\$3 M for low income housing

Brooklyn Borough President Eric L. Adams on Tuesday celebrated his Fiscal Year 2019 (FY19) capital budget allocation of \$3,026,000 for affordable housing across the borough. supporting the development and maintenance of more than 550 new and existing units across Brooklyn.

The funding, which brings his affordable housing capital investment since the beginning of his administration to more than \$20 million, includes grants to create and preserve

low-income housing for seniors, support for those in need. formerly homeless individuals and families, as well as to help develop community facility, communal and green roof spaces.

Adams made the announcement in Sea Gate at the site of Abraham Residence I, a 75-unit single room occupancy independent living facility for formerly homeless seniors 55 years of age and older.

Adams said the residence is managed by Met Council, the country's largest Jewish community organization providing

"Brooklynites need more than a home for the holidays; our borough needs affordable housing year-round," he said. "We need to protect our vulnerable populations fighting to stay in their homes, like the elderly, the poor, veterans, and the disabled.

People should not have to be forced to leave their homes, because they cannot afford to live in their neighborhoods where they have lived for decades," he added. "My administration will continue to robustly

PUT TO THE TEST

Guyana's government faces no confidence vote

Just as the country is preparing for the start of oil production in the last quarter of 2019, Guyana's multiparty coalition government will first have to survive a spirited opposition parliamentary no confidence motion that is set for debate before Christmas if it wants to enjoy the financial windfall from its fledgling petroleum

Since it won general elections in May of 2015, the administration of President David Granger has been running the Caribbean community's largest member state with a wafer thin, one seat majority in the 65-seat assembly.

But its resolve to stay together as a government for its full five-year term until 2020 will be tested to the maximum when the assembly debates the motion brought by the opposition People's Progressive Party

(PPP) in the week before Christ-


The opposition had been pushing to have the debate and vote held before lawmakers had considered the 2019 budget but lost in its bid. The two weeks of budget debates ended last Friday and all attention will now be turned to preparations for the no confidence debate and vote. Government officials are giving every indication that the opposition bid will fail but they are nevertheless keeping a watchful eye on every single lawmaker to ensure that they vote no.

Every representative, especially those from outlying regions in the interior, will be brought to the city and housed in a hotel, if necessary, to ensure they are physically present and prepared to vote for survival. Others who were on the coalition's list of electors back in

Vincy group launches scholarship fund

In an elaborate ceremony at Brooklyn's Medgar Evers College, the Brooklyn-based St. Vincent and the Grenadines Diaspora Committee of New York, Inc. recently launched the Maxwell Haywood Scholarship and Development Fund.

The fund was established after the passing, on Nov. 17, 2017, of the group's founding chairman, Maxwell Haywood, a Vincentian community activist in Brooklyn and an alumnus of Medgar Evers College.

According to Haywood's widow, Sherill-Ann Mason-Haywood, who succeeded Haywood as chairperson of the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Diaspora Committee of New York, Inc., the fund seeks to advance Haywood's work and to "preserve his legacy through the provision of scholarships to secondary school and college students in St. Vincent and the Grenadines and New York."

Mrs. Mason-Haywood also said the fund's goal is aimed at "the delivery of informational and educational lectures, forums and workshops focused on the issues of Diasporas, migration and development."

Scholarships from the fund have already been distributed to two young students in St. Vincent and the Grenadines — Trevon Paul, attending the St. Vincent Grammar School, and Alfresco Lampkin, attending the Thomas Saunders Secondary School, for the academic year 2018-2019, Mrs. Mason-

"This evening, we recognize Maxwell, and we give thanks for his service," he said.

In bringing greetings from Medgar Evers College President Dr. Rudolph Crew and Provost and Senior Vice President, Dr. Augustine Okereke, Associate Provost, Dr. Gladys Schrynemakers, said the predominantly Black college, with an overwhelming Caribbean and Caribbean American student population, was "delighted to host the SVG Diaspora Committee of New York to start a tradition that will honor one of Medgar Evers College's sons, Maxwell Fitz-Osbourne Haywood.

New group wants to close educational disconnect

A newly formed organization is trying to close a gap between the school system and parents with hands-on informative workshops. The Brooklyn-based group, No Rest Until Success, is a generous organization that aims to raise educational awareness, by assisting families struggling to provide their children with schoolwork with resources.

Co-founded earlier this year by East Flatbush-raised educator, Dr. Anesha Fuller, the creation of the organization was inspired by the high school teacher's desire to fix a flaw she noticed, and observations she often made throughout her years as a public school teacher.

"Part of my doctorate dissertation was geared towards a literacy curriculum and to see if a school's literacy program was rigorous enough to match the common core and learning standards, and as I did my research I saw that there was a growing crisis with reading and writing," she said.

After increasingly witnessing repeated instances in the literacy habits of many students, she realized that several factors were likely contributors to the trend.

"In my overall experience as teacher, I started to see a massive crisis in students not writing properly," she said.

