## Officials reviewing easy re-entry of ISIS fighters

Most governments in the 15-nation Caribbean Community (CARICOM) are staying under the radar when it comes to commenting on international terrorism issues, preferring to leave it up to the larger and more powerful western nations, which are now targets of the Islamic State fighters.

But this is not the case in the region's largest economy, Trinidad, where memories are


still fresh about the July 1990 attempted coup by a group of 114 rebel Muslims that killed nearly 30 people and had also involved arson attacks in commercial Port of Spain, the storming of parliament, the state television station and other institutions.

Debate in the country's parliament as well as social media is currently hot on the issue, especially because authorities

# Medgar Evers hails retired geography professor

Professors at Medgar Evers College in Brooklyn last Wednesday hailed recently retired Geography Prof. Levi Uzozie, Ph.D for his significant contribution to the college and the City University of New York (CUNY) on a whole.

Nigerian-born Dr. Uzozie had taught geography for over 57 years at the secondary and tertiary levels — both in his native land, the United Kingdom and the United States. He taught the subject for 18 years at CUNY.

"My philosophy is that we have to treat each other as famil," said Dr. Owen Brown, chair of the Department of Social and Behavioral Sciences, where Dr. Uzozie taught, at a gala reception at the college's Bedford Avenue campus.


"It's entirely appropriate that we celebrate Dr. Uzozie retirement," Brown added. "We're here to celebrate while he's alive and all of us are here."

Montserratan-born Dr. George Irish, dean of the School of Liberal Arts and Education, noted Uzozie's "very significant contribution to this institution

"I had the privilege of knowing when you came," he said of Dr. Uzozie. "Every course is like a tree that bears fruit.

"You created the courses and taught them," Dean Irish added. "The legacy you created will be longstanding."

Dean Richard Jones of the Accreditation Committee said was "an honor" to celebrate Dr. Uzozie's retirement, describing him as a "courageous man.

# Adams unveils 'Growing Brooklyn's future'

Brooklyn Borough President Eric L. Adams on Sunday unveiled "Growing Brooklyn's Future," an initiative with over \$2 million in initial investment from his Fiscal Year 2016 (FY16) to create hydroponic classrooms to a dozen schools across Brooklyn.

Adams made the announcement in a classroom at the Academy of Urban Planning, a high school located in Bushwick, which will be transformed into a green learning space through a partnership with New York Sun Works, a non-profit organization that builds innovative science labs in urban schools.

The Brooklyn borough president highlighted the potential of urban farming to revolutionize the borough's relationship with food and the environment, as well as to create thousands of jobs in the emerging agri-tech industry.

"Brooklyn is getting back to its roots as we move into a greener future, growing healthy food and talented students in the same classroom," he said. "I am particularly excited that we are launching 'Growing Brooklyn's Future' in communities like Brownsville, Bushwick and East New York, areas where our children have historically been left

behind.

In the spirit of "One Brooklyn," Adams said he is planting "seeds of opportunity" in every neighborhood, adding that innovation and progress will "flower across our borough from stems of success that are grounded in STEM education."

Schools receiving \$167,000 each from Adams to build out hydroponic classrooms include: PS 21 Crispus Attucks in Bedford-Stuyvesant; Brooklyn Democracy Academy in Brownsville; Academy for Environmental Leadership, Academy of Urban Planning, IS 383 Philippa Schuyler, and PS 377 Alejandina B. De Gautier in Bushwick.

Others are: High School for Medical Professions, IS 211 John Wilson, and PS 279 Herman Schreiber in Canarsie; Brooklyn Lab School and Multicultural High School in Cypress Hills; and IS 292 Margaret S. Douglas in East New York.

"Public-private partnerships like these help us revitalize science and sustainability programming in New York City public schools," said Sidsel Robards, director of development and events for New York Sun Works. "We are honored to be working with Brooklyn Borough Hall on this mission." "Chair Julie Dent and I were ecstatic to learn of the FY16 capital budget allocation that Borough President Adams allocated to four schools in Community District 4," said Nadine Whitted, district manager of Community Board 4.

"Through this generous allocation, our youngsters will have an opportunity to learn first-hand about greenhouse technology and other science concepts which will propel them into the 21st century, thus equipping them with the required tools to become more competitive in the worlds of technology, science, and sustainability," she added. "I thank him for his promise to educate and equip our students for a brighter future."

Andrew Brown, principal of the Brooklyn Democracy Academy, said: "We have had a successful hydroponics program running for eight years and are elated to expand with the generosity of Borough President Adams.

"Our expansion will include aquaponics, which is a game changer for our students and community," he added. "This truly has far reaching potential for our students and their families."

#### THE NEWS FROM BACK HOME

#### **Antigua**

Two Antiguans, Omarie Banjamin, 27, and Sheba Charles, 27 were arrested on arrival at London's Gatwick International Airport with cocaine concealed in their luggage.

The couple was held by Border Force Officers as they were proceeding through Immigration Control to retrieve their suitcases on Oct. 28, police said.

They arrived in London on a Virgin Atlantic flight from St. Lucia.

Prior to their arrival to the UK, the couple left Antigua to holiday in St.

Lucia.Reports are the security officers examined each one of the suitcases they were carrying and found



cocaine amounting to two kilograms in each luggage.

They were later arrested by UK authorities.

Reports are that Benjamin is a taxi driver in Antigua, while Charles is employed with a local restaurant in the capital.

On Aug. 26, an Antiguan police officer was caught with four kilograms of cocaine strapped to her body while attempting to board a British flight.

Sceneta Nanton, 36, was convicted and sentenced to four years in prison for drug trafficking.

British High Commissioner to Barbados and the Eastern Caribbean Victoria dean said she is very concerned with the number of people who have been held attempting to take illegal drugs into the UK in recent times.

#### **Bahamas**

The murder count in The Bahamas ties the record set in 2011 with the recent killing of two men in separate incidents recently.

This year's murder count stands at 127, a record set in 2011. Despite the

rising murder count, Chief Superintendent Paul Rolle, head of the Central Detective Unit, said Bahamians




should not feel threatened in their daily routines.

"We have our police force in full force," he said.

Rolle said gang violence is a major concern for police, especially turf wars where people fight over territories to sell drugs.

Minister of State for National Security Keith Bell recently said that the former Ingraham administration is to blame for the high level of crime occurring today.

He said more criminal gangs were formed between 2007 and 2012 than other point in Bahamian history.

#### **Barbados**

A financing company based in Curacao, FactorPlus is exploring avenues to expand its services to the wider Caribbean, including Suriname and Guyana by offering rice farmers a new opportunity to finance their business rather than to wait for delayed payment by millers and exporters.

Speaking to reporters at the recent Caribbean Pacific Agri-food Forum in Barbados, Paul Dijkhoffz, business

development manager, said Factor Plus has a vast experience in trade financing. It is currently offering



services to farmers in the region since most of them have difficulties to access traditional financing.

He said that, after farmers or producers sold and delivered their produce to buyers like supermarkets or hotels, his company buys the invoices, paying the sellers 80 percent of the amount due of the amount due upfront within 48 hours. The remaining 20 percent minus factoring fee is paid after that is collected by FactorPlus.

This type of financing, he explained, takes away the hassle for farmers to go after their monies while the financing company takes all the risks.

Dijkhoffz further noted that while traditional financing companies may offer loans for 30 and 40 percent interest to farmers, FactorPlus is very com-

petitive with fees ranging from four to seven percent.

