate or alternative proof of citizenship when entering by land or sea, CBP

It said all nationals or citizens of Visa Waiver Program (VWP) countries are required to have an approved Electronic System for Travel Authorization (ESTA) prior to boarding a carrier to travel by air or sea to the United States under the VWP.

CBP said ESTA applications may be submitted at any time prior to travel, and, once approved, generally will be valid for up to two years or until the applicant's passport expires, whichever comes first. Authorizations will be valid for multiple entries into the United States.

CBP recommends ESTA applications be submitted as soon as an applicant begins making travel plans.



Confessions of a Non-Ninja

Here's a minor confession. American Ninja Warrior is a national obsession and has been on the air for close to a decade. Despite this, I had no idea it existed until someone in my family shared this video of Kacy Katanzaro's 2014 run. My jaw gradually slacked to the floor as I watched.

But then the awe gradually subsided. In its place arose the thought that so readily occurs to all my fellow soft-bodied couch coaches: "It can't be THAT hard." This is, of course, the illusion someone at such a high level of athleticism creates - our minds just leap right over all the work and pain that goes into them making it seem so easy.

I was crestfallen to discover that I am out of excuses as Aviator Sports is apparently springboarding off their popular parkour program and will begin offering Ninja Warrior classes. They're in the process of building out a course containing many of the obstacles fans of the show will be familiar with - Warped Wall, Cannonball Alley, Cargo Net, etc. – and plan to start introducing Ninja Warrior elements into their parkour classes in April with an eye toward doing a combined class in the summer and possibly offering separate Ninja Warrior classes in September.

So back to that "work and pain" thing. I wondered what training to run a Ninja Warrior obstacle course would look like aside from lots of falling down - so I spoke with Gymnastics Manager Jenn Dooley and instructor Thomas Dolan, who are working on building the Ninja Warrior program.

Depending on age (students can be age 5 to adult), classes will run one hour or 1.5 hours. They'll start with warm-up and stretches (mostly arms and shoulders) and move into going through the course one obstacle at a time. The final 20-30 minutes will be devoted to going through the course. While the parkour classes also utilize obstacle courses and timed runs as part of their training, the Ninja Warrior classes focus on completing specific unique and

challenging obstacles with the end goal of making it all the way through the course without falling.

In addition, there are some features Aviator has that other facilities don't. One is their foam pit and trampoline into the foam pit. Another is their relationship with USA Gymnastics, as Jenn explained:

"We've been members of USA Gymnastics since we've opened — so the past 10 years. And USA Gymnastics has been working with Drew Drechsel, who's known as The Real Life Ninja. We've taken a lot of the information from USA Gymnastics – from their partnership, going to conferences and conventions – directly from him. It's just kind of fit in here very well. It's great to have both in the same facility – Ninja Warrior and the gymnastics program."

Thomas adds: "All of our parkour and Ninja Warrior coaches have been practicing for many years - most of us over a decade - and are extremely passionate about movement of all forms. We're excited that

we can now introduce a new generation of students to these activities that have meant so much to us growing up!"

The main difference between the parkour and Ninja Warrior classes is that the parkour class is meant to prepare students for any type of obstacle they encounter by developing strength and speed while Ninja Warrior is focused on practice for specific, unique obstacles. If keeping it loose is more your speed, they have a fully modular parkour setup and change it up every couple of


Unfortunately, their parkour classes are currently full, but I'll definitely be keeping an eye on their site. They're going to be offering a 6-week introductory class in the spring in anticipation of ramping up their Ninja Warrior
































space shuttle at Kennedy Space Center. In 2004 she was a finalist for astronaut training and came close to actually going into space when she was

shortlisted in NASA's astronaut selection program.

Alleyne served as the manager of testing and is reputed for designing and developing space vehicles, most particularly the Orion crew exploration vehicle, which is designed to carry astronauts to the moon, Mars, and beyond.