She said the daily use and growth of the smartphone are beneficial in many ways, but it comes with several cons that changes how everyone, and particularly the youth, communicate both online and to a great extent in school. "Many people struggle with writing standard English, and they've become so effective with high-tech phones and everything social media, that they are so reliant on the many apps that do it," said Fuller. "But when it's time to do the work, they can't produce it because they don't have the app." And the downside is students are continuing down this path from elementary school into high school, according to Fuller.

"They are transitioning into high school and they don't have the proper fundamentals to succeed in high school because they can't read or write properly," she said.

She said this was partly the reason why high schoolers were taking state tests such as the Regents examination, more than once, when these assessments were designed to be taken and passed on the first try. But for Fuller, she believes in the power of community philanthropy and says her organization not only wants to help students achieve great success, but more importantly wants to also help the people that can guide them at home — the parents. She said some parents need help too.

"What I realized is that parents want to help their kids, but their number one problem is they don't know how," said Fuller

Often times, other community-based organizations are more focused on gun violence and shelter housing, and not enough are geared to education, said Fuller. But feeling like more could be done, she decided to form a non-profit that would be committed to offering free workshops and programs for families.

The format of the workshop includes teacher and volunteers showing attendees information that teachers know and apply in the classroom, and how they too can use for themselves. She uses word of mouth and social media to get the word out about the organization and what services they provide.

Fuller said she was well-versed in this subject and felt others should be too.

"I see the need and I'm able to do it, so I do it and share what I know," said Fuller. "It's not taking anything from me to share the knowledge that I have because our children aren't reading or writing properly, and they're failing and struggling, and no one is saying anything about it."

Barbados

President of the Barbados' Prison Officers Association pleaded not guilty of encouraging four other prison offic-

ers to stay off the job in May this year when he appeared in court recently.



Trevor Browne, who

has been in the Prison Service for 34 years was granted Bds \$1,000 bail when he appeared in court.

It is alleged that between May 1 and 9, he maliciously endeavored to seduce prison officers Shanell Ellis-Vaughn, Ophneal Austin and Stephenson Trotman from their duties.

Browne was charged under Section 27, Chapter 168 of the Prison Act, which states that, "any person, who directly or indirectly instigates, commands, counsels or solicits any meeting, sedition or disobedience to any lawful command of a prison officer or seduce any prison officer from his allegiance or duty, shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to imprisonment for one year.

Browne will return to court on Feb. 18 next year.

Caribbean

The Caribbean Court of Justice (CCJ) based in Port of Spain, Trinidad said it has this year delivered the highest number of judgements in a calendar year since it began its operation in 2005.

The CCJ, which was established in 2001 to replace the London-based Privy Council as the regional final court, said that it had issued 34 judgements and reasons for decisions in 2018.

"Throughout that period, the CCJ also heard 28 new matters in both its original and its appellate jurisdic-



tions," the court said, noting that its term ends on Monday, Dec. 17, 2918.

The CCJ said its last hearing for the year was involved a case from Barbados, where Renaldo Alleyne, who was convicted of manslaughter after six young women died when the Campus Trendz all was firebombed during a robbery in 2010, is appealing the six concurrent life sentences imposed by the court in Barbados.

The CCJ said that it is also preparing for the staging of its fifth biennial conference to be held in Jamaica from Dec. 13, in partnership with the General Legal Council.

The conference is being presented with the support of the Judicial Reform and Institutional Strengthening Project, the Caribbean Development Bank, CaribExport and Scotia Bank of Jamaica.

Guyana

The Guyana government has received a copy of the report on the Fly Jamaica landing incident at the Cheddi Jagan International Airport recently, Minister of State Joseph Harmon said.

The plane, carrying 118 passengers and eight crew members, was forced to make an emergency landing on November 9, 2018,



minutes after it had taken off for Can-

The plane had on board 35 Guyanese, one Trinidadian, 82 Canadians, one Pakistani and 11 American citizens. Six passengers suffered minor injuries and were treated at hospital and later discharged.

Harmon said the Minister of Public Infrastructure David Patterson had presented the report to Cabinet.

Meanwhile, passengers on the aircraft have filed a class-action lawsuit against the airline alleging physical harm and loss of personal belongings.

The lawsuit, which was recently filed, calls for "just compensation" for passengers and their families — 82 of them

Canadians — but did not specify how much the group is seeking.

Jamaica

The Jamaica government is moving to ban the sale of sugary drinks at schools across the country from next year.

The government has issued guidelines, which will facilitate the sale of beverages in schools that contains sugar.

According to the Interim Guidelines for Beverages in School which as laid in Parliament recently, as of 2019, beverages containing more than six grams of sugar per 100 milliliters will no longer be allowed at public educational institutions.

The guidelines, which will take effect from Jan. 1, 2019, will prohibit sugar-

sweetened beverages being sold or served to students up to 18 yearsold in and around early childhood, primary



and secondary-level educational institutions.

The guidelines also covers companies and groups involved in the provision of beverages to public schools, including canteen operators, vendors and teach-

ers.

Health Minister Dr. Christopher Tufton, told legislators that beverages brought from home are not included in the guidelines and that the restrictions on sugar-sweetened beverages will be applicable during school hours and special school activities.