FactorPlus provides services in Aruba, Curacao, Bonaire, St. Maarten and Miami and plans to expand services to the agricultural sector in the region.

#### Grenada

The Grenada government has announced that the debt exchange offer launched on Oct. 5, 2015 has received the overwhelming support of the island's creditors.

Holders of 94 percent of the country's US dollar bonds due in 2025 and

100 percent of EC dollar bonds due 2025 have agreed to provide extensive debt relief to Grenada by tendering



their bonds exchange for new Grenada US Dollar Bonds in 2030 (2030 Bonds).

Under the terms of the US dollar bonds due 2025 and Grenada's exchange offer, holders of not less than 75 percent of the US dollar bonds during in 2025 have given instructions to the Trustee for the entirety of the US dollar bonds due 20205 to be tendered in exchange for the 2030 bonds in accordance with the terms of Grenada's offer.

The results of the tender process which ended recently means that all bonds outstanding on the closing date will be exchanged for 20230 Bonds later this month.

Prime Minister Dr. Keith Mitch-

ell, who is also finance minister said, "Today is a very important day for the people of Grenada, who are currently making sacrifices of their own in order to improve the prospects of our beloved country."

#### Guyana

Guyanese rice farmers could soon benefit from the Mexican market as it is moving to fast-track arrangements with Mexico to buy Guyana paddy.

Prime Minister Moses Nagamotoo is seeking new buyers for local rice.

The Office of the Prime Minister said

that Mexico's Agriculture Minister Jose Calzada has given the assurance that he will fast-track arrange-



ments to buy Guyana's paddy. He also made a commitment to encourage the private sector to enter contracts with Guyanese millers.

Guyana has prioritized assisting farmers to find alternative international markets, in light of the country's continued production boom and in the midst of recent loss of a major market — Venezuela.

The Mexico market is one of several explored by the Granger administration.

Earlier this year Venezuela announced that it would stop buying rice from Guyana under the PetroCar-

## ISIS poses global threat

had in the past week released figures showing that nearly 90 Trinidadian nationals have gone abroad in the past two years to fight religious and ideological causes in the Middle East.

But what happens to these fighters if they return home. What laws are there to ensure their arrest and detention, banishment from society and even criminal conviction?

Newly minted National Security Minister Edmund Dillon said this week there is precious little authorities could do to returning fighters as they had committed no crime on Trinidad's soil. They are free to return, unhindered and to resume where they had left off.

"As citizens of Trinidad and Tobago, there is no law in place to stop them from coming home. If they have committed an international crime, we will work with our international partners to bring them to justice but for now, they are still citizens of Trinidad and Tobago," said Dillon, a retired army general appointed as security minister after the early September general elections.

But asked directly what the situation should be giving events in France

and other parts of Europe this week, Dillon was more forthcoming, admitting that authorities are reviewing the situation.

He said officials are talking with Attorney General Faris al Rawi about a new approach to returning fighters but he would not give details.

"This government wants to make it abundantly clear that it recognizes the global threat posed by ISIS and the horrific atrocities recently committed on the French people by the ISIS phenomena," Dillon said in the senate this week.

ing more closely with international partners.

But even as Trinidadian authorities remain alert and move to improve legislation regarding returning fighters, neighboring Caribbean governments are deliberately playing it low key, clearly keeping out of a fight that for now has nothing much to do with them. Most just issued statements condemning simply condemning the weekend attacks but it would not be surprising in the coming months if other governments move to follow TT's lead and amend local laws.

"There are big concerns in T&T about this. Many tell me they are concerned we are exporting jihadists and that those people who are experienced in fighting in such situations might return with their 'expertise' and we in T&T would be at greater risk once they return with foreign ideologies and skills," said opposition Senator Wayne Sturge.

the Brooklyn Borough supported New York Attorney General Eric Schneiderman's legal action against daily fantasy sports operators "that are illegally accepting wagers in New York.'

"As the former chair of the State Senate Committee on Racing, Gaming, and Wagering, I understand the critical importance of regulation that determines how our state permits gambling," he said.

'The reality of daily fantasy sports is that its model is predicated upon outcomes of chance," he added. "Because of this, as well as various aspects of its marketing, it is different than traditional fantasy sports and should be treated under our current laws as gambling."

Adams said it is "important that we foster disruptive industries which create new opportunities in the marketplace, but it is equally vital that everyone plays by the rules.'

He urged the New York State Legislature to address daily fantasy sports in its upcoming session "such as to determine any appropriate policy remedies, including measures to address the addictive components of gambling behavior."

# Shake-up in Jamaica's Cabinet

Jamaica Prime Minister Portia Simpson-Miller has announced a shake-up in her Cabinet effective Nov. 9.

She has replaced the controversial Minister of Health Dr. Fenton Ferguson who has been transferred to the Ministry of Labor.

Dr. Ferguson has come under fire over the deaths of 19 babies from an outbreak of bacteria at two hospitals.

Prime Minister Simpson Miller has ordered Horace Dalley "to correct the shortcomings in the health sector."

Dalley will be assigned to the Ministry of Health, Dr. Fenton Ferguson has moved to the Ministry of Labor and Social Security and Derrick Kellier will continue to lead the ministry of agriculture and fisheries.

In announcing the changes, the prime minister said she has listened to the recent discussions and expressions of concern, some of which could have the effect of distracting from the very important focus of economic and social reforms.

She said the country must be united in purpose so as to ensure that the positive path that Jamaica is on will not be disrupted in any way.

Dalley will continue the program of improved healthcare delivery at the ministry of health and has also been tasked by the prime minister to continue giving oversight to the remaining elements of the public sector wage negotiations.

Ferguson will give focus to the gov-

ernment's priority of labor market reforms, which are essential.

The prime minister was responding to concerns expressed by the Jamaica Manufacturers Association (JMA) who said it is disappointed that those responsible for their actions and appealed to her to ensure that there's "substantive accountability and transparency" within the health sector.

In a statement the JMA commenting on the controversy within the health sector sparked by the deaths of 19 babies from an outbreak of bacteria at two hospitals, said the actions taken by the prime minister have not adequately addressed the situation.

## UNC leader faces challenge

Former Prime Minister of Trinidad and Tobago Kamla Persad-Bissessar is facing a strong challenge to retain her post as leader of the United National Congress on Dec. 5 from one of her deputy political leader and a former UNC senator.

Former Housing Minister Dr Roodlal in the previous Kamla-led People's Partnership (PP) administration said he is the longest serving member of the party's executive and the time has come for change.

He said his job is to rebuild the party after the UNC was defeated in the Sept. 7, 2015 general election by the People's National Movement.

Since then there have been calls from opposition UNC MPs for Persad-Bissess-sar to step down after having suffered five successive election defeats under her leadership since 2010.

There are 16 posts up for grab in the internal election, but Persad-Bissessar is only contesting the post of leadership,

while Dr Moonilal and the other contender Vasant Bharath each have a slate of candidates to contest the other positions.

Dr. Moonilal has resigned his post as chief whip in Parliament since is he going up against Persad-Bissessar who is the Opposition Leader.

The other candidate who has thrown his hat in the leadership race is former Trade and Industry Minister Vasant Bharath, who after he lost his seat in the last general election was made a senator by Persad-Bissessar.

He has since resigned his seat in the Senate to campaign for the election.