She is currently the assistant program scientist for the International Space Station, where she helps the ISS develop programs to attract students to STEM fields and communicates the findings at the ISS to stakeholders and the public.

Reportedly in 2011 she was invited

by Trinidad & Tobago's National Institute of Higher Education, Research, Science and Technology (NIHERST) to keynote the gathering of the tenth annual Caribbean Youth Science Forum.

The twin-island organization named Alleyne one of its "Caribbean Icons in Science, Technology, and Innovation."

Didacus Jules, director general of the OECS Dr. has strongly endorsed her initiative, saying that "the OECS Education Strategy is committed to gender equality, and that the promotion of science, technology, engineering and maths was an important element in the educational formation of young Caribbean women."

"We are hopeful that this will ignite a passion for the sciences among our girls," he said.







Benefits of growing older

Financial perks: Seniors are entitled to discounts on meals, museum entry fees, movies, and other entertainment if they're willing to disclose their ages. The U.S. National Park Service offers citizens age 62 and older lifetime passes to more than 2,000 federal recreation sites for just \$10 in person (\$20 online or via mail).

Reasoning and problemsolving skills: Brain scans reveal that older adults are more likely to use both hemispheres of their brans simultaneously — something called bilateralization. This can sharpen reasoning skills. Cataract surgery effective

for cataracts increases. Starting at age 50, cataract risk rises, and that risk only grows more significant as people get older. The National Eye Institute predicts that, by the year 2050, 50.2 million Americans will experience cataracts.

The lens of the eye is normally clear, but as a person ages, the lenses can begin to cloud and lead to impaired vision. Cataracts can cause blurry vision and increase the glare from lights, affecting how a person can manage daily activities. They also may make it more difficult for eye doctors to examine the back of the eye during routine visits to detect conditions such as age-related macular degeneration or diabetic retinopathy.

Eye experts routinely recommend surgery when cataracts interfere with daily activities, such as driving, watching television, or even reading medication bottles. Surgery is a safe and common way to treat cataracts.

The American Optometric Association says cataract surgery involves the removal of the natural lens of the eye, which is replaced with an artifical lens. This clear, plastic intraocular lens requires no special maintenance and is designed to properly focus. In many cases, the eve doctor will make a small incision in the side

s men and women age, their risk of the cornea, where he or she inserts a tiny probe. This device will use ultrasound waves to soften and break up the lens into small pieces, which are removed by suction in a process known as phacoemulsification. The cataract lens is removed, but the thin, outer layers of the lens, called the lens capsule, are not touched. Afterward, the plastic lens is placed in the lens capsule.

> If the cataracts have advanced and phacoemulsification is not an option, the eye doctor will have to find another way to remove the lens.

> The intraocular lens used may be monofocal, fixed-focus, accommodating, and multifocal lenses, and which type of lens is best for a patient's needs will be determined by the eve doctor.

> Cataract surgery may only take 15 minutes, though patients will likely spend more time at the surgical facility to allow for prep time and post-operative evaluation. Recovery will involve the use of medicated eye drops several times daily, and a protective eye shield should be used while sleeping.

As the eye recovers, a special pair of post-operative sunglasses are required to protect the eyes from bright light. Eye doctors also advise patients to avoid strenuous activity, including exercise, for at least the first week of recovery.





Moving tips

Sending a parent to an out-of-state nursing home

Monica's mother was living in Florida when she fell and broke her hip. She was treated at a local hospital, and then sent her to a rehab facility to recover. There is a good chance that she will not regain full mobility and might need to move into a nursing home. Monica, who lives in Queens, wants her mother closer to her and hopes to transfer her into a rehab/nursing facility in the New York City area.

Monica's situation is not unusual. Many adult children want their frail parents closer to them. However, the situation and procedures often overwhelm them.

What are the steps that need to be taken? Is there a residency requirement to move a parent between state nursing homes? Will a parent's medical insurance transfer?