St. Vincent

The St. Vincent Geothermal Company Limited (SVGCL) has signed a contract with the Iceland Drilling Company, IDC (Jardbornir hf) to drill four wells on the island.

The wells are intended to supply steam for the geothermal power plant SVGCL is constructing.

The project aims to deliver a 10 megawatt geothermal power plant transforming SVG energy sector, reducing its dependency on imported fuel and providing a new sustainable and affordable course of energy based on an indigenous resource.

Once operational, the plant will supply all of the island's baseload power and bring renewable ener-



gy sources to 73 percent of total power

Justice Ingrid Joseph proud to sit on judicial bench

Guyanese-born Ingrid Joseph says she's "privileged and blessed" that she gets "to do work that I love" by sitting on the judicial bench in Brooklyn and Queens.

Joseph — who was elected as a Supreme Court Justice of the State of New York during the Midterm Elections on Nov. 6, for a 14-year-term, which begins on Jan. 2, 2019 and ends Dec. 31, 2033 — said her plan, as a judge, is "to do justice wherever I can.

"To give everyone who appears before me an opportunity to be heard and to render decisions that are thoughtful, fair, balanced and in keeping with the law," she told Caribbean Life in an exclusive interview on Friday, Dec. 7.

"I choose the law as my career because I like helping to solve problems, and I wanted to be a judge because the courts are often the only avenue some people have to address societal issues," Justice Joseph added. "I also like the intellectual challenge of mastering new areas of the law and using it to render

"When I sit on the bench, Justice I represent first and foremost the members of the Joseph family; then I am a woman, a Caribbean / South American / Afro American / and a fivefooter; but, mostly, I represent someone who wants to help to resolve the issues of the community," she continued.

Joseph was first elected as a countywide judge to the Civil Court in 2008. That Civil Court seat was slated as vacancy 18 on the ballot in the Democratic Primary Election on Sept. 13.

There were two incumbents (current sitting judges) seeking re-election to Countywide Civil Court seats: Joseph and Loren Bailey. The contenders for those seats were Sheryl Orwell and Saul Cohen.

According to the Board of Elections' Unofficial Election Night Results, a total of 388,119 votes were cast. Joseph received 133,372 votes; Bailey 118,520; 88,366 votes and Cohen 45,995 votes; with 1866 write-in votes.

After her first election in 2008, Joseph said she began her tenure as a judge in Janu-

and nine months before her re-election.

During her 10 years in Civil Court in Brooklyn and Queens, Joseph said she presided over cases (personal injury trials and motions, name changes and small claims); Family court ary 2009, serving for nine years in Brooklyn (custody and visi-

tation); and the Supreme Court in Brooklyn (matrimonial).

In addition to her duties as a civil court judge, Joseph said she was appointed acting justice of the Supreme Court in 2012, working for seven years in that capacity.

She was promoted to super-

vising judge of the Civil Court in January 2017.

Prior to becoming a judge, Joseph was a principal law clerk, primarily for two Supreme Court Justices, Nicholas Clemente and Mark Partnow, working primarily in working primarily in the areas of medical malpractice and personal injury.

Joseph, who resided in Georgetown, the Guvanese capital, before migrating to the US, graduated with honors from Prospect Heights High School in Brooklyn.

She was awarded a Bachelor of Arts Degree (cum laude) from John Jay College of Criminal Justice, City University of New York, and received a Doctor of Jurisprudence degree from New York Law school.

She began her legal career at two law firms, where she handled wills and provided legal estate planning services to cli-

Justice Joseph said she also served as an adjunct professor at Borough of Manhattan Community College, where she shared her knowledge and love of the law with students.

Medical ganja for Barbados

Barbados is suddenly and rapidly moving towards legalising use of marijuana in the medicinal form, but its recreational uses will have to take a back seat until the entire population has a formal say in the matter through

Following years of resistance mainly by the religious community supported by some in the legal fraternity and educators, all who were loud in condemnation at the notion of ganja use in any form, the Prime Minister of Barbados of just under six months has announced that a mechanism is being put in place for medical marijuana to be legally prescribed on the island.

'There is no doubt that we will put a framework in place for medical cannabis within the next week or so. In fact, we have ... taken a decision, we just need some refining and training with practitioners," the Barbados TODAY newspaper reported Mottley saying over the weekend.

Against the backdrop of a customary loud disdainful reaction by the powerful religious community in this traditionally devoutly Christian community,

Mottley's announcement served as a broadside on the ganja nay-

She added that legal use of the plant for recreational purposes will be decided down the road through a referendum.

Her announcement of the imminent introduction of medical marijuana should come as relief to many Barbadians who have publicly complained of their inability to get access to this drug for therapeutic relief despite having it recommended by their doctors.

But Mottley is also seeing the business side of granting the plant, or its extract legal status in Barbados, the domicile of many offshore companies that are funding marijuana start-up corporations in other countries where its use is legal.

"You cannot have your primary market which is Canada, the international business and financial services sector moving rapidly into new areas of investment and you can't match as a domicile, the ability to accommodate those new areas of investment because if you don't what are they going to do? Go elsewhere," she said.