Bharath said the institutions in the party have broken down, some irretrievably so.

"If we have to present ourselves as a credible alternative for the people, we must rebuild. It'll be a long painstaking process, but I'm up for the task," he said.

Some of her opposition MPs say the former prime minister must take blame for the PP's loss of the general election.

# How to ensure people get end-of-life healthcare they want

By Dr. David R. Grube

My mom paid a painful price for not completing an advance directive about her preferences for end-of-life medical care. She was an intelligent and organized woman who had everything in her and my dad's life planned out and written down. She even drafted her own obituary. Ironically, she never discussed her end-of-life care goals with my father or her physician son (me), preferring to talk about "more pleasant subjects."

As a result, after she developed colon cancer at age 86, my dad and I had to figure out how to treat her post-surgical medical complications of heart and renal failure. She died in hospice care after prolonged, unbearable and unnecessary suffering. It broke both my dad's heart and mine.

Unfortunately, my mother's story is all too common. Nearly one out of four older Americans (24 percent) say that either they or a family member have experienced excessive or unwanted medical treatment, the equivalent of about 25 million people, according to a poll conducted last year by Purple Strategies. A key reason for this problem is only about one out of six Americans (17 percent) say they've had discussions about their end-of-life healthcare goals, preferences and values with a doctor or other healthcare provider, according to a

recent Kaiser Health Tracking Poll.

Evidence-based research overwhelmingly shows the need for more and higher-quality doctor-patient conversations about the patient's healthcare goals, preferences and values. The report "Dying in America" by the Institute of Medicine noted that:

"Most people nearing the end of life are not physically, mentally, or cognitively able to make their own decisions about care ... The majority of these patients will receive acute hospital care from physicians who do not know them. As a result, advance care planning is essential to ensure that patients receive care reflecting their values, goals, and preferences."

One important step that should facilitate advance care planning is the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services' (CMS) recent decision to reimburse doctors, starting Jan. 1, 2016, for communicating with patients about their preferences and values about end- of-life care.

As a next step, we urge CMS to stop reimbursing health-care professionals for providing unwanted medical treatment that directly violates a patient's documented end-of-life care goals.

In addition, we encourage Congress to take additional Continued on Page 12

# Economic slowdown threatening progress

ROME, Nov. 11, 2015 (IPS) Slower economic growth since 2008, and especially with the commodity price collapse since the end of last year, threatens to reverse the exceptional half-decade before the financial crash when growth in the South stayed ahead of the North. From 2002, many developing countries - including some of the poorest- had been growing much faster after a quarter century of stagnation in Africa, for example.

But this has not been their delayed reward for sticking to policies prescribed by conventional wisdom as claimed by some latter-day apologists for the structural adjustment programmes of the last two decades of the 20th century. Instead, a more favourable international environment, including higher commodity prices, low interest rates and renewed aid flows, along with accelerated growth in China and India, have been the main reasons.

Recent trends need to be seen in a longer historical context if the right lessons are to be drawn. Economic growth in the 1980s and 1990s was generally slower than in the preceding two decades. But despite the spectacular growth of several developing countries, sub-Saharan Africa lost due to stagnation for more than two decades from the late 1970s and Latin America lost at least the 1980s.

rily social expenditures. As national-level inequalities grew in most countries from the 1980s, inter-national inequalities among countries continued to grow. Economic welfare in developing countries has been further squeezed by demographic pressures including rapid urbanization.

Nascent industrialization in many countries was aborted by structural adjustment and economic liberalization. Premature trade liberalization has thus exacerbated de-industrialization, unemployment and fiscal deficits without generating alternative sources of economic growth. Low income countries as well failed and failing states are generally characterized by modest industrialization which, in turn, retards structural transformation and more inclusive sustainable development.

The negative developmental implications of policies and programmes forced on developing countries, regardless of historical circumstance and economic context, are now well known. There is a world of difference between measured liberalization from a position of economic strength, as in newly industrialized East Asia from the 1980s,

and their forced adoption, to meet World Trade Organization or loan obligations. Despite pious official rhetoric claiming the contrary, multilateral rules are far from supportive of sustainable development and need to be reformed accordingly.

Since the late 19th century, adverse terms of trade movements — favouring manufactures over primary commodities, temperate compared to tropical agricultural products, or manufactures from developed countries against those from developed countries — have meant that many developing countries have been producing and exporting much more, but earning relatively less from doing

International financial liberalization was supposed to attract private capital to fill financing gaps. But instead, it has resulted in net capital flows from the 'capital poor' to the 'capital rich', increased financial volatility and slower economic growth. Bitter experience has also shown that 'shock therapy' — often involving financial system 'big bangs' — has generally caused more harm than good.

Considering their greater vulnerability to external vicissitudes, developing countries must have greater fiscal space to ensure countercyclical capacity as well as sustained public spending for needed investments in physical and social infrastructure and human resources. Strengthening the tax base, ensuring more reliable sources of international finance and channelling aid through national

## A blame-game farce from T&T Opposition

There's a farce underway among some of the players who, until quite recently, strutted the Trinidad and Tobago landscape not only like they owned the place, but like they would continue to do so till kingdom come. The country's voters, to their eternal credit, had other ideas. And Kamla Persad-Bissessar, the former prime minister, is now being challenged for the leadership of her party, the United National Congress (UNC), in its uncoming internal election. Somehow, the matter of who is culpable for the party's defeat by the People's National Movement (PNM) in the Sept. 7 general elections seems to have become a bone of contention among aspirants for the party leadership. And what a sick joke that is!

Bissessar has never exhibited the kind of classiness that would have moved her, after leading her party into five electoral defeats since 2013, to voluntarily vacate the top-dog perch. No one ought be surprised she thinks that's where she still belongs. So after doing some posturing, during her

five-year run as prime minister, that she wasn't of so-called "maximum leader" persuasion (for instance, brandishing a proposal to limit prime ministerial tenure), Bissessar's defiance about quitting as UNC leader renders her as "maximum" as the best of them.

But that being so, whither this tomfoolery regarding who is responsible for the party's recent defeat - indeed, for the string of defeats the party suffered in the last two-plus years of its time in office? Are we to interpret this mockery about affixing blame as, in truth, who orchestrated or was engaged in more skullduggery than any other contributing partner? Con games are par for the course with Bissessar and her crew. The difference here being, while normally they try to work the con on others not of their stripe, in the instant case some of the key slicksters are trying to out-slick each other. It's pretty safe to say the public, except for core party support, isn't buying and doesn't much care about these attempted sleight-of-hand maneuvers.

The average Joe is disposed wasn't long before the elec-

to being dismissive about finger-pointing among UNC operatives because a pretty good chunk of the public bought what turned out to be a snow job in 2010, leading to the party's gaining a parliamentary majority. Back then, albeit facilitated by the super-arrogance of the then prime minister, PNM leader Patrick Manning, and a supporting cast fecklessly kowtowing to Manning's megalomania-driven M.O, the UNC landed itself the saleable trump card of Bissessar as the country's first female prime minister, and floated into governance on that history-making fantasy flight.

The bare, blunt reality concerning Bissessar and her confederates is that they steadily lost elections since roughly midway through their five-year term controlling the central government, because it wasn't long before the elec-

torate became wise to how steeped was the UNC-dominated government in immoral conduct of public affairs. sar team's defining marker.