The good news is an out-of-state transfer can be done, but there are certain guidelines that must be followed. Here are seven steps that need to be taken:

1. Select a desirable facility. Before making a move, you must identify a few facilities where you would like your parent to live. There are several tools for evaluating nursing homes. One government website, Medicare Compare, rates nursing homes on a series of factors such as size of staff, cleanliness, and safety. Other sites, including Yelp.com, offer individuals the opportunity to air their personal impressions about specific nursing homes.

2. Apply to the out-of-state facilities. Ask the admissions staff at the current facility to send a Patient Review Instrument to each of the selected nursing homes. This is the standard medical assessment tool that summarizes a patient's condition and needs. The desired facility will evaluate your parent's care, determine if it can fulfill them, and if it have a bed available. Once the parent is accepted in a facility you can move on to the next step.

3.Transfer the primary health insurance. Most people aged 65 and older are covered by two insurance policies — Medicare, which is the primary insurance, and a secondary insurance that covers supplemental costs and services not covered by Medicare. Medicare is the federal government's health insurance program for older adults. It covers doctor care, hospital care, and 80 percent of in-rehab care. Medicare is managed by the federal government and is viable in all states.

4.Transfer the secondary insurance. Some secondary insurances are nation-wide programs and can easily be transferred between states. Other

programs, including Medicaid, are not. Medicaid is a program that pays for healthcare for people with low income/assets. It is a federal program but is overseen by individual states. Each state decides on its own eligibility requirements determined in part by a state's cost of living. In some instances a person might be eligible for Medicaid in one state and not in another. For this reason Medicaid cannot automatically be transferred. A person must drop one plan when she leaves a state and reapply in the new one.

5.Apply for Medicaid in a new state. A person cannot be eligible for Medicaid in two states at the same time. A resident must first close out her Medicaid coverage in one state before applying in another. It is usually best to dis-enroll at the end of the month, because it takes until than to end Medicaid coverage.

6. Understand Medicaid residency requirements. As soon as a parent is in the new nursing facility, she can apply for that state's Medicaid program. Unlike residency restrictions for voting, federal law prohibits a residency requirement to apply for Medicaid. This means a person is eligible for Medicaid immediately upon moving to a new state. The new nursing home can help with the application process. Medicaid acceptance might take as long as 90 days, but this should not a determent. Medicaid coverage is retroactive to the date of application. This means a nursing home cannot turn you down if your Medicaid registration is still pending.

7. Move to the out-of-state residence. The move between two facilities is the easiest part of the total process. This can be coordinated through the nursing homes. It can be done by employing an ambulette to transport the patient or by having the patient escorted to her new location by plane.

Moving a parent between state nursing homes can seen like a formidable task, and in some way it is. It takes careful planning and coordination. Fortunately, all the steps are possible and with help from the nursing homes and knowledgeable professionals, the job can be accomplished smoothly and effectively.

ARE YOU HAVING TROUBLE SLEEPING?

As soon as I walked into the office, my doctor knew immediately that I was having difficulty sleeping. He pointed out the downward tilt of my head and the fact that I was waking up multiple times a night. He could even perfectly describe the pain, numbness, and tingling sensation I was experiencing in my upper extremities.

We all know that sleep is critical to good health, vital to restoring mental acuity, and is needed to ensure a proper immune response. Its role in our ability to perform our everyday activities cannot be stressed enough. Adult insomnia costs the United States almost 14 billion dollars a year. In children, sleep deprivation contributes to a wide range of health issues, including attention deficit disorder, mood disturbances, and memory problems. Overall, sleep ailments contribute to absenteeism, poor job or school performance, and an increase in car and machine accidents.

The good news is that there is plenty that we can do to improve our sleep. Reduce your risk of falls

■alls are one of the biggest contributors to fatal and nonfatal injuries among seniors. Such accidents not only threaten safety, but they also can compromise a person's independence. Falls can cause broken bones, impaired mobility, and even death.