Two days following that online publication's revelations the Nation newspapers reported acting Chief Medical Officer, Dr. Kenneth George confirming that the authorising agency, the Ministry of Health, was well on its way to approving medicinal marijuana.

George reportedly said that cannabanoids, a marijuana extract is the first drug to be granted legal use on the island.

Cannabanoids are associated with pain relief and elation that help a patient in recovery.

The ministry [of Health] will be focused on the use of cannabanoids in very specific conditions," Dr. George said, adding, "research has shown there is some therapeutic benefit. And with any drug, we realise there needs to be a predictable mechanism, duration of action and predictable side effects."

'We expect medical marijuana will be given the same type of safeguards (as Schedule 1 drugs) to protect the population and the persons who will dispense the drug," George said.

"We prefer to have a core group of persons who are recognised by the fraternity to be the



Petrotrin cries felt by fired UTT lecturers

The heartbreak felt by ex-Petrotrin workers was the same that was experienced by retrenched University of Trinidad and Tobago (UTT) lecturers who were sent home earlier this year.

On May 11, 2018, the only national university in Trinidad and Tobago (T&T) sacked 59 of its lecturers as part of a reported restructuring exercise. Six months later, on November 30, the national oil company was officially closed and all of its 8,000 workers were sent packing.

UTT lecturers were the first casualties of a state entity this year. Petrotrin workers were next, followed by Telecommunications Services of Trinidad and Tobago (TSTT) employees. In all three state entities, workers were sacrificed due to poor decisions made by Board members and managers.

Richardson Dhalai of Newsday (1/12/18) reported: "The day began on a sombre note as Petrotrin employees reported for duties for the last time, gloom etched on their faces as they drove hesitantly through the gates leading to the company's administrative offices. The atmosphere could almost be likened to a wake [vigil] as there was no chatter with Petrotrin's estate police officers who traditionally manned the gates."

Dhalai added that "temporary worker Khalifa Phillip could hardly contain her grief and her voice cracked several

times while her eyes welled with tears as she said temporary workers had been thrown on the pavement by the company."

"There has been no communication to us on a personal level, not a phone call, not an email, not a letter saying that there will no longer be a company. No respect. We are not being treated with dignity, we have the same bills as everybody. We have rent, we have children to feed, this was our livelihood.

'We were told nobody would be thrown in the bamboo, nobody would be on the pavement. That is exactly where I feel I am today. I am one of the 600 who they said would [not] have to suffer. I am one-month shy of 14 years in Petrotrin and I really feel neglected and ignored by the state."

Dhalai wrote: "Two other temporary workers who were sitting in the audience echoed Phillips's words as tears rolled down their faces."

Power and sexual abuse: The danger of doubling

Stockholm / Rome, Dec. 10, 2018 (IPS) — Several celebrities use their power to insult or take advantage of women. We read about sexual abuse from men like Harvey Weinsten, Bill O'Reilly, Leslie Moonves, Jeffrey Epstein, Bill Cosby, R. Kelly, Dennis Hastert, Robert Packwood, Roger Ailes, James Levine, Hans Hermann Groër, Marcial Maciel, Justin Forsyth, Ruud Lubbers, Dominique Strauss-Kahn, Bill Clinton, Silvio Berlusconi and Donald Trump. The list is just a sample of an extensive catalogue of Western men accused of abusing women, using their fame, fortune and power to exploit and humiliate them. Unfortunately, misogyny, contempt of and prejudice against women and girls, may even be characterized as a cultural universal, an element, pattern, trait, or institution that is common to all human cultures worldwide.

Humans are herd animals. We depend on relations with other humans, a dependency that seldom is equal. Every moment of our lives we suffer subjugation - under parents, teachers, colleagues, bosses and government officials, at the same time as we might have power over others. Power may act as poison. Several persons I have been acquainted with and who reached powerful positions have changed completely, poisoned by their elevation above other human beings. Several imagined they earned their position though intelligence, hard work and charm; outstanding qualities that distinguished them Misogyny,

from others, especially those who are dependent on these formidable leaders

formidable leaders. Endorphins, oxytocin, dopamine and serotonin constitute a blissful quartet of neurotransmitters that make us content. Feelings of well-being increase levels of serotonin, which stimulate our appetite and general contentment, while low serotonin levels trigger stress hormones. Powerful beings benefit from serotonin streaming through their bodies, creating feelings of a refreshing exhilaration. Powerful men become supermen, assuming their behaviour cannot be equalled to that of inferior beings, whose blood and brains are acidified by stress

This blissful state of mind has to be protected. Powerdrunk sex abusers are generally safeguarded by others, who like them fear that their power, and that of their sheltering organizations, will be weakened if voices of abused victims are taken seriously. Maybe a reason to why even the Catholic Church and United Nations, organiza-

tions supposed to care about evil and social injustice, so often have proved reluctant to address abuse committed by powerful men and women within their own domains.