It is hubris perhaps on a level most of us can't conceive, for participants in this orgy of governmental malfeasance to be furiously dueling over who owns culpability for the defeat in September. If, during the five-year spree, there was any voice among them cautioning that the open door to the feeding trough needed to be slammed shut, we haven't heard of this person of conscience. And frankly, we don't believe, here, that such a one exists. "We're all in this together" was as good a mantra as any for the Bissessar team while they ran roughshod over the public trust they'd been given in good faith.

Much more than even mild interest in UNC trick-sters' post-September charade, observers of a truly sorry pass in Trinidad and Tobago's political history are understandably curious about culpability and its consequences where they properly belong. Namely, will five years' accumulation of wrongdoing go entirely unpunished?

end-of-life treatment they want. They include:

Establish federal payment for palliative care consultations with healthcare providers who will advocate for and support the values and choices of the patient with an advanced illness or nearing the end of life.

Ensure that there are enough trained palliative care professionals to provide this service.

Ensure advanced illness care encompasses access to an interdisciplinary care team, such as board-certified hospice and palliative care physicians, nurses and social workers.

Allow patients the option of enrolling steps to ensure that Americans get the in hospice while continuing to receive disease-specific and restorative treatments if patients still want them.

Absent these healthcare reforms, poor understanding of treatment options and/or lack of acknowledgement of the extent of the illness may lead to inadequate planning, dissatisfaction with the process, unnecessary medical treatment and loss of quality

budgets can be crucial.

Instead of the current fetish with eliminating fiscal deficits, a more balanced and appropriate approach to macroeconomic stabilization is needed, to minimize disruptive swings in economic activity and external balances, while fostering a virtuous cycle of greater macroeconomic stability, investment, growth and employment generation. Developing countries need to strengthen their capacities and capabilities and to ensure sufficient 'policy space' in order to pursue appropriate reforms favouring sustainable development.

It has often been claimed that development could only be attained through retrenchment of the state. In much of the developing world, however, this has left choice-less illiberal democracies and frustrated disenfranchised citi-

zens. Instead, democratically accountable governments should consult widely among their citizens to promote investments for structural transformation and better employment.

The global economy now risks continuing its downward spiral into protracted stagnation. The International Monetary Fund's improved surveillance mechanisms have not led to better international macroeconomic coordination, as touted. Instead, the path to sustainable development remains blocked by selfimposed deflationary policy constraints and a refusal to provide needed aid or to cooperate to increase taxation for all.



## Scientists map genetic history of humans in the Caribbean

In the island chain called the Lesser Antilles, stretching from the Virgin Islands south to Trinidad and Tobago, a team of United States researchers led by Theodore Schurr, an anthropology professor at the University of Pennsylvania's School of Arts & Sciences, is solving a generations-old mystery: Do indigenous communities still exist in the Caribbean region today?

"We're really trying to connect the dots and understand the migration, the flow of people in and out of the region," said Schurr, who has worked in the area since 2012 and on similar genetics projects for more than two decades. "Each island seems to have its distinct history."

According to the University of Pennsylvania, Schurr and his team, which includes Jill Gaieski of Penn's Perelman School of Medicine, Miguel Vilar, a Penn postdoc at the time of the research and now at

the National Geographic Soci- recently included in this area ety, and Jada Benn Torres from Notre Dame University, focused their research on DNA samples from 88 participants in the First Peoples Community in Trinidad and Tobago and the Garifuna people in St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

By looking at mitochondrial DNA, Y-chromosomes and autosomal markers, three parts of the genome known for containing what Schurr described as "signals" of indigenous ancestry, the researchers eventually detected 42 percent indigenous ancestry from the maternal side, 28 percent from the paternal side, the University of Pennsylvania said.

It said mitochondrial DNA comes from the mother only, regardless of the number of generations considered.

The Y-chromosome is the paternal correlate, or the complement to mitochondrial DNA, passed from fathers to sons, the statement said.

It said autosomes, only

of research, do not reveal specific details about maternal and paternal lineage but give an overall picture of the genetic contributions from ancestors traced through both the mother's and father's sides of the family.

"In the case of the mitochondrial DNA and the Y-chromosome," Schurr said, "we know the markers that define those lineages commonly seen in indigenous populations of the Americas.'

During the past three years, the University of Pennsylvania said Schurr and his colleagues have done fieldwork in St. Vincent and the Grenadines and Trinidad and Tobago.

"These communities are not passive in this whole process; they're actively exploring their own ancestry," Schurr said. "They're also trying to establish the fact that they have indigenous ancestry, that they are the descendants of the original inhabitants. They're

reclaiming that history."

The University of Pennsylvania said the work began as part of the Genographic Project, which was started and initially funded by the US National Geographic Society.

It is a multi-institutional endeavor with the goal of mapping the globe genetically.

A dozen research labs around

the world analyzed DNA samples from indigenous and traditional communities, and a public participation component of the project allowed anyone to submit DNA for analysis in the database, the University of Pennsylvania said.

It said Schurr's contribution involved indigenous commu-

# US, Jamaica sign immigration memo

The United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) says it has signed a memorandum of cooperation with Jamaica's Ministry of National Security of Jamaica to enhance their ability to share records containing immigration and criminal histories of Jamaican nationals being repatriated from the United States.

U.S. Ambassador to Jamaica Luis G. Moreno and Peter Murcott Bunting, minister of Jamaica's Ministry of National Security, participated in the signing ceremony at the Jamaica Ministry of National Security's headquarters.

ICE's Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO) Assistant Director Matthew Albence and Minister Bunting signed the Criminal History Information Sharing (CHIS) memorandum. ICE's Jamaica Attaché James Stitzel also

attended the signing ceremony, ICE said.

"CHIS enhances the strong bilateral relationship between the United States and Jamaica and represents a milestone in our law enforcement partnership," said Moreno, also thanking Stitzel for his tireless work in Jamaica and his efforts with the CHIS agreement.

"The signing of the CHIS agreement signals increased levels of trust and cooperation between our two governments," Bunting said.

"This memorandum of cooperation further enhances our already strong bilateral relationship with the government of Jamaica," Albence said. "We

## Jamaica's aging water systems falter

KINGSTON, Jamaica, Nov. 18, 2015 (IPS) - This past summer Jamaicans sweltered through their third consecutive year of reduced rainfall resulting in wild fires, a crop-killing drought and daily water cuts.

As temperatures exceeded 93.7 F (34.2 Celsius) in several areas, the Meteorological Service urged Jamaicans to "Wake up to the realisation that climate change is already a fact of life." Some of the hottest days on record had been recorded in July with even higher temperatures predicted for August.

With storage running low and an expectation that conditions would exceed the drought of 2014, the National Water Commission (NWC) began its annual restrictions and rolling lock-offs. In 2014, thought to be Jamaica's worse drought in more than 30 years, rainfall averaged 2 to 12 percent in the most affected areas.

Meteorologist Evan Thompson told reporters at the Gleaner's Editors Forum on July 1, "We are talking about climate change, sometimes thinking about it as something that is still coming, whereas it is something that is already here."

As the NWC scrambled to reactivate out-of-use wells to ease the shortages, many called for the dredging of dams and reservoirs to increase storage capacities. Environment, Water and Climate Change Minister Robert Pickersgill announced a 'prohibition notice' with a penalty of up to 30 days in jail for "anyone caught using the precious liquid for anything other than household and sanitary use." For the first time Jamaica had attached enforcement penalties to water restrictions.