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says every 13 seconds an older adult is treated in the emergency room for a fall. In addition, every 20 minutes an older adult dies from a fall. One-third of Americans age 65 and older falls each year. Falls do not have to be an accepted side effect of aging. With some balance training and other techniques, older men and women can avoid falls and the injuries that result.

The National Council on Aging and its National Falls Prevention Resource Center have implemented fall-prevention programs. By following these guidelines, individuals can remain safe and upright:

Get a vision check-up. A decrease in visual ability and perception can increase risk of falls. Impaired vision can cause people to trip over items they can't see, miss steps, or bump into obstacles. Make sure your vision has been checked recently and you are using contact lenses or glasses as prescribed by an eye doctor.

Know your medication side effects. Ask your doctor about the medications you are taking and whether they can contribute to dizziness or decreased balance. Medicines that affect blood pressure can lead to light-headedness as well. Your doctor may be able to substitute a medication with an alternative if your existing prescription is affecting your balance.

Begin a regimen of strength training. The National Institutes of Health suggests strength exercises to keep muscles strong. Strength training also can impact the strength of bones, as well as increase metabolism to keep weight and blood sugar in check.

Engage in specific balance exercises. Balance exercises can improve stability. Balancing on one foot while standing for a period of time is one such exercise. Stand up from a seated position without using your hands, then shift your weight from the left to the right while standing on the respective leg on that side. A physical therapist can work with you to ensure you are using correct form in balance exercises.

Try tai chi. Look for tai chi classes at a gym or senior center. Tai chi is a form of movement training that can help strengthen the body, improve balance, and improve flexibility.

Estate planning is one of the most important steps a person can take to make sure that their final property and health care wishes are honored, and that loved ones are provided for in their absence. Though often overlooked or put off in favor of more immediate concerns, a comprehensive estate plan can resolve a number of legal questions that arise whenever anyone dies.

Trusts have become an integral part in estate planning. A trust is a fiduciary arrangement that allows a third party (a "trustee") to hold and manage the assets of the creator of the trust (the "grantor") on behalf of the grantor's beneficiaries. Trusts can specify exactly how and when the assets pass to the beneficiaries. Trusts are used for minimizing estate taxes and can offer

other benefits as part of a wellcrafted estate plan. Some of those other benefits include:

- Controlling Wealth. With a trust, a grantor can specify the terms of the trust and control when and to whom distributions may be made. A trust can also be set up as a revocable trust so that the trust assets remain accessible to the grantor during his or her lifetime while designating to whom the remaining assets will pass thereafter.
- Wealth Protection. A properly constructed trust can help protect an estate from creditors of the estate's heirs or from beneficiaries who are not able to manage money responsibly.
- Privacy. A person's last will and testament is a public document (after filing with the courts) and a matter of public record. However, a trust is a private document and may allow assets to pass outside of the court system and remain pri-

Special Trust for the Elderly

University's Professor Rod Walker, Professor Robert van Niekirk, Professor S. Naidu and Professor M. Hendricks, they said the reason Johnson was named was because they wanted to recognize his "seminal contribution, through poetry and music, to decolonize the English language and the English literary canon."

Popularly known as LKJ, he has always maintained that for him "writing was a political act and poetry was a cultural weapon"

Since arriving in Brixton in the early 60s LKJ has tackled British foreign policy, the pervasive racism there and police brutality.

Incorporating words, sound and music, he relentlessly railed against the governance of Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher through recitations he penned with titles such as: "Inglan Is A Bitch," "Sonny's Lettah" (police brutality) "Letter Fi Dada" (about the death of his father in 1982) and others.

His homage to Caribbean immigrants in Britain — "It Is No Mystery...We're Making History" emerged more than syncopated poetic rhythms but classic commentary phrased by Jamaica's patois.

Asian-Americans are often referred to as the "model minority" because of their success in the U.S. despite the existence of discrimination which has crippled other ethnic groups. However, the label has also led many a racist to misread Asian modesty as an invitation to treat them like doormats.