While in Paris working at the gender division of UNESCO, Dominique Strauss-Kahn, former head of the IMF, went to trial in Lille, accused of pimping. He was acquitted from all charges, though I found his defence deplorable. He admitted that he was a "libertine" and liked to participate in orgies, though he had not realized that his partners in those excesses had been prostitutes. He assumed they were "libertines" like him. He was contradicted by several women who had shared his "pleasures." One of them told the court: "No other customer would have dared to do what he did. Does he assume that he can behave like that just because he does not have the same social status [as women like me]?" Fabrice Paszkowski, one of several arrangers of Strauss-Kahn's nightly pleasures, used to text him messages about planned sexual encounters. The nature of these messages reflects opinions of men like them. Strauss-Kahn: "So, who will you have in your luggage?" Paszkowski: "I have some very beautiful and new things for my trip to DC!!!"

While reading about the trial in Lille I found that another of Paszkowski's clients had been the strapping sailor, author and artist Titouan Lamazou. A frequent visitor to UNESCO's gender division. He was actively

Loss of a job and a way of life

Sascha Wilson of the Guardian (1/12/18) reported: "As workers packed up their things and began leaving the workplace yesterday morning, they expressed sadness and uncertainty over their future."

A similar article on the same page by Rishi Ragoonath stated, "Wiping his tears as he walked out the gates of Petrotrin after 30 years of service, worker David Jadoonanan lamented, 'This is so hard. It hurtful. I don't know what I will do.' ... Several workers, particularly temporary workers, were reduced to tears."

Ragoonath added: "[Gabriel] O'souna said workers were also concerned about their medical plans and pension plans. Workers, he said, 'have been sold to hell in a hand basket.' They claimed that other companies don't want to hire them because they have been demonised and portrayed as greedy, lazy and unqualified."

Sandhya Santoo of the Express (1/12/18) reported: "For the workers, many wept openly as memories were shared with co-workers who had become friends and family. Men and women, many of them second and third generation Petrotrin employees, assembled at various locations with their bags of office belongings, ready to head home."

The sacrifice of becoming a professional

Preparing to become a lecturer was no easy feat for those who were wrongfully retrenched by UTT without a fair, equitable, objective and transparent criteria. The assistant professors had studied for about 15 years, having been successful at GCE / CSEC, A'Levels / CAPE, BA/BSc, MA / MSc, and the Ph.D. These academics had spent an enormous amount of dedicated time and money to study, prepare for exams, conduct original research, write a thesis and dissertation, publish in academic journals, and present papers at international conferences.

To which place of employment can they now turn? And in May (when they were fired) when universities hire lecturers long before the academic year begins in September? Administrator Judy Rocke dismissed lecturers in the Bachelor of Education (BEd) Programme who were specialists in teacher training. They taught students to be the primary and secondary school teachers of tomorrow, guiding their minds for the challenges of the changing classroom.

Through experience and studies, they were specialists in teaching Theories in Education, Curriculum Studies, Pedagogy / Teaching Methods, Assessment and Evaluation, Psychology of Learning, Classroom Management, Instructional Design, Research Methods, Written Communication and Contemporary Issues in Education.

In our court case against Rocke and UTT President Sarim Al Zubaidy, our attorneys are contending that, in the circumstances, our dismissal was "unjustified, unlawful, harsh, punitive and oppressive." In their considered view, our attorneys are also arguing that our arbitrary dismissal was an "abuse of power and/or misfeasance by public officers in a State institution. In Petrotrin and UTT, industrial relations procedures were neglected in the haste to retrench specialists and professionals."



involved with charitable organizations defending the rights of women and children and had in 2003 been appointed as "UNESCO's Artist for Peace." Lamazou's defence was the same as Strauss-Kahn's: "I did not know that these women were prostitutes."

The case of Titouan Lamazou made me remember when I was working for The Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida) and once listened to a lecture by Karl Göran Lindberg, lawyer, police chief and former rector of the Police Academy. Lindberg was project manager of an EU project called Genderforce, aiming to improve international efforts to include a gender perspective in all police work. In 2010, Lindberg was by the Swedish High Court sentenced to a long prison term for repeated serious rape and sexual abuse of under-aged girls.

Lamazou and Lindberg might have been victims of what the psychiatrist Robert Jay Lifton in a book about Nazi doctors called doubling. A psychological trait enabling a person to invoke evil potentials and forbidden urges, at the same time as s/he considers them to be completely alien to her / his true humanitarian and philanthropically inclined self. Jay Lifton stated:

To live out the doubling and call forth the evil is a moral choice for which

one is responsible, whatever the level of consciousness involved.

If we, our laws and our society accept and condone doubling, we identify with the perpetrators and pave the way for immorality, injustice and violence.

generation, well in excess of St. Vincent and the Grenadines Energy Action Plan target of 60 percent by 2023.

The commissioning of the plant will be in approximately two years. The development of the plant has been ongoing for some time with civil works starting in the second quarter of 2018. The turbines are expected to be tendered out in 2019.

SVGCL is a public-private partnership owned by the St. Vincent and the Grenadines government and Teykjavik Geothermal, an Iceland company focusing on geothermal power development with projects in East Africa, Mexico and the Caribbean.