Kingston, one of the areas most affected by lock offs, sits on an abundance of tainted water in underground aquifers. But the capital city's



## Chimene Montgomery revolutionizing black tourism

Brooklyn is its own planet in New York City, filled with a rich history celebrated by the locals and transplants within the borough's neighborhoods — but what about the visiting tourists?

"Who really owns this heritage and culture? If we don't get a hold on trying to bring visitation and creating value into our own communities and neighborhoods, we're going to miss out," she explained.

Over flowing with passion and an unwavering determination, Montgomery is prepared to face the obstacles head on. The biggest challenge is securing the right funding to provide instruction for tour guides, secure luxury busses for trans-

port, and partner with busi-

In her efforts to secure funding, Montgomery has reached out to various local politicians and council members whose districts she is directly focusing on bring tourists - including Bedstuy, Crown Heights and Flatbush.

"I just did a tour a few weeks ago in Robert Carnegie's neighborhood. I went to him, Laurie Cumbo and Eric Adams and told them I need a bus,' she explained. "Nobody could

help or come through because there's so much politics. We can't get together and have a collective effort to promote black Brooklyn."

Focusing on Bedstuy, Crown Heights and Flatbush as her destinations, Montgomery aims to provide luxury tours equipped with experiences that go beyond the surface.

Aligning her tour schedule with community calendars, Montgomery plans to schedule each tour with a possible event, for instance, a concert or gallery that speaks to the ethos of the community.

"It's going to change all the time. It's going to include sounds of central Brooklyn from bebop to hip-hop, follow the different migration patterns from Harlem to Brooklyn, include food like visiting Ali's Roti Shop, and even visiting the mas camps," she said.

Montgomery plans to wrap 2015 with a tour of Crown Heights in December, and with the appropriate funding host eight tours per month at minimum starting in 2016.

"I'm looking to definitely increase tourist numbers by 30 percent," she said.

While she hasn't had the most luck with acquiring funding from local leaders, Montgomery is currently working with Microsoft and Google to create an app that will provide historical facts of things that occurred on a particular day in Brooklyn.

large untapped water source represents only a portion of the vast reserves that experts say remain under-exploited.

According to the Water Resources Authority (WRA), the island's water management and regulatory body, Jamaica uses only 25 percent of its available groundwater resources and 11 percent of its accessible surface water.

Head of the WRA Basil Fernandez told IPS that it would take "proper water planning to deal with non-revenue water and improve transmission and distribution efficiency," to solve the problem.

"There is need for a roadmap from the NWC and / or the ministry on water supply planning that will set out clearly the areas of deficit, areas of surplus and how and when we will move from surplus to deficit areas," he said.

Across the country households cleared their inventories of water tanks, manufacturers increased production and hoteliers tapped into their storage tanks. Fires and the unrelenting sun destroyed the rain-fed farms with prized Blue Mountain Coffee crops, vegetable crops and Christmas trees that are grown in the buffer zone of the Blue Mountain National Park.

Lower down the slopes, fires also destroyed mature trees and vegetation in the Hope River and Yallahs Watershed areas, which supply 40 percent of NWC's 600,000 customers in the Kingston Metropolitan region. Much of the area had been replanted between 2011 and 2013 as part of Jamaica's Climate Change Adaptation and Disaster Risk Reduction.

Under the project, the Forestry Department replanted more than 300,000 hectares of forests in degraded upper watershed areas to reduce runoff, erosion and silting of the waterways.

As water restrictions widened, farmers on the plains fared no better. The usually six-month long sugar cane harvest was over in less than a month after fires and drought decimated the crop. The Rural Agricultural Development Authority (RADA) reported that the drought was most severe in Manchester and St. Elizabeth the 'bread basket' areas that accounted for about 40 percent of domestic agricultural production. In other areas crops wilted in the fields.

Scientists are predicting that these episodes are expected to worsen as climate change increases the intensity of droughts across the Caribbean. Thompson agreed, noting that the unseasonably dry periods are happening in the midst of the Atlantic Hurricane season that runs from June 1 to Nov. 30.

Unless there is rainfall and constant

inflows of water, the volume of water will not significantly increase, Fernandez, told IPS, effectively dismissing calls for more dams and the de-silting the Mona Reservoir and Hermitage Dam.

"There must be better coordination of climate change efforts and projects; better communication to get the public to buy into the these efforts as well as the inclusion of climate change scenarios and impacts in all policies and projects and maintenance and adaptation of systems rather than building new systems," he said.

As part of Jamaica's Vision 2030, to make the country more resilient to the impacts of climate change, government has begun work to protect and better manage the distribution of water. At risk are the nation's health, the tourism and agricultural industries and Jamaica's food security.

Vision 2030 is built into Jamaica's second national communication to the United Nations Conference on Climate Change (UNCCC).

In the last year, 25 water and sewage projects were completed to upgrade then old, leaky infrastructure which when coupled with theft, costs the NWC about 53 percent or 108 million liters of its daily production in the Kingston Metropolitan Area alone.

A 3.9 million dollar Watershed Management project funded by the Inter-American Development Bank through the Global Environment Facility (GEF) is expected to, among other things, improve water resource management in the Yallahs and Hope River watersheds. The five year programme is to carry out work on 44,486 hectares of land including sections of the region's newest World Heritage Site, the Blue and John Crow Mountains National Park.

An Artificial Aquifer Recharge facility to secure the sustainable abstraction of water from the aquifer by treating and returning excess water into natural underground storage is ongoing.

"This is a pioneering project, as it has never before been carried out in Jamaica or the Caribbean," Pickersgill said at the July 2014 launch.

In addition, government is also looking at plans to recover some of Kingston's water that has been polluted by faecal bacteria from soak-away pits, latrines and saline intrusion.

The key to making the country resilient Fernandez said is "the preparation of communities and agencies to manage and conserve the resources; efficiently moving water from the north to the south of the island and a move to larger more efficient and resilient distribution systems."

As Thompson explained, "So the droughts will be more severe, the rainfall episodes will be more significant, causing flooding. There will still be the need to work out how we manage the water resourced in between those episodes"

"I always see myself as a proud Vincentian," she continued. "God has given me an opportunity to touch so many lives"





The decision came amid escalating border dispute between the two South American neighbors.

#### **Jamaica**

The main opposition Jamaica Labor Party (JLP) is preparing for general elections and is confident of victory.

JLP leader Andrew Holness told supporters recently to be prepared for a

general election "very soon," even as Prime Minister Portia Simpson-Miller has kept the nation guessing as to



when she would announce the date.

Simpon-Miller recently addressed supporters of the ruling People's National Party (PNP) in St. Ann, but she made no mention of an election date even as political observers say she is likely to do so before the end of the year.

The JLP leader said the government is not running the affairs of the country properly.

He said a JLP government would implement several new policies in taking the country forward.

In the last general election held in December 2011, the PNP won 42 seats with the remaining 21 going to the JLP.

#### St. Vincent

Venezuelan President Nicholas Maduro and a nine-member delegation recently paid a visit to St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

Prime Minister Dr. Ralph Gonsalves, the governor general's deputy, Susan

Dougan, and other government officials welcomed the delegation at the E.T. Joshua Airport.



Maduro and his delegation later visited the Hugo Chavez Storage facility at Lowman's Bay, then the Argyle International Airport.

Speaking at a press conference through an interpreter, Maduro outlined his country's plans for St. Vincent and the Grenadines (SVG) and Venezuela.