Consider the serious rudeness done to Dr. David Dao, the Vietnamese-American physician who was beaten to a pulp by the police and dragged off an airplane for refusing to surrender a seat that he'd paid for to a United Airlines employee flying for free. Lost in the sauce was the fact he and his family were

very likely selected because of the color of their skin. After all, the airline employee probably specifically targeted the Dao family never expecting members of the model minority to put up much of a fuss about getting bumped.

"Abacus: Small Enough to

Jail" is a jaw-dropping documentary which chronicles an equally-outrageous example of bigotry, this time against the Sungs, a clan of Chinese-American immigrants. Inspired by the classic film "It's a Wonderful Life," family Patriarch Thomas Sung founded Abacus

Federal Savings Bank in 1984 in the heart of New York City's Chinatown.

He was motivated to help his community after repeatedly witnessing how other lending institutions were willing take Chinese people's deposits, but were very hesitant to let them borrow any money. Abacus flourished over the years, and his daughters, Jill and Heather, joined the family business as executives after becoming lawyers.

The world came crashing down around them all when the bank and 19 of its employees were charged with conspiracy, larceny and fraud in the wake of of the 2008 subprime mortgage crisis. What's stunning is that Abacus was the only financial institution the government ever held responsible criminally for the collapse of the mortgage market. Furthermore, the case was based entirely on evidence which Abacus itself had turned over to federal regulators upon unearthing felonious behavior on the part of a loan officer it fired on the spot.

Was the ensuing prosecution malicious or warranted? Judge for yourself. But don't be surprised if this chilling expose leaves you convinced the Sungs were innocent victims of a thoroughly corrupt legal system doling out "justice" in color-coded fashion, even when it comes to white-collar crime.







Back to Brooklyn: Blackbirds point guard withdraws from NBA draft

He tested the waters, and decided to return to the Blackbirds' nest.

Long Island University freshman point guard Jashaun Agosto officially announced his decision to withdraw from the National Basketball Association draft on May 24, posting a statement on Twitter

"I have decided to pull my name out of the NBA Draft 2017," Agosto tweeted. "I'm very confident in coach [Derek] Kellogg and I love my teammates and the fans at LIU Brooklyn. I want to thank the NBA scouts, agents & coaches for giving me the opportunity to experience the process."

Agosto was one of 182 players who filed in April as early-entry candidates for the 2017 draft. That decision gave him several different options regarding the future of his game; allowing him to work out in front of professional teams and scouts with-

out requiring him to hire an agent. It also left Agosto free to return to the Blackbirds if he felt his draft prospects weren't exactly where he wanted them to be. To maintain his college eligibility, he was required to withdraw from the draft by May 24.

"The feedback has been helpful as I realize the exciting reality, which I'm ready to embrace, that it won't be easy or handed to me," Agosto tweeted. "My mission is to help my team win and be a role model like all the great point guards before me.'

Agosto, a 5-foot-11 guard from Seattle, Washington, had a dominant rookie year with the Blackbirds last winter, appearing in 31 games, averaging 33 minutes, 11.2 points, 3.2 assists and 2.1 rebounds a game. He was one of the most efficient shooters on the Blackbirds' roster, connecting on 41.4 percent of his field goal attempts.

The offseason hasn't been easy for LIU-Brooklyn; the his skills, and his determina-

squad fell to Robert Morris in the first round of the Northeast Conference tournament, and shortly afterward fired coach Jack Perri.

It took several weeks for the school to hire new coach Derek Kellogg, and Agosto's decision to return to Brooklyn - and continue to direct the Blackbirds' offense — is as big an offseason win as Kellogg could have hoped for.

"Can't wait to coach you and go on this run together!!!" Kellogg tweeted in response to Agosto's decision.

Agosto was named to the conference All-Rookie team last season, but the former two-time state champion is far from satisfied. He's got his sights set on a pro career and while he might be tempering his expectations for now, he's hardly slowing down. In fact, just a day after announcing his decision to return to school, Agosto posted a new workout video on Twitter, showcasing