Trinidad

Trinidad and Tobago ranks third among Caribbean countries in the latest Human Development Indices and Indicators, which was recently released by the United Nations Development Program (UNDP).

Highest ranked among the Caribbean nations in the groupings is the Bahamas at 54 out of 180 countries, surveyed,

Bahamas has Human Development

Index (HDI) of 0.807, a life expectancy rate of 75.8 years and a gross national income (GNI) of US\$26.681.

Barbados is second in CARICOM with a ranking of 58 and HDI of 0.800 a life expectancy of 76

0.800, a life expectancy of 76.1 and a GNI of US\$15,843, while T&T is ranked 69th with an HDI of 0.784, a life expectancy rate of 70.3 and GNI of US\$28,622,

Haiti is the lowest ranked in CARI-COM and is described by the UNDP as belonging to the Low Human Development Index.

Most of the 14-member CARICOM countries, with the exception of Guyana and Haiti, are ranked in the Very High Human Development Index. Guyana is listed in the Human Development category.

Other countries in CARICOM that are ranked include Antigua and Barbuda at 70 with an HDI of 0.780, a life expectancy rate of 76.5 and a GNI of US\$20,764.

The UNDP said most people today live longer, are more educated and have more access to goods and services than ever before.



2015 but were not selected as MP's will also be present on standby in the event someone is absent, ill or suspected of being a snitch at the 11th hour. House leaders also have the option of recalling an elected MP and replacing them at the very last minute with someone whose loyalties are not in question or under suspicion.

The move by the PPP to try to topple the administration via the same route that the coalition did back in 2015 was prompted in large part by the government's abysmally poor showing at local government elections in mid Novem-

The coalition, for example, lost a whooping seven council seats to the PPP in its city stronghold. The national turnout was barely 30 percent. This was widely interpreted as a vote of no confidence in the performance of government, especially by its supporters who had stayed away in droves. The move also came at a time when President Granger flew to Cuba for cancer treatment. Locals had long suspected that the president was not that well. Confirmation came last month. PPP officials

say they moved in to capitalize on a government that appeared to be leaderless with Granger's illness. A win for the PPP will trigger fresh elections by the first quarter or next year. A tie means the motion would have failed but it will nevertheless translate to a successful effort to damage or weaken the coalition in the eyes of the public.

Back in 2015, the PPP dissolved parliament and called for fresh elections rather than debate a similar no confidence motion that had been put forward by the coalition. The PPP thinks that this is pay back time and now appears to have the coalition on the run. House Leader and Prime Minister Moses Nagamootoo says the entire attempt will fail spectacularly

invest in affordable housing creation and preservation, because every Brooklynite deserves a safe place to call home that they can afford regardless of their income or background."

"Thanks to Borough President Adams" investment, Met Council will be able to help house the most vulnerable New Yorkers," said David G. Greenfield, chief executive officer of Met Council. "This allocation will allow the 75 residents of Met Council's Abraham I, who have formerly experienced homelessness, to continue to reside in beautiful accommodations in Sea Gate."

Adams's FY19 affordable housing capital budget also included \$1 million to Love Fellowship Tabernacle for the

construction of a 189-unit, mixed-use, 11-story building at 2435 Pacific Street in Brownsville; \$526,000 to Catholic Charities Progress of Peoples Development Corporation for the construction of the communal and green roof spaces at Our Lady of Loreto Project Phase 2 in Brownsville, which will deliver 102 units of housing; and \$500,000 to the Hanson Place Church Support Corporation for the development of 100 affordable housing units and a community facility space at Hanson Place Community Plaza in Fort Greene.

Recipients of FY19 budget allocations participated in a presentation of ceremonial checks, including an oversized check made out to One Brooklyn for affordable housing across Brooklyn.





Doctor inspires others to share at Christmas, life

Losing his parents at a very young age, Dr. Sean Doorn, a Georgetown, Guyana-born educator, views this time of the year as his least favorite, simply because his mother died a few months before the Christmas season, and later, his father died, memories, despite sad, helped him to toughen-up, and strive for excellence during his life's journey.

A school psychologist with the New York City Department of Education for the past eleven years, Dr. Doorn remembers spending most of his younger life constantly ill, to the point, where he was hospitalized, and at home in bed, missing out on his formal years of education.

His mother back then, was a staff member at the Georgetown Public Hospital, and not afforded time-off to spend much time with her ill son, after doctors gave up on him and sent him home on many occasions. During those times however. young Sean, fantasized about

As he laid in bed, he told his younger self that when he was out of his situation, he would accept his past, embrace the present, anticipate his future, and work on these fantasies to make them realities, and do whatever it takes to ensure that anyone he came into contact with, "I would engage them, and ask them in return, to do the same for the next person."

After migrating to the United States, and with the help of relatives and friends, he worked through the hardships his parents experienced, like, not having the financial means to send him to college, yet holding on to a traditional Guyanese Christmas


Now a graduate of Touro College, New York, with Master's Degrees in Psychology and Mental Health Counseling, this young man is determined and committed to sharing his skills to help others like him, who experienced difficulties while growing up.