He said that these investments are for the further development of SVG. He also made the promise of 7,500 tablets for primary school students.

After the two leaders held a bilat-

eral meeting at the Office of the Prime Minister, Dr. Gonsalves said the discussions covered several issues in the hemisphere.

Included in Maduro's delegation were First Combatant Cilis Flores, Vice President and Minister of Finance, Rodolfo Marco Torres and Foreign Affairs Minister Delcy Rodriguez.

#### St. Lucia

The St. Lucia government says it is waiving all import duties on barrels imported into the island as part of the annual Christmas celebrations.

It said the removal of the import

duty under the "Christmas Barrel Trade' from Dec. 1 to Feb. 15 next year will be for personal items, food, clothing



toys, and other household consumables contained in barrels. Electronic items are explicitly excluded.

The Ministry of Finance said the number of barrels for the concessions is limited to two per household and there is an upper limit of EC\$2,500 per barrel on the value of the items qualifying for the concessions.

The ministry warned that the items contained in the barrels must be for personal use only and not for commercial use, adding that the "usual penalties" and fines would apply if the goods are used for commercial purposes.

#### **Trinidad**

The program to assist children in need of urgent medical attention which was the brainchild by former T&T

Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar who is now the Opposition Leader has been sent to the director of Public



Prosecutions (DPP) by the police for action to be taken for alleged fraud in the fund.

Former ministers of her government used to donate l0 percent of their salaries to the fund. The Children's Life Fund, is a charitable fund that was established by the PP government in 2010 by an act of Parliament.

The Fraud Squad was called in to probe 14 cases during the period September 2013 and April 2014 in which thousands of US dollars were allegedly embezzled.

## Dance pioneer donates archives to Columbia University

Arthur Mitchell, the pioneer ballet dancer, artistic director and choreographer who, in the 1950s, became the first African American principal dancer with the New York City Ballet was celebrated at Columbia University Oct. 27 and 28.

The occasion marked Mitchell's donation to Columbia University of his archive — a treasure trove of photographs, posters, clippings, and correspondence with the likes of Igor Stravinsky, Josephine Baker, Alvin Ailey, Geoffrey Holder, Carmen de Lavallade, David Dinkins, Mikhail Gorbachev and Nelson Mandella. The archive also includes film footage and other material documenting an amazing life, a stellar career, and the impact of a man whose life has helped change America's cultural landscape.

On Tuesday, Oct. 26, the twoday event, entitled "The Arthur Mitchell Project Symposium," opened with a retrospective of the career of this self-described "political activist through dance."

The centerpiece was a conversation between Mr. Mitchell and friends, including icon Carmen de Lavallade, former NYCB ballerinas Barnard College dance professor Allegra Kent, and Kaye Mazzo, a founding member of The George Balanchine Trust. Barnard Professor and Dance Dept. Co-Chair Lynn Garafola moderated as Mitchell recalled how, as a young teen, dancer Mary Hinkson introduced him to the Katherine Dunham School where future mentor and DTH co-founder Karel Shook taught ballet. Mitchell also expressed heartfelt thanks to NYCB's founder and choreographer George Balanchine and co-founder Lincoln Kirstein when recalling his historic admission to NYCB and, years later, Balanchine's generous gift of his own masterpieces and more to Mitchell's fledgling company. Punctuating these and other moments were film clips of Mitchell partnering Hinkson in Balanchine's "Figure in a Carpet" or dancing with de Lavallade in Donald McKayle's classic "Rainbow 'Round My Shoulder."

There was also a clip of Mitchell partnering Allegra Kent in the "Agon" pas de deux that Southern TV stations refused to air because it featured a Black man partnering a white woman.

Sprinkled throughout the two-day event were similar historic facts, personal anecdotes and analytical insights that shed light on Mitchell's illustrious career and his tremendous impact on American arts and culture.

On Tuesday, Oct. 27, three panel discussions also hinted at the key role Arthur Mitchell's archives would play in incorporating African Americans' stories and impact into the history of ballet. One panel tackled the role Mitchell and DTH played in creating opportunities for other artists of color. Moderated by Pulitzer Prize-winning columnist, author and Columbia University Professor Margo Jefferson, that panel included former-DTH principle Karen Brown, one of the few Black women to serve as Artistic Director of an American ballet company (Oakland Bal-



look forward to continuing to build our information-sharing capabilities to protect the people of Jamaica and the United States."

The CHIS initiative is managed by ERO. Through the initiative, ERO provides its partners with criminal conviction information on foreign nationals being removed from the United States, and it receives information about foreign criminal convictions related to those individuals.

ICE said these records help ERO identify and classify individuals within the agency's criminal removal priorities in support of national security.

ICE has similar agreements with Mexico, Honduras, Guatemala, the Dominican Republic and El Salvador.

Through its International Operations, ICE said its Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) has 62 operational attaché offices in 46 countries around the world.

ICE said HSI special agents work closely with foreign law enforcement agencies through a robust network of specialized, vetted units known as Transnational Criminal Investigative Units.

Additionally, ICE said HSI brings personnel from host countries to the United States to train at the Department of Homeland Security Federal Law Enforcement Training Center in Glynco, Georgia. Both HSI and ERO personnel work on issues of mutual interest with host governments.

ERO is responsible for coordinating the removal of criminals, foreign fugitives and others ordered deported, ICE

Since Oct. 1, 2009, ICE said ERO assistant attaches for repatriation have assisted with the removal of more than 1,200 foreign fugitives from the United States who were being sought in their native countries for serious crimes, including kidnapping, rape and murder.

In fiscal year 2014 alone, ICE said ERO removed 315,943 individuals from the United States. More than 85 percent had been convicted of a crime, ICE.

nities of the Americas, including the Caribbean.

"It was an opportunity to actually add new information about an area that is relatively well described archaeologically but not so much so genetically," Schurr said.

Schurr said he has already completed a similar study in Puerto Rico and recently began a larger project in the Dominican Republic.

He said immersion in these communities has been eye opening.

"You don't fully appreciate what's happening on the ground until you're there — not only meeting people and getting to know them and their perspectives, their history, but absorbing details about the environment, the climate, how people make a living, the current state of economic development," he said. "You learn about the early colonial history of these islands, as well as indigenous perspectives on this history."

Research for the Genographic Project has been taking place since 2005. The first phase, funded by the National Geographic Society, IBM and the Waitt Family Foundation, ended in 2012 after completion of significant field research and laboratory analysis around the

The second phase, supported by the University of Pennsylvania, the Institute for Scholarship and Learning at Notre Dame and the National Geographic Society, has allowed for targeted field research and the expanded use of autosomal markers to help elucidate the genetic history of human popula-

Schurr and his collaborators published their recent work about genetic diversity in the Lesser Antilles in the science journal PLOS One.

DTH wardrobe master and designer now currently with the Metropolitan Opera and Radio City Music Hall.