Dr. Doorn who has been a behavior intervention specialist for the past 11 years for various New York City nonprofit agencies, thanked Caribbean nationals for paving the way for future generations, like his parents did for him.

"My parents could not afford to send me to college, but if the love they had for me could have converted to money, I would have paid for Harvard University in one week," he stated.

An inspiration to youths, the adjunct professor at Touro College Graduate School of Education and Psychology, and parttime lecturer at the Adelphia University Graduate School of Social Work, called on compatriots to appreciate their living parents, and reach out to help those in need.

Dr. Doorn, who captivated the audience during his keynote speech at the recent Caribbean American Social Workers Association's 15th Annual Christmas event, has served on a Mental Health Awareness







Like a dog with a bone, you're all in when presented with a tiny scrap of intriguing information. You don't let go until you know everything there is to know about it, searching and uncovering and digging until, as in the new novel "Triple Threat" by Camryn King, you've dug yourself into trouble.

There had been absolutely no reason for Leigh to have killed herself.

To her surprise, Mallory learned that Christian was a truly nice guy, but her investigator's background nagged it's on fire. Author Camryn







Buju Banton returns home



Legendary reggae artist Buju Banton was released from prison after serving seven years in a federal facility in Georgia on Friday, Dec. 7. The Jamaican singer was convicted in 2011 and sentenced to 10 years for drug and gun charges in a Florida bust in 2009. His sentence was later reduced to seven, but the Grammy-award winning artist's absence in the music industry was strongly felt in the reggae music community.

He was released from prison — one day early — and accepted voluntarily deportation back to Jamaica where many of his fans awaited him at the Norman Manley International Airport.

Buju Banton recently released a statement explaining that his main

Jamaican jazz maestro in Queens

Jamaican-born, Grammy-nominated international jazz maestro, Monty Alexander, CD, is set to make his first United States performance this holiday as a newly-minted honorary Doctorate of Letters of the University of the West Indies, Mona Campus.

Alexander, who has made his mark globally for his own brand of jazz, will celebrate the holidays at the Jamaica Center for Arts and Learning, (JCAL), 153-10 Jamaica Ave., Queens, NY 11432, on Dec. 15, 2018 at 7 pm.

under the theme "Love Notes."

The performance is expected to feature the maestro's mashup of jazz with calypso, reggae, mento and other island music from his Grammy-nominated album, and leave many fans tapping their feet, straight up dancing or make converts of the staid.

Born Montgomery Bernard Alexander on D-Day in Kingston, Jamaica in 1944, the musical virtuoso has five decades of performances and over 70 CDs under his belt. He began his musical career at age four by playing

Christmas carols by ear.

Alexander is now most widely known as an upper echelon master of the swinging piano trio function as he has demonstrated with several top-shelf groups, including iconic units with bassist John Clayton and drummer Jeff Hamilton, and with the legendary bassist Ray Brown and guitarist Herb Ellis.

Healso performs frequently with Harlem-Kingston Express, a double trio in which he coalesces his love

"I give thanks for the man (Jesus), who likes to give more than he receives," said Daley after receiving a plaque.

"A lot of times, we give flow-

ers when we're in our graves," he added, before singing a "Thank You" song "to tell you what love is like."

Daley, who was born in May Pen in the Jamaican parish of Clarendon, said he started singing at the tender age of 5.

But, he said, his musical journey actually began at 11, when he formed his first reggae

group, The Fire Kings.

At 16, Daley said he migrated to the Jamaican capital, Kingston, where he recorded his first single at Randy's Recording Studio.

There, Daley said he met a singer, identified only as Stanley, in forming Stanley and the Turbines, which gained national recognition.



"Widows" was a British TV series, which enjoyed a two-year run from 1983 to 1985. Created by legendary English author Lynda La Plante (Prime Suspect), the popular crime show was nominated for a BAFTA award in the Best Television Drama category. In 2002, ABC turned Widows into a four-part miniseries starring Brooke Shields and Rosie Perez, but that substantially-revised overhaul failed to resonate with the American audience.

Now, Academy Award-winning director Steve McQueen (for "12 Years a Slave") has brought a much more faithful adaptation to the screen, although the setting has been shifted from London to Chicago. The crime caper revolves around a trio of widows who opt to follow in their late husbands' felonious footsteps in the wake

of a botched bank heist.

McQueen assembled an A-list ensemble featuring Oscar-winners Viola Davis (for Fences) and Robert Duvall (for Tender Mercies), as well as nominees Liam Neeson (for Schindler's List), Daniel Kaluuya (for Get Out) and Jacki Weaver (for Silver Linings Playbook and Animal Kingdom). The impressive

cast also includes Colin Farrell and Michelle Rodriguez.

Not long past the point of departure, veteran bank robber Harry Rawlings (Neeson) masterminds a robbery in which he and his partners perish. Trouble is, Harry died indebted to a couple of South Side mobsters (Kaluuya and Brian Tyree Henry) to the tune of \$2

million

Given a month to come up with cash (or else), Harry's widow Veronica (Davis) hatches a plan to raise the money by burglarizing a safe in the mansion of a well-connected family headed by corrupt, Windy City Alderman Tom Mulligan (Duvall). To that end, she recruits a couple of the other grieving widows (Michelle Rodriguez and Elizabeth Debicki) and a getaway driver (Cynthia Erivo) with promises of a multimillion-dollar payday.

The plot proceeds to thicken in convincing fashion while touching on such timely themes as politics, loyalty, race and class. Since it would be a crime in itself to spoil the ensuing developments even one iota, suffice to say McQueen slowly ratchets up the tension in a searing, multilayered suspense thriller not to be missed.

With the help of a delicious script expertly executed by a coterie of her talented co-stars, the incomparable Ms. Davis steals the show and delivers yet another Oscar-quality performance. Vintage Viola!



West Indies ranks eighth



ing after a four-member jury in the New South Wales High Court found in October 2017 that Fairfax had not establish that Gayle had exposed himself in a team dressing room during a Sydney training session at the 2015 World Cup.

The jury also found Fairfax was motivated by malice, rejecting the media group's defense of qualified privilege, which argues the organization acted reasonably by publishing information, which is in the public

Justice McCallum awarded Gayle a single sum for a series of articles published in January 2016 in the Sydney Morning Herald, Canberra Times and Melbourne Age.

Aggravated damages were not awarded and the figure was at the lower end of recent defamation pay-

The judge found imputations in the articles published by Fairfax "went to the heart of Mr. Gayle's professional life as a batsman," but she agreed with Fairfax, the allegations were "not at the most serious end of the spectrum."

The judge said Gayle's evidence that the articles had hurt his feelings was "surprisingly compelling."

She said a particular source of hurt were calls for Gayle to be banned from international cricket.

The newspaper said it would appeal the judgment.

The regional team's misfortune in the latest rankings stems from their 2-0 whitewash at the hands of the Tigers — their first ever on Bangladesh soil.

The team lost the first Test in Chittagong by 64 runs before suffering a humiliating innings and 184-run defeat in Dhaka inside three days recently.

The latest rankings come as a huge blow to the Windies, especially on the heels of decent results in the Test format earlier this year.

West Indies drew 101 with Sri Lanka in a three-test series in the Caribbean and beat Bangladesh 2-0 in the subsequent two-match series.

The West Indies decline in Tests has been a steady one, having lost 11 of 19 matches, won six and drew two, over the last two years.

Barbados forfeits game against Guyana

the Barbados football team points in the CONCACAF Nations League qualifier competition and shot Guyana up the standings ladder giving the South Americans a fair chance of making the final cut for year.

Owing to Barbados fielding two ineligible players, the Confederation of North, Central America and Caribbean Association Football's (Concacaf) Disciplinary Committee has slapped Bajan Tridents with a forfeiture penalty for the match played against Guyana on Sept. 6, meaning that the one point they had earned from the 2-2 draw is now reduced to zero, and the Guyanese were awarded three points.

CONCACAF declared that owing to the Tridents' infringement, the Tridents had in fact lost the game played in Guyana. The violation did not merit a disqualification of the Bajan side from this competition involving 34 teams across the Caribbean and Central and North America.

This means that Guyana has Administrative errors cost catapulted up to number eight in the standings, moving from a previous position of 15th, and demoted Barbados to 23rd from 18th.

According to Concacaf, this qualifying phase of the 2019-20 Nations League is a one-off the prestigious Gold Cup next tournament among 34 teams that is being played from Sept. 6, 2018, to March 26, 2019. This tournament will determine seeding for the group phase of the inaugural Nations League competition next year, as well as select the remaining 10 teams which will qualify for the 2019 Concacaf Gold Cup, the regional senior men's football championship.

Both teams have their last and final games in this competition set for March, which puts Guyana in with a strong chance of making the Gold Cup competition.

The Tridents on the other hand will be playing for exposure as their current standings give them no chance of ending in the top 10.

The Guyana Jaguars take on Belize on March 23, and Barbados comes up against Nicaragua the following day.

The Guyanese had protested the Tridents' inclusion of one overseas-based player in the fixture against Guyana, but in agreeing with the Jaguars CONCACAF found that not one but two players were improperly documented before taking the field for Barbados.

CONCACAF stated, "after due examination of the evidence, the committee determined that the Barbados Football Association infringed the applicable articles ... to the eligibility of players to play for representative teams by fielding ineligible players Hallam Hope and Krystian Pearce.

"In accordance with Articles 55 and 31 of the FIFA Disciplinary Code, the Barbados Football Association is considered to have lost the match against Guyana by a score of 3-0."

The Tridents accepted and appeared resigned to their fate as Barbados Football Association President, Randy Harris, briefly commented, "CON-CACAF made a decision and we have been notified about the ruling."

Any number starting with 900, 540, 595 or 871 charges a fee beyond a local call. In some instances, ads initially advertise calls to a local number, but then direct callers to a second number starting with one of the paid exchanges. "Consumers must also question the legitimacy of vague classifieds because they too could be a scam. Before responding to an ed. fore responding to an ad, consumers should verify the source of all informa-tion & always be wary about sending money or signing a contract with an unknown party.