Another panel looked at the importance of Mitchell's creation of an institution that included not only the company but a school and an outreach component. Moderated by Columbia Professor of English and Comparative Literature Brent Hayes Edwards, it included former DTH principal ballerina and current Artistic Director Virginia Johnson, Pulitzer Prize winning Washington Post critic Sarah L. Kaufman, Florida State University Professor, and former DTH dancer, Anjali Austin, and Barnard Professor and Dance co-chair Lynn Garafola,

The third panel discussed the political, cultural and socio-economic turmoil of the Civil Rights era and it's impact on Mitchell's decision to create DTH and debunk all the myths and buggaboos that plagued aspiring black ballet dancers for so long. In addition, this panel grappled with ways to build on advances into this once tabu dance territory by Mitchell and, more recently, Misty Copeland. Kendall Thomas, Nash Professor of Law and Director for the Center of Law & Culture at Columbia's School of Law, moderated a panel that included Zita Allen, Amsterdam News writer and first Black critic for Dance Magazine, Harlem Stage Director Patricia Cruz, Columbia University English Comparative Literature Professor Farah Jasmine Griffin and Brenda Dixon Gottschild, author and Temple University Professor Emeritus.

"I am stunned" said Dr. Jessamy, when she learned that she had been awarded the prestigious 2015 Gold Medal from among the international competitors. The winning honey was gifted to the head beekeeper at Buckingham Palace.

The international beekeepers at the 2015 NHS were from Mauritius, Oman, Cameroon, Morocco, Canada, Uganda, New Zealand, The Netherlands, the United States and Saudi Arabia among other countries.

The first Medal of Ukraine went to Mauritius in 2010, the second was not awarded and the third was won by honey from the Royal Apiaries of Oman. Eden Apiaries is the fourth winner of

the Medal and the first from the Caribbean region.

In 2012 Eden Apiaries was awarded a Silver Award in the same category.

The National Honey show is held in London every October and continues the tradition established back in 1923. It's the oldest most sophisticated and the most rigorous beekeeping contest in the world.



# Haitian documentary portrays Brooklyn life in '80s

A recent release of "The Haitian Polo Documentary" that chronicles gritty urban streets, discrimination, and a language barrier young Haitian faced when they arrived in Brooklyn with their parents back in the 1980s and 1990s, received rave reviews from a community audience.

The Red Carpet screening at the Kent Theater in Brooklyn, attracted a wide cross-section of moviegoers that applauded the compelling narration of events during the one-hour viewing of the flick.

Directed by Caged Cubez, and produced by DJ Scripz, the group of men recounted their journey through the violent streets and drug infested neighborhoods they had to endure while trying to fit into a society that was new to an influx of Haitian immigrants.

Showcasing images of schools they attended, and multilevel dwellings they called home back then, the

street-wise youths who were not accepting of the way they lived and dressed. This led to volatile situations and in many instances weapon violence.

The documentary traces a rebirth of the Haitians who created their sense of style to fit-in. They embraced Polo designs, moving away from the conservative Haitian garments of which they were accustomed, to standout in the neighbor-

"When you dress in slacks, a tucked-in button-down shirt, white tube socks, and black shoes, it wasn't hard to notice vou were a Haitian, because the life of a young Haitian consisted of school, home and church," said DJ Scripz.

During this era, even though many other popular brands were appealing, the Ralph Lauren Polo collection put the young men a class of their own. They used their minimum wage earnings to purchase the highend clothing they said carried

friends recalled fighting with respect and admiration in the community.

One-of-a kind Polo by Ralph Lauren sweaters and jackets created a barrier from bullying on the streets of Crown Heights, Flatbush, and other parts of Brooklyn that became home to more than 600,000 Haitians in the '80s.

The documentary captures the generation that was determined to make their way in the community with inspired Ralph Lauren garments, one of the most recognized names in American fashion.

"Ralph Lauren managed to create an enduring empire, from the 'pony' to the 'crest' to the 'teddy bear' design, that the immigrants called his path to success and the American way," argues cast members.

Stating that Haiti is 'the pearl of the Caribbean' and the world's first Black Republic, and being Haitian carry a deep sense of national pride, it was their mission to shine, in Polo







Every year on Nov. 22, the tragic assassination of John F. Kennedy — the youngest American president ever elected — recalls the somber nostalgia of the 1963 event in Dallas, Texas that left the nation numb from shock.

Fifty-two years later, the memory of the 53rd leader of the USA resonates with reflections of his glamorous wife Jackie Bouvier, young and proud son, John and daughter Caroline. That in many of his speeches he promised a better America is already being replayed with frequency on progressive radio stations with broadcasters who list him among the most conscientious leaders of the country.

The popular, 43-year-old, Irish-Catholic was first of his religion to occupy the White House. He vowed to keep peace on earth and also planned to invest in a space program that would pioneer an era of discovery.

JFK was hardly past his first thousand days in office, when an assassin's bullets snatched his life as his motorcade wound through the streets of the southern city.

Unfortunately, he is also remembered as the youngest president to die.



LOS ANGELES (AP) \_ Spike Lee told an audience of entertainment luminaries that it's easier for a black person to become president of the United States than head of a Hollywood studio or network.

Lee made the remarks Saturday as he accepted an Oscar statuette at the film academy's seventh annual Governors Awards dinner in Hollywood, where Gena Rowlands and Debbie Reynolds were also honorees.

"We need to have some serious

discussions about diversity and get year plan to improve diversity in its some flavor up in this," Lee said. "This industry is so behind sports it's ridiculous."

The filmmaker praised Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences president Cheryl Boone Isaacs for "trying to do something that needs to be done." # Strahan's inspiration to boost your confidence

Every day, you make countless little choices.

Get outta bed or go back to sleep? What's for breakfast? Blue tie or black shirt? Which project first, what's for lunch, dinner, after dinner, what to watch, read, discuss? All day long, you choose one thing over another; in fact, Michael Strahan says that "the average American will [make] thirty-five thousand decisions" before bedtime. In his book "Wake Up Happy" (with Veronica Chambers), he explains how one of them can be a life-changer.

If you've ever seen Michael Strahan on-screen, you know how easy he makes his job look.

He seems comfortable with stars and strangers alike, although he calls himself "a shy guy." He says he gets nervous, but he knows how to handle himself because that's the way he was raised.

Because Strahan's father was in the military, the family lived overseas when Strahan was still very young. "Mannheim, Germany," he says, "was an awesome place to grow up" because of its small-town feel and because children were truly raised by a village of stay-at-home mothers. Strahan's father was busy, but Strahan remembers the frequent one-on-one time he spent with his dad, and the advice that poured forth on those events.

"In a perfect world," Strahan says, "I'd have 92 [motivational] rules to match my jersey number. But in real life, I've found that you need only 18 to get and stay motivated."

Rule Number One, he says is to "Be open to everything around you." What you need, and the help to get it, can "come from the most unexpected places..." Pay attention, don't make assumptions, and never throw away a chance to see what comes.

Remember that the journey is joyful, too, so take pleasure in it. If you want something, let your determination power vour actions and keep in mind that when you've given your all, there's still more to give. Know when to bow out gracefully but don't quit a tough road; instead, know when to "hit pause." Take the word "if" from your vocabulary. Listen to music that motivates you. Remember that "bad experiences... often teach you the most." Keep your sense of humor. "Be excellent."

So you're in need of some motivation, but you don't want something that sounds like a million bees in a hive. Instead, you'd like something fresh, and 'Wake Up Happy" is what you

After all, she's been living in the lap of luxury in a mansion in suburban New Jersey, where the couple has been raising their young daughter, Rindy (Kk Heim).

But having a devoted spouse who's a good provider and a doting dad just isn't enough, given how Carol has been hid-

he wrote the book, said, "I decided to write it because I wanted to look at the futility of regret."

In a statement, Ellis describes a conversation he had with a friend who was in his late sixties recovering from a major surgery. He felt as though he was not going to pull through and when asked what regret he felt he immediately responded, "He wished, he said, he could have gone back over his life as a diplomat, an aristocrat, and a lawyer and undo every moment he had acted superior or aloof."

This conversation prompted Ellis to craft a story where characters face regret and are offered the second opportunity to instead create a happier memory

"The Angels' Share" follows the story of a father and son set in Jamaica. Revolving around the father-and-son characters, "The Angels' Share" revolves around themes of forgiveness, understanding and closure.

Though Ellis isn't directly basing the characters on his own experiences, he does admit that through writing this book he explored his own regrets and memories of those intimate moments he wished he could have had with his father.

"One of the things that I have always understood in my life and put in the story is when the father and son are having dinner and the father says 'life is nothing but memories.' Which is what it really is and I think that's something that's very close to my personal beliefs," he explained.

This is Ellis' sixth novel and the author, despite his busy work schedule, is already working on the third draft of his seventh work. Compared with "The Angels' Share," Ellis says the next novel will be more literary in that it requires much more research.

"I'm just finishing the final draft on a new novel. This is about the gang violence in Jamaica and it is about what happens in the communities that are covered by these guns," he said.

# Vincy Heat loses qualifying match

The St. Vincent and the Grenadines national football (soccer) team had some glimmer of hope of beating the mighty United States Friday night in the qualifying stage of their World Cup campaign, but

that hope quickly evaporated with a sound thrashing, 6-1, before over 43,000 fans at Busch Stadium in St. Louis, Mo.

Vincentian fans – who had trekked via bus, car and plane from the length and breadth of the United

States, but primarily from New York – had their hopes up early when midfielder Oalex Anderson, 20, who plays for Seattle Sounders 2 in the United States' third division, stunned the massive crowd in just the fifth

minute to give the team, renowned as Vincy Heat, an early lead.

The screams of frenetic Vincentian fans inevitably reverberated across the stadium, but it was short-lived, as the U.S. completely dominated thereafter.

Goals from Bobby Wood, Fabian Johnson and Jozy Altidore gave the U.S. a 3-1 advantage by the halftime interval.

Three more goals on the resumption – from Geoff Cameron, Gyasi Zardes and Altidore – made the U.S. clearly invincible by the final whistle.

Anderson, capitalizing on a poor clearance from Cameron, dribbled around DeAndre Yedlin and banged the ball to left of US goalkeeper Brad Guzan – to the utter consternation of the sell-out U.S. fans but to the delight of the flag-waving, screaming Vincy fans.

But the U.S. quickly composed itself, as Wood, appearing for the eighth time in 2015, ensured the equalizer in the 11th minute by taking advantage of Yedlin's cross, nodding past Vincy Heat's diminutive goal keeper Winslow McDowall.

The U.S. increased the lead in the 29th minute, to the cacophonous sounds of their fans, when Johnson sent a scorcher

low to McDowall's left off a free kick deflection 10 yards outside a the penalty box

Two minutes later, Altimore headed past McDowall, off a right corner kick, to give the U.S. its third goal, sending the host to a comfortable 3-1 advantage by half-time.

With the U.S. continuing its occupation of Vincy Heat's half of the field, Cameron headed to McDowall's right in the 51st minute from Wood's assist, after Johnson's corner, to increase the lead by the U.S.

The match was now beyond Vincy Heat's grasp, when Zardes, in the 58th minute, slipped through McDowall's legs, putting the U.S. up, 5-1.

Sixteen minutes later, Altidore, scoring his 12th World Cup qualifying goal, sank the final nail in Vincy Heat's coffin, with a high shot to McDowall's right.

Despite their gallant effort, Vincy Heat was totally overwhelmed by the dexterity and fitness of the Americans, and the weather and magnitude of the U.S.' fansupport.

"I feel that we tried our best," striker Tevon Slater, 21, told Caribbean Life in a post-match interview. "The U.S. is more experienced than us. We tried hard still.

"I think the coldness had a lot to do with it," he added, stating that Vincy Heat will do much better in the return leg in September next year, with better favorable weather conditions.

Still, Assistant Coach Ezra Hendrickson, former Major League Soccer (MLS) defender and current Seattle Sounders FC 2 head coach, said he was "very proud of the boys."

"We started very well," he said, adding, however, that "the lack of concentration cost us three soft goals. They (U.S.) didn't have to work very hard for their goals.

"The weather will always have a part to play," Hendrickson continued. "We never expected this margin [of defeat], because we came here to win the game. But, all said and done, I'm proud of the boys."

Hendrickson disclosed that three of his team's better players also missed the match – Emral George, and Myron Samuel and Cornelius Stewart through injury.

"I believe if we had a full squad, it would have been better," he said.

Former national football captain and Head Coach of Team SVG in the Brooklyn-based Caribbean Soccer Cup, Stanley "Luxie" Morris, told Caribbean Life that weather conditions also played a key role in the team's defeat.

He, however, said there were "three fundamental errors" that contributed to the heavy loss.

"Nobody backed the back post," said the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Sports Ambassador. "Four of the goals were set pieces. The tallest players should be at the back post.

"We missed three players – Stewart, Samuel and George," Morris added. "That game was a ready-made game for Myron Samuel."

game, cited concerns about the legality of Narine's deliveries.

The Trinidadian player will need to undergo testing on his action within 14 days but will be permitted to continue bowling until the results of his testing are known.


This is the first time Narine has been reported in an international game, though he has undergone scrutiny of his action during the Indian Premier Leagues (IPL) and the Champions League Twenty20. He was reported twice in two matches during the 2014 edition of the CLT20 forcing him to miss Kolkata Knight Riders' final game against Chennai Super Kings.

Though he was free to bowl in international cricket, West Indies withdrew Narine from their tour of India to allow him "the opportunity to have his action assessed and plan his return to cricket."

West Indies left him out of all their subsequent international assignments until they picked him for the 2015 World Cup. Though he remodeled his action in the interim Narine, pulled out of the tournament, saying his return would be "a little too much too soon."

Narine endured further problems with his action during the 2015 IPL — he was first cleared to bowl in the tournament, but was reported and sent for a re-test, and was banned from bowling his off-breaks, and then cleared again with a "final warning."

The Sri Lanka tour was Narine's first international tournament since August 2014. He picked up four wickets at an average of 18.00 in the three ODIs, while conceding 3.34 runs per over.

# **Erasmus back** in business

This win was vintage Erasmus Hall.

The sixth-seeded Dutchmen put the struggles that plagued the end of their regular season behind them and recaptured a bit of their former glory when they routed No. 12 Dewitt Clinton 43-26 in the first round of the Public School Athletic League City conference playoffs at Sid Luckman Field in Midwood on Nov. 13. The team has turned over a new leaf after a weak ending to its regular season, its quarterback said.

"Everybody's back on board," Erasmus quarterback Aaron Grant said. "We're finally at full effect, offense and defense."

A series of injuries caused the Erasmus's offense to sputter towards the end of the regular season, and the team lost two of its last three games.

It scored just 12 points combined in its previous two home games against a pair of unbeaten squads — only beating Clin-

The Dutchmen (8–3) offense clicked right away with a 10-play, 68-yard drive that Jahquel Webb capped with a 13-yard touchdown run, putting his team up 8-6.

Two possessions later, the game had taken a decided turn for Erasums — a pair of sacks and a blocked punt by Daevon
